So Christmas is coming! This year has certainly been a rather odd one. Having got through the worst of the coronavirus pandemic, I think most of us were hoping for less stressful times; but we have seen the war in Ukraine, difficult rises in the cost of living, governmental instability, as well as the passing of our much-loved Queen. It has been a testing year for many, and I hope and pray for better times ahead. As a church we continue to support our local foodbank, to pray for all those in Ukraine and to pray for those struggling with tight finances. To help, a number of places in our villages are offering spaces for warm hubs during the day – please do look at local information for more about these.

It is something of a comfort to me to remember that Jesus was born into a world that was equally stressful. Politically, the region of the Holy Land had been conquered by the Romans and the Jewish people had been subjugated, ruled by a weak vassal state that paid tributes to the Roman occupiers. Socially, the influence of Greek culture was growing among those living in the Holy Land, which some saw a threat to Jewish identity. And religiously, within the Jewish community there were tensions between different factions, each seeking to win over the local Jewish population to their way of doing things. So, when Jesus was born in that stable all those years ago, tensions were high, and there was likely to be a sense of deep unease and anxiety. However, there was also a great sense of hope for the coming of the Messiah, who would come and free the Jewish people from their oppressors and usher in a new era of peace and prosperity. As it says in the prophecy of Isaiah, "For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isa 9:6).

Jesus is the Prince of Peace born into a world that was full of anxiety and he brought calm. He gives us hope for a better world. The peace which Jesus brings is something that Jesus continues to share with us. Jesus wants us to feel safe and secure in the knowledge of his unending love for us, and he is with us and shares with us all our fears, our anxieties, as well as all our joys and celebrations. The problem for us is that when we are worried or afraid it can sometimes seem hard to find and feel the peace and love that Jesus has for us. At times we need to stop what is that we are doing to allow ourselves the time to find Jesus and the calm that he brings – by sitting silently, through prayer and with patience.

This year *Churches Together* have organized an Advent Trail around the village, with shops, houses and churches putting up Christmas carol themed displays. Each display will also show a small picture of the baby Jesus – do take the time to try and find the baby Jesus in each display! I hope that that you are able to take part and get a chance

to wander through our beautiful villages and find the baby Jesus, not just in the displays on show in the windows, but in your own lives too. I pray that at this time of Advent, and especially when Christmas eventually comes, you may all be able to feel the love of the Prince of Peace.

I wish you all a happy and holy Christmas, filled with the joy of the Christ-child.

### Improvements to the Children's Play Area on Edlesborough Green

EPC is pleased to inform parishioners that following the site visit the Planning Inspectorate has granted permission for EPC to progress with the installation of new play equipment on Edlesborough Green. In his report the Inspector concluded "that the proposed works are beneficial to the neighbourhood and that there are no issues of public interest preventing consent being given." EPC will now look to progressing to the next stage of the project.

#### MVAS

Unfortunately EPC continue to experience difficulties acquiring the required licence from Buckinghamshire Council to install the required supporting poles for the new Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (MVAS) within the parish.

The purpose of these signs is to remind drivers of the speed limit and to encourage them to reduce their speed through our villages. Data collected by the signs can also be used as evidence for other traffic calming measures.

#### South End Lane, Northall – 20mph Project

EPC is currently trialling the BC scheme for implementing a 20mph zone on South End Lane, Northall.

A recent speed survey confirmed that the road met the requirements as set out by BC to progress to the next stage of the application:

- A very significant proportion (41%) of vehicle movements exceed 20 mph adjacent to the Play Area entrance. This justifies installation of 20 mph signs.
- The average speed is below 24 mph and therefore no additional traffic calming







measures beyond installation of 20 mph signs will be necessary.

Our BC Councillors Chris Poll, Peter Brazier and Derek Town support EPC's application and EPC agreed to fund 50% of the costs as set out in the original application guidance. EPC will now submit a formal letter of application for the implementation of a 20mph speed limit on the road.

#### **Edlesborough Pavilion**

ECSC Trustees believe that the village now has somewhere to meet your friends and perhaps share a drink and good food, and hope that every inhabitant shares that belief. The ECSC Trustees wish to remind parishioners that the pavilion is operated by a charity. It is run in conjunction with village sports, and other clubs with the purpose of furthering the objectives of the charity, including education and the improvement of social & mental well-being.

In light of this they would like to remind everyone that the pavilion is available to all registered members to come and enjoy the warm and cosy club and meeting rooms, hopefully sharing the company of friends, both old and new, and partaking of all that the pavilion has to offer. They are planning to hold further events, for the enjoyment of all their members.



