Recently I visited the National Gallery exhibition about St Francis of Assisi. It explores how he has been perceived and represented over the centuries, and how he still remains relevant today. Exhibits include paintings, sculptures, altarpieces, letters and his habit. There is even a Marvel comic book, 'Francis, brother of the universe' released in 1980. Francis was born in Assisi, central Italy in 1182, the son of a wealthy cloth merchant. During military service he was captured and imprisoned, a deeply affecting experience. He returned home with new priorities. Francis sold a bale of silk from his father's warehouse to pay for repairs to St Damian's, a semi derelict church. His father was outraged; there was a public confrontation and his father disowned and disinherited him. Legend has it that Francis took off his expensive clothes and walked away naked.

Having rejected his father's wealth, his consuming passion for Jesus led Francis to adopt a life of absolute poverty. Francis lodged with the priest of St Damian's church and scoured nearby fields for stones to make repairs. He worked as a day labourer in return for food. Soon a few companions joined him. He prepared a simple gospel-based rule for them to live by. In 1210 Pope Innocent III approved the Order of Friars Minor, known as the Franciscans. Francis and his companions had no money or property. They helped lepers and shared a life of deep devotion to Jesus through their preaching. Franciscans lived on alms or undertook simple labour in return for food and other essentials. The vows of poverty, chastity and obedience were at the core of the Franciscan way of life.

In 1219, Francis went to the Holy Land to meet soldiers on the fifth crusade. He also met with the Sultan of Egypt, Malek-al-Kamil who was deeply impressed by Francis' commitment to the Christian faith and the courtesy with which he treated Muslims. The result was that the Franciscans were given custody of the Christian shrines in the Holy Land.

On his return to Italy, Francis found the Franciscan order was becoming a victim of its own success. Many people were deeply attracted to Francis and his sense of joy, abandonment and freedom. What they overlooked was that this joyful freedom stemmed from his willingness to give up everything and accept total poverty. That included dirt, cold, hunger, and lepers with sores and a real danger of infection. In 1220 Francis resigned as minister-general of the Order and the rule was modified. The Franciscans eventually split into the Conventual Franciscans, who held a limited amount of property in common, and the Spiritual Franciscans, who had no property. The order today is called the Society of St Francis (SSF). Following St Francis, they have a commitment to issues of justice, peace and the integrity of creation and they

care for the poor and marginalised. When I was studying for the ministry, I had to spend a few days in London. With little money, I couldn't afford anywhere to stay. So a friend invited me to the House of the Divine Compassion in Plaistow, East London. There, the brothers welcomed everyone free of charge. My friend often stayed there in the holidays. But he did warn me that he sometimes came away with fleas!

St Francis is the patron saint of animals and ecology because of his care for creation and his love for all animals. In the exhibition, there are pictures by Giotto (c.1300) and Andrea Buttner (2010) of him preaching to the birds. His hymn 'Canticle of the Sun' is represented in painting and film. Pope Francis wrote in his second encyclical: 'In the words of this beautiful canticle, Saint Francis of Assisi reminds us that our common home is like a sister with whom we share our life and a beautiful mother who opens her arms to embrace us...This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have

inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of the goods with which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will.'

As we enjoy the summer, may we be mindful of our need to care for all creation.

Almost one hundred years ago a derelict farm on the Dunstable Downs was purchased by ZSL for £13,480 (12s 10d). A pair of pygmy hippos became an instant favourite when it first opened in 1931 and helped immediately attract thousands of visitors from across the country.

As Europe's first 'open zoo' to be easily accessible to the visiting public, it became a unique centre for bringing people closer to nature. Some of the earliest animals included wombats, wolves and American bison.



Today it continues to inspire a lifelong love of animals and remain the UK's largest Zoo. While from our aquarium to our rolling elephant paddocks, we're spearheading wildlife conservation to restore wildlife everywhere.

Healthy Bones & Pikites



The best time to build healthy bones is when you are young – exercise such as jumping and skipping in you teenage years can help promote denser bones and prevent fractures when you are older. (So get your children/grandchildren off their PlayStations and get moving!)

