Each year St Mary's church supports the Bishop of St Albans' Harvest Appeal. It is a reflection of our thanks for all that we have received through God's bounty. The Bishop's Appeal for 2020 is set in South Asia, in the beautiful, mountainous, landlocked country of Nepal. It's only five years since Nepal suffered two major earthquakes, devastating lives, infrastructures and livelihoods. Like many people there, Manish — a husband, father and pastor — struggled to recover from the devastation caused, especially as the village's water supply was severely damaged. Families were forced to make four trips a day to neighbouring villages to collect enough water to drink and wash, leaving little time or energy for their normal farming work. As result, this farming community was in dire need of extra income to feed and provide for families. Beekeeping was the solution.

With the benefits of training offered through the local church, Manish and his family's lives have been transformed through beekeeping. The approach of this training programme, Church and Community Mobilisation (CCM), is to assess what resources are readily available to a community (for example, land, livestock) and use these to implement a plan out of poverty. In this case the answer was bees. Before the earthquakes, Manish had an interest in beekeeping and owned a beehive. With the support of CCM training, Manish saw the potential to generate new income for his family, and quickly expanded from owning one to six beehives. He learnt how to look after the bees properly, and began to sell organic honey, candle wax and other bee-related products. Encouraged and motivated, Manish is growing his beekeeping activity and now runs a successful business. He keenly passes on what he has learnt and encourages others in his community to get involved and work together. Manish's faith in God and entrepreneurial attitude have inspired many other people to build a sustainable livelihood for their own future, too.

This year around 900 people can be helped to rebuild their lives through beekeeping businesses. Bees are an important part of our natural world, particularly now in Nepal, where communities are still recovering from the tragic earthquakes, and with concerns of climate change, deforestation and the need for pollinators, bees are a very valuable commodity. Bishop Alan writes: 'The UN tells us that, of the one hundred crop species that provide 90% of the world's food, more than seventy are pollinated by bees. Promoting beekeeping is, therefore, not just good for the people of Nepal directly affected by this

project, but also good for the wellbeing of their country and its ecology, and that of neighbouring countries. St John of Chrysostom said: 'The bee is more honoured than other animals, not because she labours, but because she labours for others.' Please join me, this Harvest, in honouring not just the people of Nepal, but also the humble and essential bee who sets an example to us all in these times.'

Our Zoom services continue with friends from across the Circuit. On the first Sunday in August Elisabeth Bibbings led us with a Reflection based on the Feeding of the 5,000, a quietly practical miracle. The lockdown has taught us the value of such kindly acts. We must continue giving whenever we can and trust in our generous God who regularly gives more than we expect. Steve Jones led our second August



service, drawing on the moment when Jesus approached the disciples' boat, walking on the water. This dramatic miracle reminds us who Jesus is but also urges us to abandon the safety of the boat and, with faith, take risks. On the 3rd August Sunday we welcomed a visitor to our screens; Andrea Als-McClean spoke movingly of the difficult act of forgiveness. As Joseph did when coming together with his brothers, we too must draw on God's grace to forgive those who have hurt us. The Rev Nigel Bibbings, our Minister, led our service the following week, basing his Reflection on the image of the 'living waters' which Jesus Christ offers to all and which transforms our lives. Our final service of the month was in the capable hands of Jaque Stamp. Her thoughtful Reflection was about 'discipleship'. For some people this is a sort of insurance policy but if one reads the 'small print', ie the detail in the Bible, it is clear that discipleship comes at a cost. We need to be constantly alert to challenge those things which may benefit us but which undermine the quality of other peoples' lives. In other words, discipleship is a 'contract of love'.



Get Involved in Shaping Your Local Community

Buckinghamshire's 16 new Community Boards officially launch this week as the first public-facing meetings with local communities take place.

The community boards have been created to bring the new council and communities together, giving people the opportunity to speak up and get actively involved in improving their local area. They now have a key role in helping local areas to recover from the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic.

