Joining our friendly staff at the day care centre is very rewarding as the members do enjoy their food and homemade cakes too!

You would need to be able to start at 9.30 to serve lunch at 12.00 (which we hope you will join us for, to give you a break) then you serve the dessert (and again sit with us all) and finally to the washing up for which the hall has kindly provided a super dishwasher to make the job easier. Last month I wrote about the season of Advent which began on November 28th. This year for the first time the Churches Together group has organised an Advent Trail round the villages of Eaton Bray and Edlesborough. It is like a giant Advent calendar with a different picture appearing each day from 1st December up to Christmas Day. Further on in this Focus magazine is a map explaining where you can find the pictures. They will be displayed in local businesses, homes



and places of worship. The pictures will remain in place until Monday 3rd January 2022 giving you the opportunity to walk off your Christmas feasting and follow the trail to view the pictures.

People from the local churches will be designing the pictures themselves and they will relate to different aspects of the Christmas story as told in the gospels of Matthew and Luke. Why not see if you can spot where they appear in your Bible? Or if you don't have a Bible you can look up the stories online at www.biblegateway.com. The Christmas nativity stories are found in Matthew chapter 1 verses 18 to 25 and chapter 2 verses 1 to 15. In Luke's gospel the Christmas story is told in chapter 1 verse 26 through to chapter 2 verse 20. Do any of the pictures surprise you? Is there anything you expected to be there which is missing?

The Advent calendar was first used in Germany by Lutherans in the nineteenth century. The origins of the Christmas tree also come from Germany, introduced by an Englishman from Devon. Winfrith was born in Crediton in Devon in the eight century. He later became known as Boniface and went to Germany to teach the people there about the Christian faith. One December, Boniface found a group of people standing beneath on oak tree. There were preparing to sacrifice a child to their gods believing that it would bring them good fortune. Boniface rescued the child and had the oak tree chopped down. As the oak tree fell, a small fir tree was revealed growing in its place. Boniface adopted the fir tree as an emblem of the new faith he had brought to Germany. The tree's evergreen leaves represented eternal life which was found by believing in Jesus the Son of God. Boniface gave the fir tree the name 'Tree of the Christ-child'. In the sixteenth century another German, Martin Luther, was walking one night under a clear night sky lit by hundreds of stars. The sight moved him so much that he returned home with a fir tree, and fixed candles on its branches to represent Jesus the light of the world. The Christmas tree became part of celebrations in Germany. It wasn't until 1841 that the Christmas tree came to the United Kingdom. It was introduced by Queen Victoria's German husband Prince Albert. It soon became fashionable to have a Christmas tree as part of the festivities. Candles were used to represent Jesus the light of the world. These are the origins of our fairy lights. A star was added at the top of the tree. This was a reminder of the star which guided the wise men to find Jesus with his parents, Mary and Joseph. The Christmas tree symbolises the light and life of the Christ child coming into our midst to bring life and hope.



**EDaN Traffic Management and Speedwatch** 



**Following** site recent meetings, appropriate Speedwatch locations were identified and confirmed within the three villages. Cllr Williams will now complete work on submitting locations for flashing Mobile Vehicle Activation Signs (MVAS) to Buckinghamshire Council and a request to the Wing and Ivinghoe Community Board for funding for MVAS equipment. Once purchased the MVAS equipment will be deployed at various locations around the parish. The data collected can then be shared with Thames Valley Police and Buckinghamshire Council to provide evidence in support of traffic calming requests. The Speedwatch video equipment collects individual speeding vehicle data that is passed to TVP for individual follow up.

The Wing and Ivinghoe Community Board will shortly be supplying a package of 20mph and No Idling advisory signs which can be displayed outside the schools within the Parish.

At the October Council meeting Council ratified their response to support Buckinghamshire Council Cllr Peter Cooper's request for support to lobby Buckinghamshire Council to allow parishes to apply for 20mph limits in specific locations within their parish.

Currently Buckinghamshire Council's stance on speeding vehicles is one of education rather than enforcement.

#### **Salt Bins**

The responsibility for filling these bins is with Transport for Buckinghamshire.





Dear Friends.

Now I'm no killjoy and I do enjoy all of these things.