The bad news – our bone density continues to grow until our mid 20's, however, after the age of 35, and following the menopause in women, the pattern changes. 1 in 3 women and 1 in 5 men over the age of 50 will develop Osteopenic (loss of bone) fractures.

The good news – although ideally we would have looked after our bones in our teenage years, we can make a change for the better:

- 1. Eat a varied diet rich in calcium dairy products, tofu and spinach are all good.
- **2. Reduce your caffeine and salt and stop smoking** as all of these can interfere with the absorption of calcium in our bodies.
- **3. Take up Pilates**, the mind-body conditioning programme, can be used to strengthen your core (back and tummy) muscles and can also be adapted to do in standing to help 'load' the bones. Pilates can also help with balance and transferring weight to help avoid falls and potential fractures.
- **4. Be active** load bearing exercises such as walking, running, golf or tennis can help.

Hidden in Plain Sight

We had a funny experience in December. You will remember the snow that settled and stayed frozen for at least 10 days. The view over the fields and the distant hillside from our bedroom window was amazing. Hidden was all the landscape apart from the shapes. We could see the trains moving on the distant railway, everything else was still and white. Then when, the snow and ice eventually melted a large white patch remained. At first, we thought it was just the shade but it didn't disappear. A search with binoculars suggested a large white horticultural greenhouse had been erected. Further investigation was needed as whatever was there, was still growing. We could see more "greenhouses",

funny pointed roofs and places where scaffolding was going up. This continued for the next couple of months and there are now about 10 or 12 cranes all at work daily, often with suspended bright lights. Closer site inspection and online searches since has established they had built a temporary film lot and are now in the process making 2 new episodes of the film – "Wicked". These, a prequel to the "The Wizard of Oz", included the "Yellow Brick Road", a quaint medieval village and a huge palace. It will be interesting to see the completed result. This got me thinking, though it may be right under our nose, we may not always see. Do we only believe when we see for ourselves? Thomas has been called Doubting Thomas as, after Jesus' death, he couldn't believe what the excited disciples were telling him – that Jesus was alive. Jesus had explained it all to them but the expression 'seeing is believing' made it all seem true. Jesus had told the disciples, that the 'secrets of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you but not to them'.

Jesus quoted Isaiah 'Go and tell this people: Be ever hearing, but never understanding; be ever seeing, but never perceiving.'

The same message was given to Ezekiel and by the Apostle Paul in Acts 28.

Why don't we know and understand the message that comes from God, via Jesus, the prophets and the Apostles? It takes faith to believe what you don't see. Just as the real explanation was growing before our eyes, we needed to do some further investigations to make sense of what was going on across the fields. Our reading last Sunday was from Zechariah 4 'not by might, not by power but by my Spirit says the Lord Almighty'. God's Spirit is here with us, we just need to look and see and understand. Jesus is alive, loves us and wants us to love him too.

Our Sunday services, in our Chapel Lane Church start at 11 am. We'd love you to join us for our worship and song. You will get a warm welcome. For those unable to attend in person we also stream our services.

Policy statement regarding casual use of Edlesborough Green by parishioners

In order to protect and preserve Edlesborough Green (the Green) for the benefit and enjoyment of present and future parishioners, Edlesborough Parish Council (the Council) has adopted the following policy regarding casual use of the Green by parishioners.

The Green is owned and managed by the Council. The Council is therefore the final arbiter of what can and cannot take place on the Green.

All parishioners are entitled to free use of the Green for leisure and recreation purposes with the exception of the tennis courts and the Pavilion as noted below.

Exclusive leases

The tennis courts are exclusively leased by Edlesborough Tennis Club (the Tennis Club), but all parishioners are eligible to join the Tennis Club. The Pavilion together with its environs is exclusively leased by Edlesborough Community Sports Club (ECSC), and all parishioners over the age of 18 are eligible for free membership of ECSC.

Use by Sports Clubs

The Council authorise various local sports clubs to hold competitive games on the Green. Those clubs are required to make a financial contribution towards the upkeep of the Green and their use is governed by a separate policy statement which can be seen on the Council website. The clubs are entitled to exclusive use of whichever pitch or pitches that they require for the duration of the game(s) and training sessions. The pitches are accessible by parishioners except when a games or training sessions are in progress.