The aim of the boards is to:

- Influence how decisions are made and how services are delivered
- Represent the voice of local people
- Capture thoughts, ideas and suggestions
- Bring together key community partners and residents
- Identify local needs and work to produce creative solutions

Back in July, local councillors, town and parish councils and some community groups in each of the board areas held their introduction meetings to begin looking at how to develop these partnerships, consider the local data and information about their local areas and start the conversation about their key areas of focus.

Behind the scenes, dedicated coordinators for each board are working hard in their local communities, making connections and encouraging residents, groups and organisations to contribute to conversations about their local area, including understanding the impact that Covid-19 has had.

There are many ways local people, groups and organisations can get involved in their board, taking part in exploring their area's issues, through action groups and projects, or just by sharing views.

Community boards are backed by £3.9m to fund local projects and initiatives within their communities. From September, applications can be made by community groups and organisations to their local board for financial support for local projects. Each board decides its own funding priorities. The type of projects which could be eligible for funding include:

- Providing support for older people
- Creating opportunities for children and young people
- Improving community facilities
- Tackling crime
- Addressing environmental issues

Gareth Williams, Cabinet Member for Communities and Public Health said: "We are very excited to get our Community Boards off the ground. They form a vital part of the new council and our commitment to listening to and working with local communities. "These forums are a place for everyone interested in helping to improve and enhance their local area to get involved. Our vision is that they will very much be community-led partnerships that are action focused to make a real difference. Communities really

came together to help each other during the Covid lockdown – we hope that these forums will build on this sense of community, and take the opportunity to use funding to tackle local issues as a key part of our Covid-19 recovery."

Community boards will each meet formally five times a year with smaller action-groups will be created, focusing on specific issues and themes.

Cllr Williams continued: "We want these community boards to be vibrant and creative bodies. As a council we are committed to making a difference locally. We want to develop thriving and empowered local communities. Working together we can address the issues that matter most to local people."



Ticks

Ticks on dogs and cats

Ticks are spider-like small parasites that suck blood from other animals. They have eight legs with an egg shaped body, which becomes larger and darker when filled with blood. Unlike fleas, they don't fly or jump, instead they climb or

drop on your pets coat when they brush past what they're sitting on. Ticks are common in woodland and grassland and, although active throughout the year, you'll most likely see them between Spring and Autumn. Cats are less likely to get ticks than dogs, but it can still happen.

How can I tell if my dog has ticks?

After taking your dog for a walk, it's a good idea to check them for ticks. You can do this by moving your hands over their body to check for any unusual small bumps, particularly around their ears, head, neck, groin, armpits and feet. Ticks vary in size, but you should be able to see their oval shaped body, which will get bigger as it fills with blood. Ticks may go inside a dogs' ear, so if your dog is shaking their head a lot, it's worth having a careful look inside with a torch.

How to remove a tick

Tick bites can carry diseases so it's important to remove them straight away. When removing a tick, make sure not to squeeze the tick's body or leave the head in. If you squeeze its body this can push blood back into your pet, which will increase the chance of them getting a disease. The same goes for leaving the ticks head in.

Tick removal tool

To avoid squeezing the body or leaving the head in, you'll need to twist the tick off. This can be done using a tick removal tool, which can be picked up at pet shops or the vets. Your vet will be able to show you the best way to remove a tick by twisting. If you're unsure how to remove a tick speak to your vet first. Don't try to burn them off or use lotion to suffocate, as this won't stop the possibility of getting bacterial infections like Lyme disease.

Lyme disease

A serious bacterial infection called Lyme disease is passed by ticks. Dogs, cats and

uncommon in cats. Symptoms with cats and dogs include depression, loss of appetite, fever, lameness, swollen and painful joints, swollen lymph nodes and lethargy.

Treatment for Lyme disease

If caught early, Lyme disease can be treated with antibiotics. If you think your dog or cat has Lyme disease, contact your vet who will run tests and start a treatment.

Tick prevention

Ticks will bite and feed on your dog or cat for up to

a few days, and drop off once they've had enough. During this time it's possible the tick could give your pet a disease. Stop ticks from biting your pet by using a tick treatment that either kills or repels if they attach. There are different types of treatments, such as spot on treatments, tablets and collars. Ask your vet for the best tick treatment.