It's just that we can be so concerned to make preparation for our celebrations that we miss the point of it all, and Christmas becomes an exhausting and expensive (in more ways than one) time for us. John Betjeman wrote, back in 1955:- "Some ways indeed are very odd by which we hail the birth of God".

The 'first Christmas' reflected much of the present day experience of many individuals who are homeless throughout the world. The new born Christ had nowhere to lay his head. Neither do many millions tonight. Whether by means of natural or man-made climate disaster, ethnic cleansing or outright war, these individuals find themselves as Jesus and his human family were soon to become – refugees. They had to flee to Egypt in fear for their lives, because of a ruler's jealousy.

The Christmas story is about a God who loves and cares, who steps into a wider world than the one we sometimes create for ourselves, responding to human need by sharing in the suffering.

Serving others who are in need, and seeking to challenge injustice is the job of those who call themselves Christian. The truth of 'God with Us' – God in the flesh, understanding, struggling alongside, and transforming our individual lives and the suffering of the whole world, that's what Christmas is all about.

Lest we make it something less, let us take time to wonder that God should value us so highly, and to thank him for his greatest gift - Jesus.

I wish you a special Advent time of renewal in the wonder of God's love and then a very Happy Christmas.



### Richard Dalton Grant 22.03.37 - 03.09.21

Richard Grant was raised at The Grove, Slicketts Lane, Edlesborough with his parents, Glynne and Eddie and his younger sister Gerry. Richard, known as, Richie Boy, was always independent - even as a toddler he was collecting milk alone from the nearby farm. He was an ardent animal lover all his life, chickens, cats, birds, dogs, ducks, geese, pigs and sheep. All creatures great and small always held a great fascination for him.

He attended Doretto Lodge Nursery Dunstable and then onto Osmington, Tring with his partner in crime and lifelong friend Robert

Pratt from Totternhoe. Along with his other early childhood friend, Jack Simmons, Richie made the most of the wartime army training camp stationed opposite the Grove where they helped to practice army manoeuvres in the Ford. Following the crash of an American Liberator Bomber near Ashridge, Richie and Jack made several visits on their bicycles to the crash site, where they collected various trophies. He was always adventurous, naughty and mischievous and these proved to be perpetual traits.

He concluded his schooling at Wellingborough in Peterborough where he excelled in sports, notably rugby and tennis. On the rugby pitch he was affectionately known as Tank and he played at Junior Wimbledon in the men's doubles.

From there he did his two years National Service at Kempston Barracks with the Beds/



Herts Regiment. During this time he was posted to Goslar, Germany where he, along with friend Cyril Medlin - a.k.a. The Terrible Twins - were regularly reprimanded for breaking the army rules. Whilst in Germany he taught army vehicle driving. From an early age Richie was fascinated of all types of transportation.

He married Annie in 1959, and they set up home at The Old Forge, Eaton Bray, where they were joined by daughter, Lizzie, in 1960 and son, Michael, 1961. In 1975 Richard bought Edlesborough Mill and Windmill which had remained derelict for 50 years. After a two year restoration the Mill became their permanent family home, the Windmill restoration was to follow some years later.



Richie was always a loved and respected local employer, for his various car accessory related companies: Interior Silent Travel, Eaton Bray; Mill Accessory Group, Edlesborough; RGA - Betterworks, Eaton Bray; RGM - Leighton Buzzard, where he continued to work up until his unexpected death, aged 84.



Like his father, Glynne, before him Richie was always affiliated with Edlesborough Cricket Club, both as a player and then as Club President from 1981 for many years. The annual E.C.C. Awards dinner was an important fixture never to be missed, and became legendary! He donated an engraved cricket slump which continues to be awarded annually to an individual person making the most contribution to the success of the Cricket Club, either on or off the pitch.

His village association meant the world to him and he and Annie loved to support local causes, often hosting wonderful fund raising events at Edlesborough Mill. Apart from village life, his other loves included travelling, photography, wildlife and following all sport on TV.

His kindness, generosity, devilish sense of humour and

mischievous fun will be sorely missed by all who knew him.

#### A YEAR OF RECOVERY AND DISCOVERY FOR THE CHURCH ON THE HILL

We have been kept very busy on all fronts, which has increased the profile of our beautiful Church to entirely new audiences.

