A few months ago, the nations of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland came together to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen. Following her Majesty's death on 8th September, the nations have come together again to mourn the passing of a great Queen, and to pledge support to our new King Charles III. On her 21st Birthday, Princess Elizabeth, as she then was, gave a radio broadcast in which she dedicated her life to the service of her people. She promised: 'I declare before you that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong.' She never wavered from that sense of dedicated service, in good times and in bad, as the world changed immeasurably around her. In 1947 at the age of 21 she married Prince Philip, whom she described as 'my strength and my stay.'

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, summed up the thoughts of many: 'As we grieve together we know that, in losing our beloved Queen, we have lost the person whose steadfast loyalty, service and humility has helped us make sense of who we are through decades of extraordinary change in our world, nation and society. As our grief runs deep, even deeper is our gratitude for Her Late Majesty's extraordinary dedication to the United Kingdom, her Realms and the Commonwealth. Through times of war and hardship, through seasons of upheaval and change, and through moments of joy and celebration, we have been sustained by Her Late Majesty's faith in what and who we are called to be.'

Many of you will have seen the Queen in person. I saw her at a service in York Minster and it is something that I will always remember. Recalling their memories of the Queen, people talk of her warmth and kindness, of her lack of self-importance and her ability to put others at their ease. Her knowledge of the world and its leaders was unsurpassed and her wisdom was invaluable to her Prime Ministers and members of parliament. The late Queen was a constant, calm and steady leader devoted to her people in the United Kingdom, her realms and throughout the Commonwealth.

She also had a wonderful smile and a lively sense of humour. Who can forget her meeting with James Bond at the opening ceremony of the 2012 Olympics in London? Or taking tea with Paddington Bear as part of her Platinum Jubilee celebrations only a few months ago? I always wondered what she kept in her handbag. And then I found out. It was an emergency marmalade sandwich!

At the heart of the late Queen's sense of calling was her Christian faith which she often spoke of. In her 2014 Christmas broadcast she said: 'For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace... is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model

of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek and respect and value all people of whatever faith and none.'

As we mourn her passing, we commit her to God's mercy and protection. May she rest in peace and rise in glory.

Edlesborough Parish Council News Including Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall

Ivinghoe Freight Strategy

EPC wishes to express its thanks to all the Parishioners who took the time to respond to the Ivinghoe Freight Strategy. Due to the large number of responses from parishioners Buckinghamshire Council were obliged to revise the strategy and subsequently include the B440, Leighton Road through Edlesborough and Northall in the strategy.

The strategy is on course to be implemented in September 2022.

Edlesborough High Street Telecom Mast

On 15th August Greg Smith MP attended a site meeting about the newly installed telecom mast on High Street, Edlesborough. Buckinghamshire Cllr Peter Brazier and the EPC Clerk were also in attendance. 12 parishioners stayed for the duration of the meeting.

Greg Smith MP had viewed the mast from the garden behind the mast prior to the meeting. Greg Smith MP and BC Cllr Peter Brazier both agreed that the location is not suitable at all and were astounded that the application had been allowed. Greg Smith MP stated that he would happily back the residents and would support them with signing letters



if/when the matter goes to the ombudsmen. He reiterated that BC's complaints procedure must be fully utilised/exhausted before the Ombudsman Services' would get involved.

The resident of the property behind the mast clarified that the tree detailed on the application as the one that would mask the pole had been in her garden and it had been removed in July 2021 as it was rotten and in danger of falling on their house. The first application was not submitted until September 21. Therefore the drawings submitted were inaccurate and no one carried out a site visit to check for accuracy.

Greg Smith MP offered the following advice;

- Residents get their homes valued as proof that the mast has devalued their property. Ask the Estate agent for two valuations one with the mast present and one without.
- Residents write to the operator directly, stating that the mast has devalued their home and that Greg Smith MP and BC Cllr Peter Brazier agree that the location is outrageous and inform the operator that they are looking into taking legal action over this.
- If residents ask for the pole to be moved they need to propose a more suitable location within 200m of the current location.
- The pole is 5G and only has 500m coverage and is for Three network coverage.