### Christmas Nachos

#### By Cassie Best

## Try this clever way to use up your Christmas leftovers.

#### Ingredients

1 red onion, halved and thinly sliced 1 lime, juiced, pinch of sugar 4 sausages, 6 rashers streaky bacon 200g tortilla chips 200g cooked chicken or turkey, chopped

100g cranberry sauce

150g melty cheese, use anything from the cheeseboard such as cheddar, brie, red leicester or stilton

1 tsp olive oil

small bunch of sage, leaves picked

#### Method

**Step 1** - Mix the onion, lime juice, sugar and a generous pinch of salt in a small bowl. Set aside.

**Step 2** - Heat the grill to medium-high and line a large baking tray with foil. Squeeze the sausagemeat from its skin and roll into small meatballs, you should get 5-6 per sausage. Arrange over the tray and grill for 8-10 mins, turning halfway through cooking, until browned and cooked through. Tip into a dish and set aside.

**Step 3** - Arrange the bacon on the same baking tray and grill until



crisp, about 5 mins on each side. Remove to a plate and leave to cool. Turn off the grill and set the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6.

**Step 4** - Pour away any juice or fat from the tray, but don't worry about washing it. Spread half the tortilla chips over the tray. Top with half the sausage balls, half the turkey, a few blobs of cranberry sauce and half the cheese. Scatter the rest of the tortilla chips, sausage, turkey, sauce and cheese on top then bake for 15 mins, until the cheese has melted.

**Step 5** - Meanwhile, heat the oil in a pan over a medium-high heat and fry the sage leaves until crisp. Serve the nachos scattered with the pickled red onions, fried sage leaves and crumbled crispy bacon.

## Christmas Grinkle Cookies

#### Ingredients

60g cocoa powder, sieved

200g caster sugar 60ml vegetable oil 2 large eggs 180g plain flour 1 tsp baking powder 2 oranges, zested 2 tsp mixed spice 1 tsp cinnamon 50g icing sugar

#### Method



**Step 1** - Mix the cocoa, caster sugar and oil together. Add the eggs one at a time, whisking until fully combined.

orange zest, mixed spice, cinnamon and a pinch of salt in a separate bowl, then add to the cocoa mixture and mix until a soft dough forms. If it feels too soft, put in the fridge to chill for 1 hr.

**Step 3 -** Heat the oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5 and tip the icing sugar into a shallow dish. Roll heaped teaspoons of the dough into balls (about 20g each), then roll in the icing sugar to coat. Put the balls on one large or two medium baking trays lined with baking parchment, ensuring they're evenly spaced apart.

**Step 4** - Bake on the middle rack of the oven for 10 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool – they will firm up as they cool, but still be fudgy in the centre. Will keep for up to four days in an airtight container.



I have made a Christmas Garland to hang on my front door every year for forty years. The idea was given to me by Sue Parker, who lives in Edlesborough. Originally, Sue wrote an article for Focus, which I kept for many years but can't find now.

#### Materials

1 potato weight about 200g (a bigger potato will make a bigger garland). This supplies moisture to the greenery

A piece of aluminium foil to wrap the potato

A small net bag, the sort lemons and other fruit are sold in

Ribbon





Evergreens such as holly, ivy, laurel, pine, herbs and yew

Baubles, bells and artificial flowers

A skewer or pointed tool to make holes in the potato Secateurs or sharp scissors

#### Florists' wire

#### Instructions

Wrap the potato in the aluminium foil and put it in the net bag. Tie the bag with a piece of ribbon. The garland will hang from this ribbon so it needs to be long enough to attach to the door (when my garland is finished I attach the ribbon to the top surface of the door with drawing pins).

Put the potato on a flat surface. Using the skewer to

make holes, stick 4 large pieces of greenery into the potato to give the approximate size of the finished garland (top, bottom and sides). Fill in the sides and front with more greenery, cutting to size as necessary, enough to hide the aluminium foil.

You can then add your decorations -a big bow of ribbon, attached to wire which will go into the potato, bells and baubles, also wired, and artificial flowers. Use odd numbers i.e. 3s or 5s.

Other suggestions are feathers, sprays of berries and splashes of white paint.

You now have a unique, eco-friendly decoration to grace your door! Sally Taylor



The Old Forge 1905 & 2008

The Old Forge was, of course, formerly a blacksmith's premises. In 1915 it formed part of Pedley Settled Estates. Originally it was probably part of the Manor of Eaton Bray. When Pedley Settled Estates were auctioned by the executors of Arthur Macnamara in 1915 the sale particulars described The Old Forge as follows:

#### LOT 4 A FREEHOLD SMITHY

In the Village of Eaton Bray, adjoining Lot 3 [Comp Farm], and including

#### A brick and Slated Two-Storied Dwelling House

Situate facing the Market Place, and containing Four Bed Rooms, Sitting Room, Kitchen and Scullery, with Showing Shop under one end, and

#### Brick and Tiled Forge

adjoining together with a

#### Good Garden and a Grass Orchard

Having Frontages to the Market Place and Comp Road, and comprising in all about

#### 1a. Or. 19p.

And being Part No. 133 on Plan.