You may well have seen a hive of activity in September. After lots of meetings with location managers and directors, "The Crown" transformed the Chancel into a Chapel in Windsor Castle where the fire started in 1992. Imelda Staunton, playing the Queen, spent the whole morning with us. At one stage there must have been a crew of one hundred specialists covering cameras, sound, lighting, with each one knowing precisely their role. The weather was good, so they enjoyed the views and the building. The next series should be aired in November 2022. So when the fire starts, you know where it was.

We have had a record year for "Champing", having bookings right up to October 31st. We had over 140 sleepers this season. Champing is an initiative run by the Churches Conservation Trust, and our Church headlines their website, with lots of internal shots as well. ### And That's Not All of It - Unfortunately!!

As you can see from the picture, the litter pickers have been out in force again in Edlesborough and Northall. Yes, unfortunately most of the 16 or so bags, tyres and general ironmongery came from the hedges and verges around your villages! The Group have really worked hard, especially in the outlying areas where there are no houses. Edlesborough Green has been cleared at least twice during this period! A small group have undertaken to try to clear as much as they can of the verges along the main road between the High Street and Cocks Close which are normally inaccessible due to traffic during the hour of the Remembrance Service road closure

The trouble is that it keeps coming back! No sooner have we cleared a stretch of verge or hedgerow, someone deposits a can or a plastic bottle – or a MacDonald's bag complete with coffee cup – separately of course. Some people just can't bear to see the place looking tidy!

So how can we all help to keep our villages and their surroundings tidy?

Well, if everyone keeps the pavement and general area outside their homes free of litter, that's a big help because it frees up the Group to deal with the more outlying areas. Also, and this is the big one, when you are out on the Green either use the bins provided, or if they are full, take it home. This is more of a problem in the summer when people have picnics on the Green, but no one wants to sit and look at other people's cans, bottles, and crisp packets. But every little helps and even if you don't feel like joining an organised litter pick, you can still do your bit to improve our environment.

So, a big thank you to all our enthusiastic litter pickers, and to the wonderful Bucks C.C. "Men in Orange" who arrived promptly to collect our takings as soon as we asked. We are very lucky to have such efficient back up and couldn't do it without them. The bags in the picture won't be the last, I'm afraid, but there is a great deal of satisfaction to be had in clearing up an otherwise scruffy area in the villages.



## LOCAL HERALDRY BY JOHN HOCKEY

In this series, we take a look around local towns and villages to find interesting and unusual heraldry.

### TODDINGTON REVISITED

This month I have decided to re-visit Toddington to have a look in more detail at one of those funeral hatchments that you find in churches.



This one has an all-black background, meaning both the husband and wife have died. There are two coats of arms on this hatchment, one over the other which happens when the wife is an heiress in her own right. It is called an escutcheon of pretence because although she is actually the head of her family, he is *pretending* to be the head. (Typical man you may say - I couldn't possibly comment). Both have lions passant guardant, meaning walking along and looking at you rather than straight ahead. Both shields have a 'white' chevron (the larger one is Argent, the smaller one Ermine). In addition, those chevrons both have diamond shaped *charges*, the main shield has black lozenges (Sable) and on the smaller shield the *lozenges* are red (*Gules*) and are what is called voided, that is with the centre cut out. These are called *mascles*.

With all these similarities, it is perhaps not surprising that the married couple had the same surname – Cooper! She was Elizabeth Cooper of Toddington who married William Dodge Cooper (actually his family name was Heap but he changed it to hers in 1819).

They both lived into their seventies and the motto is Tuum Est which means 'It's up to you'. I don't know how they got on but I can't help noticing that his crest is a lion holding a battleaxe!



### Daton Bray lifetory

### The Five Bells Public House: 2 Market Square, Eaton Bray

The Five Bells was one of the three pubic houses in Eaton Bray dating back to 1822 and before (the other two being The Chequers, also now closed and The White Horse). The earliest known date for the Five Bells is 1811 when John Brown of Eaton Bray blacksmith, victualler, and cutler published his will (proved in 1812) in which he left his blacksmith's shop and the residue of his

real estate including, presumably, the public house, to his son Sam. Presumably the pub was run as a side line to Brown's main business of blacksmith.