Be careful! Never use dog tick medicine on cats or vice versa. Some dog tick treatments contain chemicals that are toxic to cats, and can even be fatal to them.

Humans can get ticks too

Take precautions when walking your dog and wear long sleeved clothing and trousers to cover the skin. You can also use insect repellent to stop ticks. If you're bitten use the tick twisting tool to remove the tick and if you're concerned speak with your GP.

10 tips for avoiding ticks for you and your pet

- Out walking, wear suitable clothing: wearing shorts in tick habitat is an invitation to be bitten!
- Insect repellents can be sprayed on to clothing, but always follow the manufacturers guidelines.
- Carry a tick removal tool and antiseptic wipes.
- Walk in the centre of paths and avoid over-hanging vegetation at the edge of paths where ticks may be waiting.
- Have a 'tick buddy' to help you check your body and be your dog's 'tick buddy'.
- Deter ticks from gardens: keep leaf litter to a minimum, grass short, vegetation cut back, and seating and play equipment away from borders, trees and bird feeders.
- Keep pets tick free using tick-control products.
- Treat pet accessories with repellents too.
- Groom pets thoroughly: make sure you brush against, as well as with, the hair growth to see any embedded ticks. Check inside the ears, around the eyes, on the chin and around the muzzle, as well as between pads and toes.
- Don't bring ticks home: take off outer clothes before going indoors. Tests have demonstrated that ticks can survive a full cycle in the washing machine and short periods in a dryer.

Going on holiday?

Diseases not seen in the UK can be passed by biting insects and ticks when abroad. If you're taking your dog on holiday with you, see your vet about preventative treatments needed to protect your pet against ticks, sandflies, heartworms and tapeworms.

Treatments may be different depending on where you're going, so it's best to talk to your vet well before going on holiday. Some treatments might need to be started before your holiday. If signs of illness appears talk to your vet and let them know your dog has been abroad.





Statement for Edlesborough Parish Council by Cllr David Martin, Buckinghamshire Council Cabinet Member, Logistics

Home to School Transport Arrangements

On Monday 7 September 2020 Cllr Anne Wight notified me that a parent had concerns about overcrowding on the bus route 856 to Cottesloe School. Overcrowding on a school bus is a serious concern and immediate action was taken with the bus operator, Marshalls to resolve it.

An additional bus (the 859) was commissioned to pick up students at Edlesborough, with effect from the following morning of 08 September.

The website timetable has been updated to include the additional stop for the 859; and all 14 parents affected have been sent a notification confirming the changed arrangements for their children. The boarding point is the same and timetable has been confirmed.

The reason for the initial excess passes issued for the 856 was an error made by an officer. this should not of course have happened, parents have to understand that during the first few days of returning to school following a six months break by everyone, changes of transport providers, thousands of children to process including hundreds of new SEND children, every one of whom constitutes their own unique case, staff working from home, new staff not being able to be trained on a one to one basis, etc, etc, travel arrangements from day one in all cases cannot possibly be totally seamless. There will of course be issues; and as these happen, we will make new arrangements to deal with them - as we have done here.

As cabinet member I apologise for these events. I understand completely that issues affecting school transport provision is the last thing parents need in today's climate of uncertainty. However, we did take immediate action on the day we knew of the issue to rectify the situation and ensure the safety of students. I regret this situation arose and for any anxiety this has caused all students and parents affected.

Since this action has been taken, I am pleased to say there have been no further reported concerns of any overcrowding on either bus route. I can also confirm that there have been no reported incidents of any overcrowding on any of the other 130 bus routes commissioned directly by the Council or operated by commercial operators. All school transport providers are in daily contact with the Transport Services Team to ensure the service works effectively. The senior officer team and I review the situation daily; and seek to rectify any issues immediately they arise.

Please be assured that the safety of our children is of paramount concern to the Council and officers. Extensive preparations and adaptations have been made to ensure school transport is as safe as possible, including all vehicles being deep cleaned between school runs.

When we have resolved all outstanding school transport issues for the start of term

I will be conducting a review of all processes leading up to the commencement of the Winter term and I would welcome comments from Edlesborough parents to help inform any changes we will make to existing arrangements. I would welcome the opportunity to meet with the Parish Council and parents, listen to their concerns and discuss how things may be done differently in the future.