Let to Mr. George Brown on a Yearly (Michaelmas) tenancy, at the rent of

#### £22 10s. per annum.

The particulars are annotated at the rear and note that George Brown bought the place for £315. Directories for Eaton Bray were not published every year but every few years until 1940. Kelly's Directory for the county lists Brown as a blacksmith in Eaton Bray between 1898 and 1940. William Brown is listed in earlier directories, which are not Kelly's, of 1847, 1853, 1854, 1862, 1864, 1869 and 1871.

The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. Eaton Bray, like much of the county, was assessed in 1927. The valuer visiting 3 Market Place recorded that it comprised a living room, two sculleries and three bedrooms above. He commented: "good house" as well as "bedroom over trap shed" and "Double front". The smithy measured 12 feet by 16 feet and 4 feet 6 inches by 5 feet 6 inches; a shoeing shop was 16 feet by 17 feet 6 inches. There was also a brick and slate trap shed adjoining the house, a weather-boarded and tiled store shed ("used hens"), a weather-boarded and corrugated iron store shed in the orchard and a weather-boarded and tiled hen house. The valuer summed up: "Useful place in Eaton Bray".

In him the light of God "shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood (or overcome) it". (John 1 v 9)


I don't know about you, but there seems to me to be much darkness in the life of the


In a fascinating, wide ranging and very amusing talk he led us in an overview of Henry's marriages, his quest for legitimate male heirs and political and religious allies. After Anne Boleyn had given birth to the future Elizabeth I but subsequently failed to deliver a male heir she was beheaded. Within 24 hours of Anne's death Henry and Jane Seymour were betrothed. It is worth noting that in those times betrothed meant living together not marriage and Jane was never crowned. Despite this, after the birth of Edward in October 1537 Henry described her as his 'one true wife'. She died – possibly of sepsis – 12 days after the birth. Henry gave her a queen's funeral and she is buried in his tomb in Windsor.

Two years elapsed before Henry married for the fourth time. Thomas Cromwell decided he needed a wife and a royal court needs a queen. Anne of Cleves was born

in Dusseldorf and fulfilled a preferred political alliance Northern with Europe. Alas, a combination of their mutual dislike for each other; Henry is alleged to have said – "I like her not! I like her not!" and his apparent inability to consummate the union resulted in the marriage being annulled after six months. She was undoubtedly humiliated but retained her head and received a generous financial settlement.

The evening concluded with refreshments and many people commenting they wished Dr Henderson had taught them history at school!








### Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)

#### Weather Conditions for October 2022 Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West

I am pleased to report that in October we, at long last, had some proper rain. But it still wasn't enough. The month started mild, becoming unsettled in the second week with the night temperature dropping to 1.8°c on the 9th and 11th, while day time temperatures consistently stayed just below 18°c. For the rest of the month, we recorded rain almost every day, even if it was just drizzle, with plenty of sunny periods. As we came to the last week of the month, the temperatures started to rise and reached an unseasonably warm 20.9°c on the 29th. The wettest day was the 23rd with 32.41mm (1.3ins) of rain, contributing to a month total of 102.5mm, which is the average for October. The plot below shows the daytime temperature kept stable for all of the month, which was much higher than would normally be expected.

Dear Residents,

With the darker nights drawing in, we historically see an increase in Burglaries at this time of year. With this in mind, we would like to take the time to offer you some security advice.

- If you are leaving your home during the hours of darkness, please leave a light on. We recommend using a light timer switch, along with a low energy bulb in a lamp, which can be set to come on and go off at a time which suits you. This makes it appear that someone is home. Burglars are usually opportunists and patrol areas. So don't let your home be their target.
- If you are going away, ask a neighbour to use your driveway if it is going to be vacant. This makes it appear that someone is coming and going.
- If you buy high value items, or you receive any for Christmas, don't leave the empty boxes outside your home as this advertises what you have inside your property.
- Make sure you key lock your door, not just pull it shut.
- If you have an alarm, ensure it is set when you are not in your property.
- Consider installing CCTV.
- We recommend installing sensor security lights which come on when someone walks onto your property.
- If you have a keyless vehicle, please ensure the key is kept in a signal blocking box or pouch.
- Be vigilant. If you note a suspicious person or vehicle, report it. It may seem like a small piece of information, however it may be the missing piece of our jigsaw.