We know that Samuel Brown was licensee for many years. The 1851 census describes him as 71 at that date. He had been born in Eaton Bray and described himself as victualler. He had, presumably, given up smithing. His wife Sophia came from Caddington and was only 37! Her mother Anne Britton, aged 62 lived with them. She was also from Caddington and plaited straw. There was also a servant, Edmund Ellingham, aged 20, unmarried and from Eaton Bray. Directories reveal that he was still licensee in 1854 but by 1862 John Brown was the landlord.

The countywide licensing register of 1876 states that at that date Charles Meacher of Watford [Hertfordshire] was the owner of the Five Bells and that he leased it to Ivinghoe [Buckinghamshire] brewers Roberts and Wilson - Jesse Simmonds the publican was, therefore, the sub-tenant. By the time of the countywide register of 1891 Roberts and Wilson were the owners, as they were in

1903 when the Five Bells was reported as: "clean and in good repair". It was only 44 yards from nearest licensed premises (The White Horse) and had one front and two back doors.

The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. Eaton Bray, like most of the county, was assessed in 1927 and the valuer visiting the Five Bells found it still owned by Roberts and Wilson. The tenant Mrs. A. Kitchen paid rent of £8 per annum.

Mrs. Sarah Jane Webb was just taking over - the valuer commented: "Mrs. Webb taking over from Mrs. Kitchin in a week's time 24/9/1927. Good position. Good little house but I say trade neglected. Buses pass along road. Very good buildings but unused". The rent was just about to be raised to £10 per annum.

The Five Bells comprised a tap room, a smoke room and lounge and a cellar (all "good"), a scullery and a pantry completed the lower accommodation and three bedrooms lay upstairs along with a "Long lumber room".

Outside stood a weather-boarded and slated earth closet, a brick and slate urinal, a brick and tiled open barn, coal barn and two stall stable and a weather-boarded and corrugated iron open shed stood by the house. There was also one rood of orchard with "old trees".

Takings were between £10 and £12 a week. Trade comprised one barrel of beer per week including bottled stuff ("which is four dozen pints and three dozen half pints" per week and 29 gallons of spirits in the previous year. On average the pub sold one dozen bottles of minerals a week. The valuer commented: "This must be less [than the White Horse] but not such a great difference". Another hand noted: "Sir T [Sir Trustram Eve] saw Benskins. Trade 40 barrels".

Benskins Watford Brewery took over Roberts and Wilson during 1927 and Benskins was, itself, taken over by Ind Coope of Burton-on-Trent [Staffordshire] in 1957 when the Watford brewery closed. In 1961 Ind Coope merged with Ansells of Birmingham [Warwickshire] and Tetley Walker of Leeds [Yorkshire] to form Allied Breweries.

The Five Bells closed in 2010 and Central Bedfordshire Council approved a change of use for it to become a private house. This leaves the White Horse as Eaton Bray's oldest continuing licensed premises.

### Pat Finch Disease (Trichomonosis)



We love our wild birds and enjoy watching them at the bird feeders we have scattered around the garden. As well as Robins, Blackbirds, Magpies, Doves, Pigeons, Blue Tits, Woodpeckers and Ducks we have had many more finches over the last few years – Greenfinches, Goldfinches, Bullfinches and Chaffinches.

We recently noticed a few of the Greenfinches looking puffed up and seemingly very hungry and

not flying off with the rest. We found on separate occasions a Green Finch on the ground not able to fly off. We lifted them carefully up and placed them in a safe box and although they tried to eat and drink, they died very quickly afterwards. We then found a further couple of dead Greenfinches in the garden. It just felt that this was not normal, so I spent some time researching this on Google.

It appears that from our experience and the description of the symptoms, they had succumbed to Avian Trichomonosis. Many people call it **'fat finch disease'** a very apt description. In the UK, it first appeared in Greenfinches visiting gardens in the summer/autumn 2005, as a result of the Citizen Science scheme, Garden BirdWatch, run by the British Trust for Ornithology, (BTO). It is a well-known disease called 'canker' in pigeons and 'frounce' in raptors. Pigeons and doves may be the main carriers.