Finally, I would like to pay tribute if I may to all parents affected who have contacted Council officers, Cllr Anne Wight, other councillors and myself. What has happened

has certainly caused anxiety for parents and doubtless a certain justifiable anger, all of which I understand completely as I would have felt the same. I appreciate and thank all parents for the tenor of their communications with our officers, which have been moderate and reasonable throughout, and to my mind very commendable in the circumstances. We got this one wrong; we have put it right as quickly and effectively as we could; and we are doing our best to ensure it will not happen again.

From Farm Lad to Inspector Retirement of Inspector Harlow

Thomas Octavius Harlow
Appointed P.c. 71 on 19th January 1882
Retired 15th June 1914

On June 15th (1914) Inspector Thomas O. Harlow retires from active service in the Beds. Constabulary. For the last five years he has been stationed at Woburn. He was born at Ravensden, 53 years ago, was one of the nine sons of Isaac Harlow, farm bailiff on Mr Sutherland's farm, and had one sister. His father was a strict disciplinarian, and until Inspector Harlow was 19 he followed agricultural work under him, and even now he can swing a scythe, hedge, ditch, thatch or do anything else connected with farm life.

At 19 he entered the Loco Department of the Midland Railway at Wellingborough and remained there for two years. When he was 21 he joined the Beds. Police Force at Bedford in the January (19th) of 1882. (His service record shows that he was posted to Luton 19th January 1882). Three other brothers also took to police service - 2 in the Beds. and one in the Manchester City Police, and Sergt. Harlow who retired 3 years ago and is now connected with the Beds. Egg and Game Preservation Society, is one of them, the others also having now retired.

His first station was at Upper Houghton Regis and there he remained 12 months. Passing on to Sharnbrook for 4 years, he was drafted to Toddington, and after 12 or 18 months, to

Eversholt for 10 months, then to Ridgemont for 4 years, and went to **Eaton Bray** where nearly five years were spent amid much trouble and excitement. Of this, however, more anon. From there he went to Hockliffe and after 2 years he was promoted to Sergeant, and transferred to Kensworth in the Luton Division. Later he returned to Toddington and after 4 years went to Leighton Buzzard for 2 years and, being promoted Inspector in 1905, he was removed to Biggleswade and $3\frac{1}{2}$ years later transferred to Woburn. After 5 years there he is now retiring, having completed 32 years' service or 5 more than was necessary to entitle him to seek the rest he thoroughly deserves.

He has served under two Chief Constables - the late Col. Josselyn, and Major F.A.D. Stevens - and six Superintendents; Tydman, Carruthers, Shepherd, Anniwell, Baldwin and Woods.

He holds what few, if any, other members of the Force can show, a certificate of the National Health Society, 53, Berners Street W., stating that "Thos. O. Harlow has attended the Elementary Course of Lectures on First Aid at Toddington, Beds., and has successfully passed a viva voce (by word of mouth) examination therein." It is dated December 12th, 1901 and is signed by M Dunbar, Examiner. He also possesses the white metal badge of the St. John Ambulance Society, a certificate gained in May 1896, at the Bedford Centre, and the Medallions of the Society, from 1905 to 1913, consecutively, of which he has made an artistic watch chain. In all he has passed twelve examinations in First Aid. He is an excellent writer and his office work has been exceptionally good.

In carrying out his varied duties he has had one maxim. "if you want good behaviour you must set an example - instil the instruction by your example as well as by your precept," and his one endeavour in every place has been to leave it better than he found it. It is not always easy to accomplish this, but the result of his work speaks for itself.

Eaton Bray was his worst task. When he went there it was going into the wilds - the conditions were, to use a mild term, barbarous.

One of his first cases was one of drink and assault and the evidence showed that, but for his presence of mind, P.c. Harlow as he then was, would have been slipped into the pond and probably killed while trying to stop the fighting going on.