BC Cllr Peter Brazier impressed upon the parishioners that they will need to prove that proper procedure was not followed during the planning application process. He advised the parishioners that BC planners are relying on the fact that permission would have been granted even if the proper procedure had been followed.

Greg Smith MP and Cllr Peter Brazier agreed the following actions:

- They will jointly escalate the matter/complaint to the leader of Buckinghamshire Council, Martin Tett and the BC Chief Exec.
- They will explore putting together a flyer to be delivered to residents advising them how to complain to BC about this mast, if they are minded to do so.
- Push for the BC Leader, Martin Tett to come out to site to see the mast in person and to

challenge him on the statements made in the letter from Mark Aughterlony on 1st June. EPC objected to both applications for the installation of this mast and have additionally written to Directorate for Planning, Growth & Sustainability Planning and Environment Development Management, Buckinghamshire Council drawing their attention to the reality verses the plan for





Breaking The Code Little Theatre Production

During the Second World War, tucked away in the country at Bletchley Park, the most brilliant mathematical minds in Britain were working to crack the complex German military code known as Enigma. At Bletchley, Turing's genius was recognised immediately and Churchill insisted he was given all the resources he needed in to break the code. His efforts shortened



the war by two years and saved an estimated two million lives, but since his work was classified top secret for years after the war, no one knew how much was owed to him. When he was later put on trial and publicly humiliated by the revelation of his sexuality, he chose to undergo chemical castration rather than serve a prison sentence, which left him physically and mentally debilitated. In 1954, he died by his own hand, aged 41, forgotten and alone.

Over half a century later, Turing is now lauded as a British hero. After being posthumously pardoned by the Queen, his story was immortalised in the film The Imitation Game starring Benedict Cumberbatch. Derek Jacobi also took London and Broadway by storm in this exceptional biographical drama about a man who broke more than one code.

Hugh Whitemore's compelling and acclaimed play investigates who he was, what happened to him and why. It's a compassionate and poignant depiction of the life of an extraordinary man, his creativity, his yearning for love and companionship and his deep humanity.



750g/1lb 10oz pumpkin, peeled, deseeded and cut into chunks 350g sweet shortcrust pastry plain flour, for dusting 140g caster sugar ½ tsp salt ½ tsp fresh nutmeg, grated 1 tsp cinnamon 2 eggs, beaten 25g butter, melted 175ml milk 1 tbsp icing sugar

Step 1

Place the pumpkin in a large saucepan, cover with water and bring to the boil. Cover with a lid and simmer for 15 mins or until tender. Drain pumpkin; let cool.

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Roll out the

Thai Pumpkin Soug

Ingredients

1.5kg pumpkin, peeled and roughly chopped
4 tsp sunflower oil
1 onion, sliced
1 tbsp grated ginger
1 lemongrass, bashed a little
3-4 tbsp Thai red curry paste
400ml can coconut milk
850ml vegetable stock
lime juice and sugar, for seasoning
1 red chilli, sliced, to serve (optional)
Method

Step 1

Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Toss the pumpkin in a roasting tin with half the oil and seasoning, then roast for 30 mins until golden and

pastry on a lightly floured surface and use it to line a 22cm loose-bottomed tart tin. Chill for 15 mins. Line the pastry with baking parchment and baking beans, then bake for 15 mins. Remove the beans and paper, and cook for a further 10 mins until the base is pale golden and biscuity. Remove from the oven and allow to cool slightly.