The infection is the result of a parasitic organism, called Trichomonas gallinae. Nationally it has been estimated that in excess of half a million Greenfinches have died. Considering that the UK Greenfinch population is about 4 million birds, this is a huge reduction.

### **Symptoms**

Greenfinches, Chaffinches, Goldfinches, House sparrows, Bullfinches can be infected. Although it is Greenfinches that have been affected the most. The poor infected birds look lethargic, weak, sleepy, fluffed up, have difficulty breathing, are reluctant to fly, hang around bird feeders and attempt to eat. They physically cannot swallow food or drink. Unfortunately, food or water does not reach their stomach due to the 'cheese' like lesions in the bird's crop, caused by the parasite. The parasite itself feeds upon cell debris, pus and bacteria as found in the bird's crop. As the disease progresses, birds may drool and have uneaten food on the beak with matted, wet plumage around the face and beak. The birds eat yet starve to death or die of thirst. You can often see them stretching their necks to probably help with their discomfort. It could be described as the myxomatosis of the bird world.

#### Importance of feeding hygiene

The advice is adopt good hygiene practice with your feeders. I am now cleaning my

bird feeders weekly with an environmentally friendly disinfectant and boiling water and then leaving them to air dry.

#### Prevent contamination around bird feeding/bathing stations

If you look beneath your feeder and you will likely see bird droppings, seeds and other materials. Over time this can build up and hold moisture. Trichomonosis can survive in such conditions long enough to infect other birds that may feed/search amongst this material. The advice is to regularly move your feeders around the garden helping to eliminate this build-up. Any built-up material should be removed and binned.

If possible, have different types of feeders to suit different species and place them around your garden, thereby spreading the numbers of birds in your garden and limit the overcrowding in small spaces.

Place bird baths or water bowls away from bird feeders/bird tables and other areas where birds perch. This will help reduce faecal contamination or bird food spat out by an infected bird landing in the water.

As Woodpigeons (numbers visiting gardens has markedly increased in recent years, esp. in early summer when food gathering for their young) are carriers, it may be prudent to try to keep them away from feeders or ground tables.

If you get a large number of birds at your feeders and you want to avoid spreading this disease or you see an infected bird, the Garden Health Wildlife advice is that you stop all feeding altogether for 2-4 weeks and disinfect your bird feeders. This will make the birds disperse. (Although likely the birds will find other feeders where these hygiene methods are not carried out.) Mouldy food may contain toxins which may cause disease in birds and harbour other diseases so feeders should be regularly emptied and topped up with clean fresh food.

Hopefully by these simple measures, we can help contain this horrible disease, prevent our lovely birds from suffering and continue enjoying their wonderful contribution to our gardens.



### **Chiltern Society PhotoGroup**

A short while ago I did a series of articles in Focus consisting of tips for better photography. As a relative novice in the art form, I have learnt a good deal from my membership of the Chiltern Society and other members in its dedicated PhotoGroup.

In addition to regular meetings held in Amersham and occasional outdoor shoots at local villages, the PhotoGroup has a comprehensive online photo library which takes in much of the landscape, villages and towns in this lovely part of the world, all photographed by members over the years. This offers the chance to view buildings, countryside, heritage and life and provides a chance to compare recent photographs with those from the past.

In addition there is an annual Online Exhibition where people can send in up to 12 pictures from around the UK in five categories – Flora & Fauna, Buildings, Landscape, Heritage and Other. A specialist photographer reviews many of the pictures entered and provides comments for the novice or more experienced. There are no 'winners' just a lovely record showing the many ways there are to display the ingenuity and beauty that people interested in photography can bring to everyday scenes.

The website has a full search facility and provides a dedicated digital record of the Chilterns including such up to date issues as the route of the HS2 rail project.

I am currently engaged in collating the entries for the EDaN Parish (Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall) and I include three photos that I intend to send in by way of example. If you are minded to join the Society you could review other local villages and towns known to you

and perhaps think of ways to improve/update this valuable visual database.



### HOME FOOT HEALTHCARE TIPS

#### HOME FOOT HEALTHCARE TIPS

Winter is on the way and with the cold weather it is important to ensure that your feet stay warm and dry. Here are some tips that will keep your feet looking and feeling healthy this winter.



