One of the happy memories I have of my time in West Yorkshire is going to hear the Huddersfield Choral Society sing the 'Messiah' in Huddersfield Town Hall. It was unexpected as a church member couldn't attend at the last minute and I had her ticket. I went with her cousin who I'd never met before, so we arranged a rendezvous in a pub near the Town Hall 'wearing something bright' so we would spot each other. In the event we had a wonderful evening, and hearing Handel's Messiah in that fabulous building was a great experience.

Handel was 60 when he composed 'Messiah'. Four years earlier he had suffered a stroke which had paralysed his right side, making it impossible for him to walk or write. But he managed to recuperate and returned to composing and playing the organ. He was born in Germany and moved to London in 1710. Within just two weeks, Handel had composed Rinaldo. This opera was Handel's breakthrough. It gained him the widespread recognition that he would maintain throughout the rest of his musical career.

As times and musical tastes changed, Handel moved from writing opera to composing oratorios. He wrote the music and Charles Jennens provided the words. Jennens was also a wealthy man and patron of the arts. By 1741, after their collaboration on 'Saul', a warm friendship had developed between the two, and Handel was a frequent visitor to the Jennens family estate at Gopsall. Handel was a prolific writer. In 1735, during Lent alone, he produced more than 14 concerts made up primarily of oratorios. In 1741 Dublin's Lord Lieutenant commissioned Handel to write a new oratorio based on a biblical libretto assembled by Charles Jennens. Handel's most famous oratorio, Messiah, made its debut at the New Music Hall in Dublin in April 1742.

Jennens was a devout Anglican and believer in scriptural authority, and the text of Messiah consists of a series of Biblical quotations. The genius of the work is the way those scripture quotes come together to tell the story of Jesus from the Old Testament prophecies of a forthcoming Messiah through his birth, life, death and resurrection. There is no evidence that Handel played any active role in the selection or preparation of the text; it seems that he saw no need to make any significant amendment to Jennens's work.

The music was written with tremendous speed. Handel worked almost non-stop for twenty four days, taking little rest and even less food. When 'The Messiah' lay finished on his desk, he collapsed on his bed and slept for seventeen hours. This tremendous masterpiece is one of the greatest ever composed. It remains as

popular as ever and is a traditional part of both Christmas and Easter. In Part I, the Messiah's coming and the virgin birth are predicted by the Old Testament prophets. The annunciation to the shepherds of the birth of Christ is represented in the words of Luke's gospel.

There will be a performance of Part 1 of Messiah with the Halleluiah Chorus at St Mary's on Advent Sunday, 1st December at 6pm. Further details are available on the website and advance tickets can be ordered from the box office on 01525 222283. I hope you will be able to join us to enjoy this wonderful work.

British Legion Remembrance Service Sunday 10th November 2019

CLOSURE OF B440 FROM NORTHALL TO COCK'S CLOSE (PEBBLEMOOR) JUNCTION and HIGH STREET, EDLESBOROUGH, FROM PEBBLEMOOR TO JUNCTION WITH MAIN ROAD

This year's annual Service of Remembrance will take place at Edlesborough War Memorial at the top of the hill by Edlesborough church on the Main Road on Sunday 10th November starting at approximately 10.45am. Please come and join us in our Act of Remembrance. The service will last for approximately 30 minutes.

In the past, War Memorials were built close to the roadside so that all who passed by would be reminded of the sacrifices made by the local people whose names appear on them. Unfortunately this does not sit well with the levels of traffic which we experience on our roads today and so to enable the people taking part in the service to stand safely around the War Memorial, and to hear clearly, the Main Road (B440) will be closed for the service from approximately 10.30am until 11.30am with a diversion in place from the Main Road junction at Cock's Close towards Pebblemoor, along Pebblemoor and Edlesborough High Street, along Eaton Bray High Street, and up Northall Road to join the Main Road in Northall. Edlesborough High Street will also be closed from the junction with Pebblemoor by the Memorial Hall to the junction with the Main Road. There will be barriers in place closing the road at the junctions and diversion signs in place.