Step 3

Increase oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Push the cooled pumpkin through a sieve into a large bowl. In a separate bowl, combine the sugar, salt, nutmeg and half the cinnamon. Mix in the beaten eggs, melted butter and milk, then add to the pumpkin purée and stir to combine. Pour into the tart shell and cook for 10 mins, then reduce the temperature to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Continue to bake for 35-40 mins until the filling has just set. Step 4

Leave to cool, then remove the pie from the tin. Mix the remaining cinnamon with the icing sugar and dust over the pie. Serve chilled.

tender. Step 2 Meanwhile, put the remaining oil in a pan



with the onion, ginger and lemongrass. Gently cook for 8-10 mins until softened. Stir in the curry paste for 1 min, followed by the roasted pumpkin, all but 3 tbsp of the coconut milk and the stock. Bring to a simmer, cook for 5 mins, then fish out the lemongrass. Cool for a few mins, then whizz until smooth with a hand blender, or in a large blender in batches. Return to the pan to heat through, seasoning with salt, pepper, lime juice and sugar, if it needs it. Serve drizzled with the remaining coconut milk and scattered with chilli, if you like.



Northall Baptist Church

200 years and still going A little Church with strong local links

Shirley Smith – A faithful friend

Shirley Smith has been the organist at Northall for over 30 years. Her family laid down roots in Leighton Buzzard over 100 years ago. Her story is fascinating, so we share a brief interview.

Tell me about your family's history in Leighton Buzzard? My grandfather was a draper's apprentice. He finished his apprenticeship and came to Leighton Buzzard in 1910. He set up a draper's shop called 'Becks' (Church Street) until he retired in 1937. My mother, from Leighton Buzzard, and my father, from Linslade, met and married in 1924. In 1929 my parents decided to emigrate to South Africa leaving with my elder sister.

What was your childhood like in South Africa? I was born in Pretoria and moved to Durban where I started school during the war. I remember walking to school independently as a 6-year-old – even crossing main roads by myself! My mother was a music teacher. Aged 6, I began to play the piano and spent many hours on it. My family and I were evacuated to a place inland called Greytown, to avoid the threat of war and potential invaders. My life was simple, happy and free: climbing trees, roaming with friends, paddling in the river and going on walks with my mother.

What happened next? After finishing school, I eventually started working as a Civil Servant at the Magistrates Office for 6 years- firstly in Greytown and then in the big city in Durban in the Children's Court. I felt like a 'country bumpkin'. I then trained as a teacher and taught primary school children up to age of 12.

What brought you to the UK? My mother and I came to live with my aunt in Leighton Buzzard in 1978 for family reasons.

Tell me about the church where you are a member and how has faith helped you over the years? I have been a member of the Catholic Church as long as I can remember. I could not live without my faith: it's everything to me.

How did you start playing at Northall? While an organist at Sacred Heart, I responded to a newspaper article requesting an organist at Northall in 1991.

Why do you enjoying playing the organ so much? I love music and singing. Playing the organ is my way of glorifying God. I think when the congregation sings it magnifies our worship. I often imagine if this is what the angels singing in heaven sounds like!

Why not come along to hear Shirley playing on Sundays at Northall?

Our Sunday services are now back in Church 11 am. We would love you to join us for our worship and song. You will get a warm welcome. For those unable to attend in person we also stream our services.



Holiday on our Doorstep

Planning a holiday each year takes a lot of thought and most of us involve the family, usually over several days, then settle on a budget, prior to booking.

The past years have been at the least difficult, and cancellations have become the norm, along with delays in the airports and ferries making holidays overseas frustrating.

Plans for overseas holidays in the last couple of years have been re booked, sometimes several times,



but at least this year some of us have travelled to get some sun, which is great.

UK holidays have boomed this year with many of us booking cottages and B & Bs to avoid the overseas travelling, but one option close to home is a canal holiday, and we are lucky enough to have one based in Leighton Buzzard.

Wyvern Shipping have 28 canal boats available for sleeping 2 to 8 crew, plus some boats can accommodate our family dogs.

They offer from 4 days to several weeks bookings on the Grand Union Canal with some availability for October or November this year, or if that's not going to float your boat, perhaps an early bird booking for 2023 would be an option, with all the discounts that go with an early booking.

Full training is offered to everyone that books, with guidance through the first lock and more training is available if required. Boats are fully equipped and come in many sizes starting with 42 feet to 65 feet in length.