Casual Use by Parishioners

Whilst the Green is available to all parishioners for leisure purposes except as described above, they are required to avoid any activities that might damage the surface of the Green or might compromise other peoples' enjoyment of the Green. In particular the surface of the various sports pitches must be respected, especially the cricket wicket and football goal mouths. A copy of the Bylaws is available on the Council website. Dogs must be kept under control, preferably on a lead, to avoid them interfering with

Dogs must be kept under control, preferably on a lead, to avoid them interfering with other users of the Green. Dog owners must clear up any mess made by their pets. Dog bins are provided on the Green for that purpose.

Group Activities

Any group activities on the Green must have the prior written consent of the Clerk. A fee may be payable for any group activities if it is considered that the organiser may have a commercial interest. Where there is any doubt whether or not an activity is pe

A History of Ashridge House

Our History

Ashridge House's history dates back over 700 years with significant residents such as King Henry VIII, and a storied journey as a wartime hospital and most recently, a world-renowned business school.

1283 - Monastery

The College of Bonhommes monastery is founded by Edmund, Earl of Cornwall in 1283 and flourished as a seat of learning and debate.

1539 - Royal Residence

With the dissolution of monasteries in 1539, Ashridge fell under the ownership of King Henry VIII, who called the Ashridge House home for 11 years. Princess Elizabeth was raised at Ashridge





House during her youth.

1550 - Royal Residence

Ownership of Ashridge is formally transferred to Princess Elizabeth as stipulated in her father's (King Henry VIII's) will. Princess Elizabeth lived here until she was arrested by her sister by Mary in 1554.

1604 – Private House

Sir Thomas Egerton (Queen Elizabeth I's Lord Keeper) buys Ashridge. It becomes home to the Dukes and Earls of Bridgewater for 245 years.

1808 - Private House

The house is almost completely rebuilt by James Wyatt and, following his death, his son Benjamin and nephew Sir Jeffry Wyatville.

1914 - WWI Hospital

Ashridge remained under the ownership of the Bridgewater family during the First World War, when it transformed into a rehabilitation center for St. Albans Hospital.

1929 – Training Centre for the Conservative Party

The house was bought by Urban Hanlon Broughton.

It was used as a training centre for Conservative Party workers to commemorate Andrew Bonar Law, the Prime Minister.

1939 - WWII Hospital

With the start of World War II, the castle became a hospital once again, this time as an extension of the emergency wing of the Charing Cross Road Hospital. Starting in 1940, the hospital treated over 20,000



patients and saw the birth of 2,700 babies in its maternity ward. The concrete overspill wards remain Crown property until 1983 for use as a Public Records Office.

1949 – Ladies Finishing School

Ashridge was converted into a finishing school for ladies called the House of Citizenship. For almost a decade, the school offered four term courses to young women where they learned proper social etiquette and the ins and outs of upper class culture.

1959 — Ashridge Executive Education

Ashridge Management College is established with the support of leading companies including Guinness, Shell and Unilever, and is ranked as one of the best business schools in the world.

2015 — Hult International Business School

Ashridge formed an alliance with the Hult International Business School, combining Ashridge's expertise in executive research and development with Hult's global reach, innovation and scale.

Today

Ashridge House is an award-winning venue for conferences, weddings, and events, and continues to operate as the main campus for Hult International Business School executive education programs.



Wellingtonia Avenue & Rhododendron Walk

The avenue of Wellingtonias was planted in 1858 on the axis with the house and has as its focal point the prospect mound believed to date from Tudor times.