Residents living on Edlesborough High Street above the Memorial Hall and along the closed part of the Main Road should be aware that it will **NOT be possible to access the Main Road by car** at the junction by the church during this time as there will be people standing in the road, and so if it is really necessary to use your car at this time please **drive away from the junction** towards the nearest point on the diversion route and be aware that you will have to pass through the barrier closing the road and will need to stop to be allowed through. There will be at least two official marshals manning the barriers at each of the closure points. These people are volunteers who have given up their time to help protect those who are taking part in the service at the church. Please treat them with respect and courtesy if you need to pass through a barrier.

Notices advising residents living locally about the road closure will be placed near the closure points for three weeks prior to the closure to make sure that everyone knows about it and can plan to avoid using their car during the hour of the closure.

We look forward to your company on Remembrance Sunday.





- * near the brow of a hill or hump bridge
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where you would force other traffic to enter a tram lane
- * where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users
- * in front of an entrance to a property

* on a bend

Tarte fine aux pommes (traditional French apple tart)

Just in case you've been thinking, throughout the course of all these recipes in this magazine from the Weekend Kitchen, that all I do is sit and eat what is cooked for me, I've made this recipe myself this month**! As with so many of the recipes from my show, it's simplicity personified. Puff pastry, a lovely apple puree, topped with sliced apples and a sweet glaze. Perfection, in a traditional sense. The recipe was originally made on my show by a lovely, erudite and passionate Frenchman called Jean-Claude Blanc. A talented chef, he has now made the French Horn in Steppinglev his home, serving the kind of French brasserie dishes which would take you back to when life was a lot simpler...

**in fairness, much of the show is indeed spent with me eating lovely food!

Pre-heat the oven to 200C/Gas Mark 5

A pack of puff pastry

4 Granny smith apples (or similarly tart apple)

2 cooking apples

Unsalted butter

4 tbsp apricot jam

3 tbsp caster sugar

Begin by peeling and coring the apples.

Chop up the cooking apples and gently cook them with a little butter in a saucepan until they go very soft.

Cut the Granny Smiths in half and slice them very finely into equal sized segments. Roll out the pastry. You can either do one large tart or several small round ones, cut out using a bowl as a template.

Prick the base and spread a thin layer of the apple puree.

Arrange the apples on top in a pretty circle the music you want for (for small round tarts), or in long lines if your early afternoon.



you're making a large version.

Dot a few bits of butter, sprinkle some sugar and place in the oven. Cook for around 15-20 minutes. Watch the tarts carefully and remove them as soon as you feel the base has crisped up and the apples have taken on some colour.

Remove from the oven and cool.

Meanwhile place the apricot jam in a saucepan, adding four tablespoons of water. Mix well.

Bring to the boil and sieve the liquid jam to remove any lumpy bits.

Put the jam back on the heat and reduce gently until it coats the back of a spoon.

Using a pastry brush, "paint" the glaze onto the pastries. This will create a lush professional finish.

Serve with dollops of vanilla ice cream, or double cream.



LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

BELTON HOUSE

OK, Belton House is in Lincolnshire but there is a strong connection with Ashridge as Belton was the main residence of the Brownlow family who sold Ashridge to cope with death duties in the 1920s.


In the church at Belton there is a magnificent window with many coats of arms pertaining to the family, whose given name was Cust, Brownlow being the moniker taken for the earldom.

If you look at the picture shown you can quickly see that John Cust who died in 1853 and whose shield this is, was an earl as the earl's coronet with its silver balls above strawberry leaves is correctly painted on the glass above the shield.

You can also see that in the top left corner of the coat of arms there is a red hand. This is the mark allowed if you are a baronet and both honours can be held at the same time.

What is of particular interest in this lovely piece of art work though is that the left hand or dexter side has the quartered coats of Cust and Brownlow but the right hand or sinister side appears to have a quartered coat of lions and martlets (a sort of swallow) in the top part above an un-quartered coat of a cross and shells below. This lower coat has a cross patonce between four escallops, each charged with another cross patonce.

This unusual arrangement is because the two coats on the right hand side are for two wives!



The upper is for Sophia Hume and the lower is for Caroline Fludyer, both of whom died in the early 1800s. John Cust outlived them both and went on to marry again, so clearly he was not put off by his sad misfortune.