Walk along the tow path from Tesco in Leighton Buzzard to the Globe pub and see the boat yard from the bank. You are welcome to call in and see the boats and discuss your ideas or simply call Heather or James on 01525 372355, they will discuss your thoughts or arrange for you to receive a brochure and dvd if required.

Travelling at 4 mph or less through the English countryside is very relaxing, calling



at the canal side pubs, or if you are more adventurous London or the Midlands can be part of your holiday. If you prefer to be on dry land and look at the boats, Wyvern home, a waterside cottage which sleeps 11 is available.

Hire charges are fully inclusive, so no added extras, do take a look on the website www.canalholidays. co.uk



The Fountain Beerhouse Eaton Bray (courtesy of the Bedfordshire Archives)



The Fountain about 1900

The Fountain or Fountaine Beerhouse stood on the north side of the High Street, just southeast of Poplar Farm in an area of what is now modern housing. There was a family called Fountain in the village, associated indeed with other licensed premises (licensees of The Chequers from at least 1812 to at least 1828, The Hope and Anchor from at least 1853 to at least 1886, The Victoria Arms in 1894 and 1895 and The Volunteer in 1897 and 1898) but none of them ever appears as licensee of the Fountain(e) Arms except briefly in the early 1880s. Nevertheless the family may have been the original owners of the property or had some connection with it – the coincidence between the family name and the beerhouse name seems too great otherwise.

The countywide licensing register of 1876 states that it was first licensed in 1845 and by 1876 the owner was Woburn brewer Henry Fowler. Fowler's brewery and its licensed premises was put up for sale by auction in 1881. The sale particulars describe the Fountaine Lot 17, as comprising a tap room and "upland" cellar (in other words a storage room for beer on the ground floor), a parlour and a washhouse with three bedrooms upstairs. There was a yard with a slated cart lodge and a garden. There was also a "small tenement adjoining". The rent was \pounds 7 per annum.

The countywide register of 1891, which, oddly, describes the Fountaine as being in Bower Lane, gives the owner as "Gurney's Executors" of Slapton. They leased the beerhouse to Ivinghoe brewers Roberts and Wilson and the rent was now $\pounds 9/17/6$ per annum.

The countywide register of 1903 gives Miss Gurney of Slapton as the owner, she still leased the beerhouse to Roberts and Wilson. The rent to the sub-tenant, Amos Gray, was now £10 per annum. The house was "Fairly good repair, not very clean" and was 59 yards from the nearest licensed premises (The Bedford Arms). The Fountain had one front and two back doors.

The licensing register kept by the Leighton Buzzard Petty Sessional Division reveals that the Fountaine closed for the last time on 22nd December 1914. Two unsuccessful attempts

were made to sell the property, in 1916 and 1917. On both occasions the particulars read as follows:

"THE FOUNTAINE INN"

comprising brick and half timber and thatched

HOUSE

Containing Living Room, Parlour, Kitchen, cellar and three Bedrooms, with **OUT-BUILDINGS and GARDEN**.

It is in the tenancy of Mr. Hugh McIntyre, a monthly tenant, at 8s. per month.

Adjoining is a two-roomed

COTTAGE

In the tenancy of Mark Rollings. The Drainage connection has been made.

The adjoining owners are Mr. W. E. Wallace and Mrs. E. Batchelar.

Hugh McIntyre had been landlord of The Bedford Arms until 1915. The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. Eaton Bray, like most of the county, was assessed in 1927 and the valuer visiting the former beerhouse found that it had finally sold and was now a private house owned and occupied by T. J. Devrell.

The brick and thatched semi-detached building comprised two living rooms, a kitchen, two sculleries and a washhouse downstairs with three bedrooms and a store room above. The valuer commented: "Rambling place" and "Was 2 cottages". Outside stood a brick and slated WC, a weather-boarded and slated store shed and open shed and a "Large shed – owner makes and packs self raising flour".

FREE BMERC COURSE - Make Your Wildlife Observations count

More and more people seem interested in wildlife watching and identifying the species which visit their gardens or favourite local places. Unfortunately, not many pass on this valuable information to special interest groups and Local Records Centres.