Hard skin can build up at any time of the year on your feet mainly due to:

- Excessive loading on certain parts of the sole of the feet.
- · Prominent bones.
- · Rubbing from footwear.

There are many gadgets on the market for this task but I would give a word of caution with the big cheese grater types of hard skin removers as it is very easy to get carried away and end up with sore tender feet as a result, leaving an uneven finish affecting new skin. I recommend regularly filing with a foot file. Frequency is key, file first then use a foot cream after. Use socks afterwards to increase the creams' effectiveness.

Do not use talcum powder or moisturiser between your toes.

- If your toes are tight together you may get an increase in moisture and debris, only use surgical spirit to clean between your toes.
- Always cut your nails straight but you can follow the shape of the nail to prevent sharp edges.

See a Podiatrist for maintenance of your feet. As well as treating corns and callouses, they can check for verrucae and fungal infections and advise appropriate action. Hard skin build-up can also indicate that you could be overloading one part of your foot. This can cause malalignments and injuries with your hips, knees and back.

If you feel unsteady on your feet, then gait analysis maybe recommended and advice on whether you need simple insoles, orthotics/ exercises can be given. At St Judes we have a team of four HCPC registered Podiatrists who can help - we're open Monday to Saturdays, so why not give us a call?

#### Would You Re-mortgage Your Home to Help Your Child onto the Property Ladder?

How far would you go to help your child get on in the world?

Many parents move area to ensure their child gets into the best primary school or fund their university costs. Many of you reading this have even helped your children with the deposit for their first home from savings.

However, I have come across many local people in their 50's and 60's who have good jobs and incomes, yet don't have the savings to give to their children to help them buy their first home. It doesn't help when you consider...

### the average value of a home in LU6 has risen by 15.7% in the last 5 years, from £279,034 to £322,717.

I am therefore seeing increasing numbers of parents who are willing to re-mortgage their own home or start a new mortgage (when they own their home outright) - to get their children onto the local property ladder.

So, whilst the Government is trying to turn Britain's 20 and 30 somethings from 'Generation Rent' into 'Generation Buy', the Bank of Mum and Dad are mortgaging their retirement to pay for it all. Yet it need not be cost prohibitive borrowing the deposit as you still have access to interest only mortgages.

With an interest only mortgage, your monthly mortgage payment covers only the interest on your mortgage, not any of the original capital borrowed. This means your mortgage payments will be lower than on a repayment mortgage, remembering though at the end of the term you will still owe the original amount you borrowed from the mortgage provider.

### 1 in 14 new mortgages are interest only and 1 in 5.5 existing mortgages are interest only mortgages, they are very popular.

Anyway, many local homeowners might be worried about having that level of debt in their golden years. However, many plan to pay off the mortgage when they downsize as they get into their 60's and 70's.

I talk to many local homeowners who are asset rich but cash poor and desire to help their children onto the property ladder. Their attitude is that their children will inherit their property when they pass away, so it seems practical to give them that money to work harder for them earlier in their life when they need it to buy their first home.

#### Can you get a mortgage, even if you are retired?

A lot is dependent upon your age and financial position. The mortgage companies will see if you have adequate funds for your retirement and emergencies plus leaving enough equity in the property to enable you to downsize in the future. Like all things, you need to take advice from a qualified mortgage arranger.

So, that then begs the question, is there enough equity in LU6 homes to borrow against? In the late 1980s and again in the early 2000s, many Brits saw their homes as a cash machine. Numerous homeowners re-mortgaging at the end of their mortgage's preliminary term (usually after the initial 2, 3 or 5 years), but when doing so increased their mortgage to enable them to buy a nice car or fancy holiday. Yet, by increasing the borrowing, it created negative equity in the early 1990s and stopped many homeowners moving home between 2009 and 2013 because of their lack of equity.

Therefore, I have to ask, have we borrowed too much this time round? Looking at Dunstable and the specific postcodes LU5 and LU6 combined...

### In 2016, the average local homeowner had a mortgage of £103,623 and today it is £140,224, a rise of £36,601.

Looking at these numbers, one might think we are again over-extending ourselves, yet as regular readers of my blog about the local property market will know - I like to drill down and look at all the figures.