Of further interest on the lower right design is the small crescent on the top arm of the cross, which signifies that her father was the second son in his family. These small shapes are called cadency marks and may be a label, crescent, molet (star), martlet etc. and are a way of distinguishing between sons who otherwise would have the same arms.

November is the Month for REMEMBERING

Remember, Remember the 5th of November! Celebrating Guy Fawkes foiled plot on Parliament in 1605 is a yearly high point. He, along with his fellow conspirators was sentenced to be hung drawn and quartered for High Treason. However, immediately before his execution Guy Fawkes fell from the scaffold and broke his neck, thus avoiding being hung although he was still quartered! What an end!



On 11th November we will rightly be remembering those who gave their lives for their country in recent wars, helping to maintain our freedoms. You will probably hear the words 'Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends'. It was Jesus who said this anticipating his own sacrifice for us - John 15 verse 13.

Our special service on Remembrance Sunday 10th November is entitled 'God With Us'. He is the unseen member of the family, supporting us whatever the sacrifice needed.

In a recent visit to the Holy Land, we have been remembering the life of Jesus and the area that he lived, taught and died at only age 33. Several times in the gospels it refers to hills and mountains and also the desert. Seeing the actual land that Jesus was talking about has made a particular impression. High places in the Bible are related to Worship. A pivotal moment was when Jesus took 3 of his disciples – it says Jesus led them up to a high mountain – and he became transfigured. There was a great shining, Moses and Elijah appeared and God spoke 'This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!'

Just before Jesus was arrested he went to pray on the Mount of Olives – Luke 22 verse 39 – in Matthew 26 it refers to Gethsemane when Jesus took his disciples and withdrew a little to pray 'if it is possible, let this cup of suffering be taken away from me'. The disciples had fallen asleep. However they

were soon wide awake when Judas arrived with a crowd – John calls them a 'detachment of soldiers and some officials from the chief priests and Pharisees'.

Last year was the centenary of the end of the First World War, then this year there has been the 75th anniversary of D-Day, the 80th year since the start of WWII, and so the list goes on.

Can we remember too much? At the anniversary of the Somme ceremonies, Charles Dance read Siegfried Sassoon's poem, "Aftermath", with its frequently-repeated line "Do you remember ..."

The final stanza says,

"Have you forgotten yet?

Look up, and swear by the green of the spring that you'll never forget."

At this time of national uncertainty, (this letter was written in early October) we are told of fears and ancient prejudices rising. However, in our playgrounds, cafes and community spaces, people of all races, faiths and nationalities freely and happily mix together, learning from each other, sharing culture and enjoying each other's way of life. I recently amazed a small girl from a Muslim family, as I wished her "Salaam aleikum!" Christians follow a God

Without love like that, love that Christ demonstrated by his death on the cross for those who did not love him and did not care, there would be much less chance for peace.

And I was filled with such delight

As prisoned birds must find in freedom,

Winging wildly across the white

Orchards and dark-green fields; on - on - and out of sight.

Everyone's voice was suddenly lifted;

And beauty came like the setting sun:

My heart was shaken with tears; and horror

Drifted away ... O, but Everyone

Was a bird; and the song was wordless; the singing will never be done.

Salaam aleikum - Peace be with you.

Better Backs for Golfers

Weather Conditions for September 2019


Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West

September started off sunny with reasonable temperatures for the time of year. Early on the 4th, we had a few showers totalling 4.2mm of rain. On the 7th, the temperature dropped to 2.6°c which was the lowest recorded this month. From the 11th, we had sunny warm days, reaching 24.9°c on the 15th, while it was often chilly at night. This dry weather lasted right up until the 21st. Then, all change, as we had eight days of rain. On the 24th, we had 38.81mm, which is more than 11/2 inches, and flooded roads in and around Dagnall. When I read the data at 17.00, I discovered it was raining 213.4mm per hour (more than 4½ inches)! So, once again, September was a month of two halves.

Apologies to all of you who follow Dagnall Weather Station online. Due to a software problem, we were off-line for more than a week. We lost all the database records but, fortunately, we were able to rebuild the system and recover 99% of the data.