On another occasion when dealing with a disorderly couple, 20 or 30 assembled and abetted assaults on the constable, while from the following remarks from the Chairman of the Bench in the subsequent police proceedings an idea of some of the conditions can be formed. The Chairman said:

"The defendants were two of the worst characters that could be found at large in any parish in England. The list of their offences was unequalled at the Leighton Bench. Finding that a new policeman was stationed in the village – and it took a brave man to wear the Queen's uniform in Eaton Bray – surrounded by roughs and scoundrels, these two vagabonds of the first water, had plotted together to injure him. The constable cautioned them, and requested them to go home, and led ------ down the road. His companion endeavoured to carry out the plan they had formed, and called for a stick and a pickaxe, interfered with the policeman while on duty. And aided and abetted by some 20 to 30 people, some of the worst scum of Eaton Bray – and it could be imagined what the scum of Eaton Bray was like – from that den of iniquity, Bedford Square, it was only a mercy the policeman was present and able to give evidence."

On another occasion the defendant was proved to have bitten his (Mr Harlow's) wrist and

thumb, bolted with the handcuffs on, and on being caught again, to have bitten and kicked him, while out of a hundred or so assembled, only one would go to help the constable. Several culprits were involved in a series of charges and the Chairman of the Bench on this occasion expressed surprise that a man could be got to go to **Eaton Bray** as a police constable without assistance and gave it as his opinion that the best plan would be to establish a lock-up, and station two constables there.

It was at **Eaton Bray** also he had another experience before which many would have quailed. A certain man, a butcher became "mad drunk." At first at the constable's request he went home to bed but got up in his shirt and went onto the shop, "wanting a knife," to make someone "sit up." P.c. Harlow went in and was met with a blow from a saw, which happily missed his head, but gashed his arm. He had to leave to get the wound dressed and tied up. On coming back, he saw the man running about the road with a 16 in. knife, and realising the danger shouted to him, "drop that knife, or I'll drop you." It had the desired effect and at the Police Court it was pointed out that but for the constable's plucky act, murder would most probably have been done. For this he was publicly presented with a "Merit Badge," and his conduct highly and eulogised, by the Chairman of the Bench (Mr. A. M. Macnamara), saying "it was a badge every constable should be proud to wear, and it was a distinction he felt sure Harlow had thoroughly earned. He had known him personally for some time and he did not believe there was a better servant in the whole force than P.c. Harlow. He was cool and collected in face of danger, and men were only really brave when in such a position they were cool and collected."

These were the sort of conditions he found at **Eaton Bray**, and during his time there he was heartily assisted by the then Vicar, the Rev. Sutton – the best friend he ever had – and the Schoolmaster (Mr. A. Richardson), and at political meetings they were the only three who could get any semblance of continued order. When he was leaving, the inhabitants expressed their regret at his going and the great improvement in the district must be attributed largely to the five years Mr. Harlow spent there.

At other places and times, high commendation had come to him, at Biggleswade in many larceny cases, at Leighton time after time, and also since he has been at Woburn. The usual run of "captures" naturally came his way. On one occasion at Toddington he found a deserter in bed, whom no one else had been able to locate, but his find made the constables dress him before he would move out. On another, while at Leighton, he had a woman and a 13 months' old baby to take to Northampton Gaol. The baby was refused admission and was handed back to him. He had to journey back to Leighton Workhouse with it and, being young and then rather "bashful," it was a most trying journey, but the baby slept all the way.

Those who know him well recognise in his maxim given above the very essence of his dealings. He has never faltered in doing his duty, but kindness and common sense have always been seen in his sternest actions, and wherever he has been he has left many friends and, to his knowledge, no enemies.

The shortest case in his record was at Woburn in 1912. He apprehended a hawker without a licence. A magistrate was passing. They went into the Magistrate's Clerk's office, the case was heard, and the man fined £1, all in 7 minutes from arrest to fine – a record surely. His connection with police service will not be entirely severed. He has a stalwart son, 6 ft. 3 in. in height and 25 years old, in the Northampton County Borough Force. Of his family

of 5, only two others remain, but his wife will accompany him in his retirement, and they will live at Ampthill, for many years we trust, and have the best of health and happiness in their well-earned repose.

Foot note: Thomas Octavius Harlow died 15th December 1942.