Initially, I was worried about these stats, until I considered the equity local people have amassed over the same 5 years.

In 2016, the average equity held in a local homeowner's property (whilst still having a mortgage) was £175,411, yet today that stands at £182,493, a rise of £7,082.

Even though mortgages have increased, homeowner's, living in LU6, equity has risen even more, meaning as we stand today, mortgaged and owned-outright properties, there is...

#### £7,606,247,833 of equity held in all homes in LU6.

Whilst the total value of mortgages has increased slightly since 2016, as a percentage, this has gone down meaning local homeowners and landlords have increased their equity in the last five years.

It can quite clearly be seen that the financial insecurity sparked by the Credit Crunch crisis of 2008/9 has created a generation of local homeowners and landlords who are savers and improvers rather than movers and excessive borrowers, using excess cash to invest in their property and pay down debt or to excessively borrow on their equity growth.

### Only 20.3% of the total value of property in LU6 is borrowed money with a mortgage.

This is great news for every local homeowner and landlord because irrespective of whether the 'Post Lockdown Bounce' is short or long-lived, it shows the local property market is in a better state to ride out any storm that it might encounter than ever before because less people will be in negative equity or have prohibitively high mortgages. Before I finish, I fully appreciate money and inheritance is a sensitive subject for many families.

My message to all the local parents is, just because your children aren't talking about the subject, it doesn't mean it's not on their mind.

The lead has to come from you, as a parent, to ensure the wealth held in your bricks and mortar can be used to your family's advantage, when they need it most.

If you do, your children will thank you for it and they may even do exactly the same for their children, then, they will do the same for their children's children ... creating a legacy that will go on for generations.


#### Weather Conditions for October 2021

'The Christmas Cracker'



Christmas is just around the corner. We are all getting ready for Christmas. Presents and food to buy, Christmas cards to buy and send, stockings to fill before the great day! Our lives have been turned upside down with the pandemic and possibly it has been a time of taking stock and reflecting the true meaning of Christmas. This year is definitely better with the freedom of being with family and friends that was denied to us last year because of the ongoing threat of the pandemic.

However I ask the question, 'What is Christmas all about?' Why do we celebrate the 25th of December every year? Why do we buy all these presents, have turkey and the trimmings? Why do we endure the endless repeats on the television and listen religiously to the Queen's speech on Christmas Day?

### How does the Christmas Cracker convey the true message of Christmas?

No Christmas table is complete without crackers for everyone to pull. These were the invention of a London baker called Tom Smith in 1846. He was so taken when visiting Paris where he saw bonbons (wrapped sugar almonds in a twist of paper) that he took that idea and developed it into the Christmas Cracker we have today. He started selling them in London and found that young men gave them to their sweethearts and so started putting love poems into each cracker.

One day whilst sitting by the fire, the log crackled and he had a flash of inspiration to replicate the noise when people opened his bonbons. Soon the Christmas cracker was born and became popular.

But when you look at a cracker and take it apart- what religious significance can you see.

What is the first thing a cracker does? It goes BANG! It gives us a surprise, a reminder of the surprise the shepherds had on that first Christmas night when they were visited by the angels and told the news, "Today in Bethlehem your Saviour was born, Jesus Christ the Lord" (Luke 2)

The next thing we discover is a little gifta reminder of the three gifts brought to Jesus by the wise men: gold for a king, frankincense for a priest, who would be a link between human beings, and myrrh as a symbol of his special death. Christmas is a time for giving presents as a reminder of God's greatest gift, his gift of his one and only son Jesus Christ.

The first crackers often contained a motto, proverb or Bible verse- a reminder of what Joseph was told when he found that Mary was having a baby that wasn't his. "You are to give him the name Jesus. They will call him Immanuel, which means God with us" (Matthew 1, 21-23)

Tom Smith's final idea of a cracker was a crown - a reminder that God wants us to crown him King of our lives and to accept the real gift of Christmas; a new life we find through Jesus. As we pull crackers and open gifts this year, we pray that we will receive the gift God offers to us in Jesus.

May we this Christmas remember the true meaning of Christmas when Jesus Christ came into the world – He was the free gift that God offers to us today.