At BMERC (Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes Environmental Records Centre) we often receive enquiries about the wildlife people are seeing, how to improve their skills at its identification, and increasingly how they can make the information available publicly as a record of what they have seen. To help answer many of the more common questions we have created a two part online course, open free to anyone who is interested. Comprising two x 1hour sessions online, the course seeks to fill in some of the gaps and help share understanding of what we can record, and how. The courses are being held on Thursday, October 20th from 12.30pm and Saturday, October 29th from 6.00pm.

The course is FREE and is now open to bookings. We know many people have an interest and are keen to support them by providing some key background information and support.

The two courses are designed as a pair. They are free to all, but you will need to sign up in advance to get access to them, they are booked using the Everbrite platform and will run via Zoom on the day.

Aardvarks Arrive at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo for the First Time in its History

Two aardvarks (Orycteropus afer) named Nacho and Terry have been scurrying around their new home at ZSL Whipsnade Zoo, exploring their exhibit, which opened to the public on Saturday 6 August.

The charismatic creatures are the first aardvarks to live at the UK's largest zoo in its 90-year history.

The young insectivores have spent their first week exploring their new digs and building vast, dirt tunnels across their large habitat.

Nacho (8) and Terry (2) will be joined by two porcupines and two meerkats in the new labyrinthine enclosure, which features viewing windows into the nocturnal creatures' snug sleeping areas. Lucky visitors may even see them sniffing around their habitat in the early evening, when the creatures scamper outside to 'start their day'.

Team leader Sarah McGregor said: "I can't wait for our visitors to see these incredible creatures for themselves. I think a lot of people have never seen an aardvark in real life, and they are so enigmatic and fascinating.

"It's been so wonderful to get to know Nacho and Terry over the past week. Already, it's clear that Nacho is a calm and confident female, while Terry, who is only two, has been zooming around the dirt mounds, and, like many youngsters, only eating dinner on his own terms!

"They are clearly delighted with their new surroundings and have exhausted themselves every night, digging through and climbing on the extensive dirt mounds.

"It's also really exciting to have the three species together. Our new porcupines Kimya and Tiombe are still quite shy, but we expect them to grow in confidence as they settle into their new home. Our two meerkats were already here at the Zoo but are now being introduced to what must feel like the biggest "house extension" ever! We have lots of flexibility with different spaces that can either be joined up or separated, so we will take our time letting all the animals get to know each other and decide the best sleeping arrangements for them all as we learn their favourite spots."




Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)

July started on the cool side and, although generally dry, we had an early evening shower on the 2nd. Within a week, the temperature had reached 30°c. From the 16th, it got even hotter, bringing very sunny weather and a high of 39.3°c on the 19th. That broke all records here in Dagnall and we were only one degree below the UK record. This was unbearable for some, if not all, and was the highest temperature I have ever recorded in sixty years of being a weather observer. The following day the temperature dropped and we had our wettest day with rain of 14.6mm. The rest of the month was pleasantly warm. It was another extremely dry month with only 23mm of rain on top of what was already a dry year.


Weather Conditions for August 2022

August started on the warm side mainly sunny with patchy cloud. On the 7th the temperature started to rise by the 10th we were in the 30 degrees and by the 13th we had reached 34.3° c. The next few days the temperature dropped to the mid-twenties with a few very light showers. The temperatures remained steady until 25th when they dropped to 16.4° c and we had a day of proper rain 29.21mm but next day they were back up to the mid-twenties and stayed there to the end of the month.

August was a very warm month over all, warmer that July with the mean temperature up by 2 degrees. We had 15 days when the temperature was above 25 degrees, 5 above 30 degrees and only 1 day when the day time temperature never reached 20 degrees. It was another very dry month with 38.4mm of rain. The rain for the year up 31st August was 337.9 that's 29% less rain than the 15 year average and we are not close to the driest area.

We talk about the extreme heat and humidity on these hot days the humidity was low at 26% at the hottest part of the day but by the dawn we were up to 92%, it is difficult for the body distinguish between heat and humidity.