We know that the world is not ours to control, and that our plans are confounded by the smallest microbe . . .we know that Church is not committees, agendas and buildings, it is us, in homes, streets, hospitals throughout the world . . .

We know something new – we only have today with those we love, today is the day to say "I love you", to mend an argument, to hold on tight. God is teaching us a new song, for a new land."

May we all learn to sing this new song in the new land we find ourselves in.

Photography in Focus

In this series, John Hockey shares some tips

VIEWPOINT

Where you take your photo from can totally transform the enjoyment of the viewer. Quite often with a camera we naturally take shots in what is termed 'landscape' format (even if they are not landscapes!). All this means is that the horizontal axis is longer than the vertical. With a phone however it would be more likely to be 'portrait' format, where the phone is held vertically.



Now here's the thing - you can change this and hold the piece of equipment however you want – even at an angle if so desired and this can result in more interesting shots.



Above is a picture of the back of Hampton Court, designed by Sir Christopher Wren. It's a lovely building and garden but neither truly come out in this picture. Were you to concentrate on the beautifully designed brickwork and get in close and look up, perhaps turning the camera a little, the picture on the left might result, which I would suggest is more likely to make the viewer want to see your next shot when you are showing them pictures of your visit.

This technique of looking up and tilting the camera device can pay dividends, as the two shots of traditional and modern buildings in Stockholm on the right show. Try it and you may be pleasantly surprised!







Here is another picture, this time of the entrance to Whipsnade Zoo. Perfectly acceptable but perhaps a bit predictable.


I had seen some interesting light from behind clouds on a previous visit and returned to capture that image, initially without success. To be frank I had just about given up when, on returning to the car, I turned round just as the sun


peeked from behind a cloud and gave me this shot, really highlighting the Zoo sign.

This has both dramatic light and shadows, together with an interesting viewpoint.

Some of the best pictures can be made when you use your camera vertical in mode when taking landscape... and conversely you may get more creative pictures when you photograph a person having the device in landscape format:

Classic French Chocolate Mousse

I'm all for innovation and doing things differently. But some things just need to stay true to their classic routes. For example, I love making fresh pizza, and a true Napolitana pizza base only uses yeast, water and flour. No new-fangled additions of sugar, honey or semolina. The same goes for the classic French version of chocolate mousse. No need for whipped cream or any flavourings - this is strictly just chocolate, eggs and a touch of sugar. Perfectly simple and simply perfect.

This recipe works on a per person basis, just make it as big or as small as you need, although a minimum batch for two people is best...

Per person:

1 egg 35g quality dark chocolate (70% is best) 1 teaspoon caster sugar

Melt the chocolate in a bowl over a gently simmering pan of water (the bowl mustn't touch the water).

Meanwhile. separate out the egg white and egg yolk.

Whisk the egg white until firm and stiff. You can decorate with a little grated Whisk in the sugar. You'll get a lovely silky mix.

Once the chocolate is melted, add in the egg yolk and stir well. The mix will go a little thick

Stir in one third of the beaten egg whites to loosen the chocolate mix.

Now you need to fold in the remaining egg



white. Pour it onto the chocolate mix. Using a metal spoon, fold the egg white using a swirling "figure of eight" motion. Turn the bowl as you do it too. The combination of the figure of eight and turning the bowl will mean the egg whites fold in beautifully. It's important to fold and not stir – if you stir too hard, you will take all of the air out of the egg.

Pour the finished mix into either several small ramekins/glasses, or one large one bowl, and chill in the fridge for at least four hours.

LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

SIR ROGER D'AMORY

Like Sir Giles Argentein who I wrote about last time, Sir Roger d'Amory was also involved in the Dunstable mêlée of 1309. A mêlée was a huge gathering of thousands of people where knights would effectively practice battles. He was a Constable of Corfe Castle and was made a baron in 1317 and had caught the king's eye by his bravery at the battle of Bannockburn, so the practice at Dunstable obviously paid off. He later became a man of supreme influence at court and died from wounds sustained at the battle of Boroughbridge, Yorkshire in 1322.