Liming Orenies

One glorious summer evening in early June, Paul Wright led a small group of us to look for orchids at Totternhoe. We started in the knolls area and spent some time hunting Kidney Vetch and the minute, fragile Small Blue butterflies which feed on it and lay their eggs within the flowers. Later we walked to the damp meadows at the foot of Castle Hill and found healthy





colonies of Yellow Rattle which reduces grass growth and allows orchids to thrive. Sure enough, among meadow foliage we found the gem-like orchids, not only Common Spotted ones and Pyramidal Orchids but also the much rarer Man Orchids which resemble tiny hooded figures, the rather similar Common Twayblade Orchids and the utterly charming Bee Orchids

St. Mary's Wildlife Garden

A corner of the churchyard, next to the Village Hall, in Eaton Bray has been set aside as a wildlife area. The grass will not be cut until August to allow wild flowers to grow and give cover for wildlife. The habitat to encourage wildlife includes bird boxes, bat boxes, a hedgehog house, insect hotel, logs and a Dead Hedge. The Dead Hedge has been completed with the enthusiastic help of the Beavers. The Beavers also helped to create the wood chipping pathways which are wide enough for people to walk 2 abreast and give access to wheelchair users. The area includes a patch of nettles. Some Butterflies, including red Admirals, Peacocks, Painted Ladies and Commas lay their eggs on nettle leaves.

The native hedge planted last year, donated by the Woodland Trust, between the Churchyard and the entrance to the Village Hall, is growing well and has been underplanted with comfrey, feverfew and daffodils. Some of the small wildflowers which are growing there have been

left to spread.

St Mary's has already achieved an Eco Church Bronze Award and we are now working towards a Silver Award. One part of the award is for managing the closed Churchyard. The Churchyard was closed for new burials many years ago and is maintained by the Parish Council. The Church and the Parish Council are working together to create an area which is attractive to wild life but safe and accessible for people to use and maintain.

<u>Down the Lane</u>


2023 will be remembered as the year of an abundance of roses. Driving round the country, I have been amazed at the displays in people's gardens. I didn't manage to prune some of my roses but they are covered in buds and just beginning to bloom. Now the dog roses in the hedgerows are taking their turn!

All my bulbs seem to have done well this year and especially the alliums which are gradually seeding

themselves. These include Allium Christophii, known as the Star of Persia, and Nectaroscordum, also called



species of alliums, below. The other plants which have

done amazingly well are clematises. My Clematis Montana, the rampant clematis, was badly frosted

but there is a lot of new growth from the bottom which I can tie in and cut out all the dead wood. It had got top heavy so will look much tidier next year and will flower again.

It is going to be a good year for soft fruits. I grow red and black currants, summer and autumn

raspberries and I have a standard gooseberry bush. The gooseberries are much easier to pick than from a traditional bush as I don't have to bend down and get tangled in all the vicious thorns. I think that was an idea I picked up from Monty Don. You can also buy standard versions of currant bushes. They have the advantage of taking up less space in the garden. I'm now waiting for some rain to plant some annuals and perennials. They are much easier to look after in their pots and trays than in the flower beds!

Coconut & Squash Dhansak

By Cassie Best, courtesy of bbcgoodfood.com

Ingredients

1 tbsp vegetable oil

500g butternut squash (about 1 small squash), peeled and chopped into bite-sized chunks (or buy a pack of ready-prepared

to save time)

100g frozen chopped onions

4 heaped tbsp mild curry paste (we used korma)

400g can chopped tomatoes

400g can light coconut milk mini naan bread, to serve

400g can lentils, drained

200g bag baby spinach

150ml coconut yogurt (we used Rachel's Organic), plus extra to serve

Method

Step 1 - Heat the oil in a large pan. Put the



squash in a bowl with a splash of water. Cover with cling film and microwave on High for 10 mins or until tender. Meanwhile, add the onions to the hot oil and cook for a few mins until soft. Add the curry paste, tomatoes and coconut milk,

and simmer for 10 mins until thickened to a rich sauce.

Step 2 - Warm the naan breads in a low oven or in the toaster. Drain any liquid from the squash, then add to the sauce with the lentils, spinach and some seasoning. Simmer for a further 2-3 mins to wilt the spinach, then stir in the coconut yogurt. Serve with the warm naan and a dollop of extra yogurt.