Edward II was well pleased with Roger and 'gave' him marriage to his widowed niece, Elizabeth (de Clare) de Burgh. This made Roger one of the richest men in the kingdom with lands in England, Wales and Ireland. But as we know, it is easy to become over ambitious and when he advised the king to start attacking people who made reasonable claims against him, his fate was sealed. As 'influencers' at court changed and the feebleness of king Edward II became ever more apparent, Roger d'Amory declined in power and the battle at Boroughbridge was to be his last.



The coat of arms is described or blazoned as follows:

Barry nebuly of six Argent and Gules. A bend Azure. That is, the six horizontal bars of silver and red have edges like clouds (*nebuly*) and overall there is a diagonal blue stripe. A relatively simple design which would be well known to adversaries and opponents alike in the battles of the 14th century.

Perhaps you were among those who were confused by guidance seemingly subject to change. Perhaps you were even more confused by the multitude of opinions and interpretations regarding the guidance!

In this time, the press informs us that many turned to prayer and faith to find hope in such a seemingly hopeless time. Warning: Increased Fraudulent Activities

Whilst looking after the IT requirements of both commercial and domestic customers in and around our villages as well as receiving similar calls and emails ourselves, we are aware of an increase recently in fraudulent activities.

These activities can take many forms;

- Phone calls advising you that your broadband has an issue or you are about to be disconnected.
- Phone calls purporting to be from Microsoft or Apple saying that they have noticed that you have an issue with your device.
- Phone calls claiming to be from the Police advising you that you have been caught up in identify theft.
- Emails alleging to be from your bank, HMRC, TV Licence, DVLA etc. possibly claiming that there is an issue or requesting payment and requesting that you click on a link. Often the link then asks you to log into a website that looks to be genuine, but isn't, and requests personal information. This then supplies them with your user id and password as well as the other personal information you have keyed which they can use for identity fraud.
- Automated phone calls impersonating companies such as Amazon Prime and credit
 card fraud departments instructing the recipient to select 1 to be connected. The caller
 then tries to convince recipients to give them remote access to computer equipment or
 pass bank account details over the phone.

Some of these are very elaborate and convincing and it is sometimes difficult to identify those that are valid and those that are not. From our experience, most are not genuine.

Here are some simple rules to follow to try and ensure you do not become a victim:

- 1. Never click on a link on an email unless you are 100% sure that the email and link are genuine, or you are expecting it
 - If you move your mouse over the link, it will normally show you the full link address, i.e. where the link is going to take you. If it does not look right, don't click it.
 - Even if you are currently dealing with the company the email is claiming to be from, e.g. a government department, this does not make the email genuine. Unless you are expecting the email, don't click on it.
- Use your Internet browser (e.g. Internet Explorer, Chrome, Firefox, Safari etc) to using
 a search engine, search for the company or department who is trying to make contact
 with you. Use this to go to the official website and look for the information that the
 email is referring you to.
- 3. NEVER dial a number given to you by someone who has called you that you are not expecting or know.
 - Ask for the department that the person is claiming to be from and the reference/ account number relating to the query, so YOU can call them using a number you know from paperwork you have or have found on the company's website.
 - If you have been called by the Police, ask for the Police Station or department and

the reference/crime number relating to the query. Then search independently for the number of the Police station/location and check the reference number when you get through to the number.

- 4. If you receive a call purporting to be from your broadband supplier saying that there is an issue or they are going to disconnect you, take the details regarding the query (reference number, department the person is from) and then call the company back using a number from their website or your own paperwork.
- 5. If you receive a call from a bailiff saying that they will be visiting to enact a court order, get the details of which court has issued the order, reference number and the person you are talking to. Then independently find the phone number of the court and ask to speak to the court bailiff and verify the details.
 - Ask them to email you the details about the court order.
 - Be aware; these calls tend to be late in the afternoon or late on a Friday in the hope that you can't get hold of the court. Never agree to pay any fine without doing your own research first.
 - Be aware that the person you are speaking to may send you details. Don't assume they are genuine until you have checked them independently.