Quick Cheat's Strawberry Mousse

Ingredients

500g strawberries, hulled and halved, any larger ones quartered

1 lemon, zested and juiced

100g caster sugar

150ml mascarpone

300ml double cream

1 tbsp vanilla bean paste To serve

4 gingernut biscuits, crushed

small handful of pistachios, roughly chopped (optional)

freeze-dried strawberries, crushed (optional)

Method

Step 1 - Put the strawberries, lemon juice, sugar and 2 tbsp water in a large pan over a medium heat and cook for 5 mins until the fruit has softened. Scrape into a bowl leave to cool. Tip 300g of the mixture into a blender (reserve the rest for later), blitz until



smooth and sieve into a jug.

Step 2 - Whisk the mascarpone in a large bowl to soften, then add the double cream, vanilla bean paste and lemon zest, and whisk again until just starting to thicken. Fold in the blitzed.

sieved strawberry purée to combine – it will thicken a bit more. Alternatively, swirl it through so you have layers of compote going through the mousse. Will keep chilled for up to a day.

Step 3 - Spoon or pipe the mousse into glass tumblers and top with the reserved strawberry compote, the gingernut crumbs, pistachios and dried strawberries, if you like.

Geolfa Payne-Gaposonkin

The Wendover born lady who discovered what the universe is made of

Cecilia Payne was born in wendover in 1900. Her father died when she was 4 and the family moved to London when she was 12. Cecilia attended St Mary's College, Paddington, where she was unable to study much mathematics or science, but in 1918 changed schools for St Paul's Girls' School where she chose to focus on science. The following year she won a scholarship at Newnham College, Cambridge University. Her interest in astronomy began after she attended a lecture by Arthur Eddington on his 1919 expedition to the island of Príncipe in the Gulf of Guinea off the west coast of Africa to observe and photograph the stars near a solar eclipse as a test of Albert Einstein's general theory of relativity. Cambridge University would not give her a degree because she was a woman, so she moved to the United States to work on a graduate program in astronomy at Harvard.



Cecilia Payne was the first person ever to earn a Ph.D. in astronomy from Radcliffe College, with what Otto Strauve called "the most brilliant Ph.D. thesis ever written in astronomy."

Not only did Cecilia Payne discover what the universe is made of, she also discovered what the sun is made of (Henry Norris Russell, a fellow astronomer, is usually given credit for discovering that the sun's composition is different from the Earth's, but he came to his conclusions four years later than Payne). Cecilia Payne is the reason we know anything about variable stars (stars whose

brightness as seen from earth fluctuates). Literally every other study on variable stars is based on her work. Cecilia Payne was the first woman to be promoted to full professor from within Harvard, and is often credited with breaking the glass ceiling for women in the Harvard science department and in astronomy, as well as inspiring entire generations of women to take up science.

Cecilia Payne became a US citizen in 1931, married Russian-born astrophysicist Sergei I. Gaposchkin in 1934, had three children and died in 1979.

What to do in the Carden in July

July brings long, warm days that • continue late into the evening — perfect for pottering in the garden after work, hosting barbecues, and enjoying your beds and borders as they reach their peak.

Timely tips

- Summer can still throw out a few surprises - make sure tall plants and climbers are well supported in case of bad weather.
- 2. Water at dusk to reduce evaporation and use mulch to retain moisture around plants.
- 3. Terracotta pots are prone to evaporation so dampen the pot down to keep roots inside cool and damp.
- 4. Regularly deadhead bedding and perennial plants to encourage new blooms for as long as possible.

In the flower garden

- Cut back faded perennial plants to keep borders tidy.
- As your penstemon flowers fade, cut them back to just above a bud to encourage more flowers.
- Cutting back growth in hanging baskets can encourage new flowers and foliage and will revive the display. Make sure you feed your baskets well after doing this.
- Cut back hardy geraniums and delphiniums after the first flush of flowers to encourage new growth and further blooms.
- Keep an eye on your newly-bloomed hydrangeas for hydrangea scale - a sap-sucking insect that can affect growth. Read our dedicated scale insects pest & diseases page to learn more.
- Continue to tie in and train new growth on climbing plants.