We received a call similar to this stating that a summons had been raised against us for non-payment late on a Friday afternoon and were advised if we paid immediately it would be significantly cheaper. We stated that we wanted a contact number for this person and court details and when we check with the court there was no such reference or case.

- 6. Emails about Covid or selling items related to Covid;
 - Again, don't click on the links, go via your Internet browser and search for the genuine web address of the company and look on their website for the information, independently.
 - Look at the spelling and grammar on the email, if its wrong then it is more likely to be a scam.
- 7. If you are looking to buy products from a website, investigate the company
 - Have they got a website? Do they show contact details (name, address, phone number etc)?
 - If a UK company, do they exist on the register at Companies House?
 - As a guide, look for lots of reviews, see what others think of the company and their services.
 - Search on the Internet for the company or product and use words like "issues", "fraud", "poor service", "reviews" etc.

In all cases, where you believe you have received or even been involved in this type of activity, report it to the Police via Action Fraud - https://www.actionfraud.police.uk/

If you believe that you have allowed someone, that you have not instigated, to have access to any of your devices, you need to get the devices checked to ensure they have not been compromised. If you believe you may have given out passwords and personal information, change the passwords immediately and contact the relevant authorities and companies regarding any accounts or official documents which may have been compromised.



ZSL Whipsnade Zoo Welcomes Rare 'Finger-Sized' Red Panda Cub

Zookeepers at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo are celebrating a tiny new arrival – an endangered red panda cub born the size of a human finger.

Making its diminutive appearance on Friday 19 June, just days after the UK's largest zoo reopened to the public following a three-month closure, the adorable cub is mum Tashi's seventh baby - and, despite its small size, a huge contribution to the vital international conservation breeding program working to support the declining population of this species.

The reddish-brown youngster, who has distinctive white facial



The cub will be officially named by keepers after its first health check, when vets will be able to determine its sex. "Red panda cubs are surprisingly small when they're first born - about the size of your index finger;" explained ZSL Whipsnade Zoo Deputy Team Leader, Grant Timberlake. "But the cub has grown quickly and is about the size of a small puppy now: though it will be a full year before the cub reaches adult size, it will soon begin testing its incredible climbing skills around its leafy tree-top

enclosure - closely guided by mum of course."

ZSL Whipsnade Zoo reopened to the public on Monday 15 June after an unprecedented three months of closure due to the coronavirus lockdown. The loss of income put the charity zoo under huge financial pressure as they continued to provide the highest level of care for their animals. Now open to limited numbers only, ZSL, the international conservation charity behind the Zoo, is calling on the public to help

Slow-Cooked Marinated Baby Back Ribs

Cards on the table, I absolutely love ribs. I also have nothing but admiration for anyone who can cook them the "hardcore" way. You know, slowly smoked for hours and hours on a perfectly heated BBQ, perfectly marinated, pulling apart as you eat them. Only problem is, you need about 24 hours notice for that and I just don't have that kind of organisation in my life. So these are the "it's 3pm and I fancy ribs this evening" version. Plus they are baked in the oven, so won't get spoiled by rain cancelling the BBQ. They are literally foolproof and work however you make the marinade.

You'll need a large rack of baby back ribs for two people (or one rack per person if you love ribs as much as I do). Ask your butcher to remove the membrane on the back of the ribs if you can.

Store cupboard marinade:

Lots of squirts of ketchup, honey, dark soy sauce, oyster sauce, sesame oil, a couple of teaspoons garlic powder and a drizzle of xiao xing wine. Don't worry about the quantities, and don't worry if you are missing an ingredient. You just want a lovely, dark and slightly sticky sauce.

Rub the ribs all over in the mixed sauce (save a bit of the sauce for later), pop them in a baking dish and cover with foil.

Bake them at 130C for 3-4 hours, basting both sides every hour (you will likely need to add a little bit of water to the pan to get the best bits off the bottom).

Uncover the ribs for the last 15 minutes and baste with the leftover sauce from earlier.

Once cooked, remove and leave to rest, wrapped in foil, for 15 minutes.



Cut up and serve. The meat will be falling off the bone.

These are lovely served with a simple coleslaw and corn on the cob.


Weather Conditions for July & August 2020 Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West July


August