- Prune wisteria now. Just remove the whippy side-shoots from the main branch framework to about 20cm from their base (about five leaves from the main stem).
- Prune lupins to encourage more flowers.
- If you need to prune your deciduous magnolia, now's the best time to do it.
- Divide clumps of bearded Iris so they have time to form roots and flower buds for next year before the cold weather arrives.
- Take cuttings from your favourite tender plants for overwintering indoors. Cuttings can also still be taken from shrubs and border perennials.
- Deadhead bedding plants and perennial plants to stop them selfseeding and to encourage further flowering.
- Deadhead your roses to keep them looking tidy. Leave the flowers in place if your rose produces attractive hips (seed pods).
- Deadhead sweet peas regularly to keep them blooming. Water daily in dry weather.
- Capture seed heads from dandelions and other weeds. Collect them before they get a chance to release their seeds and spread throughout your garden.
- Keep an eye out for pests on plants, early treatment is best.
- Stop rust damaging hollyhock foliage by pruning out affected leaves and/or spraying with a fungicide.
- Look out for clematis wilt. Symptoms include wilting leaves and black discolouration on the leaves and stems. Cut out all affected material and dispose of it in your household waste.

In the vegetable garden

- Pepper plants will benefit from being potted on into progressively larger pots.
- Train cucumber stems upwards to make the most of the space available. Simply tie in their long stems to vertical wires or use cane supports to create a wigwam of poles.
- If you're growing aubergines, pinch out the growing tip once they have 5 or 6 fruits. Pick fruits while they are young. You can expect to start harvesting mid to late summer.
- Nip off the growing tips of squash and courgette plants to encourage branching.
- Pinch out tomato side shoots each week. Cut off any leaves growing below the lowest ripening fruit trusses to improve air circulation and prevent diseases.
- Boost your tomato crop by regularly feeding plants with dilute tomato fertiliser once a week. If leaves look
 pale and yellow, feed more regularly.
- Feed crops with a general purpose fertiliser.
- Apply a high-potash fertiliser once fruits start to form on peppers, cucumber and tomatoes. You can use this on sunflowers too.
- Harvest garlic when the tops start to bend over and yellow.
- Pick your courgettes while they're young. Regular picking encourages more fruit.
- Encourage more marrows by harvesting regularly. Marrows that form in July and August should reach a good size by autumn. Let their skins harden in the sun before cutting them later in September or October. They can be stored into winter.
- · Pick, dry and freeze herbs for using

- later in the year.
- Pick runner beans regularly to prevent them becoming stringy and to make room for developing pods. Leaving mature pods on the plant can prevent further flowers forming and reduce your crop.
- Harvest beetroot, peas, carrots, chard, potatoes, salad leaves, lettuce, and tomatoes this month.
- Resist the temptation to harvest more rhubarb stems. Leave the stems in place; this will allow the plant to build up reserves for next year.
- Water your fruit and vegetable crops daily in warm weather. Try to ensure that they're consistently moist.
- Use grass clippings as a mulch around potato plants to stop tubers near the surface from turning green. Alternatively earth up your potato plants as they grow. If you're growing potatoes in bags, gradually add more compost until the bag is full.
- Control slugs to prevent them damaging your crops. Try using a natural pest control to reduce numbers.
- Tackle blackfly on broad beans by pinching off any affected growing tips.
- Check for cabbage white butterfly eggs under brassica leaves and squash any that you find.
- Clear away any diseased and spent foliage on and around your vegetable plants to keep them healthy.
- Clear weeds regularly, as they compete with your crops for nutrients and water.





The Victoria Arms Beerhouse Eaton Bray

The Victoria Arms Beerhouse (also the Victoria and the Victory) 25 Bower Lane, Eaton Bray

The countywide licensing register of 1876 states that the Victoria Arms was first licensed in 1867. In 1876 the beerhouse owner was Isaac Edwards of Saint Albans [Hertfordshire] who leased the property to John Edwards of Redborn [Hertfordshire]. John may, in fact, have been Isaac's manager as the Edwards family had had a brewery in Redborn since at least 1866. The brewery was taken over by Dunstable brewer Benjamin Bennett in 1882.

The countywide register of 1891 states that Jabez Fountain was the owner and that he leased the property to Benjamin Bennett. Fountain was a former publican himself (The Hope and Anchor from 1884 to 1886) and seems to have taken over behind the bar at the Victory (as it is called in petty sessional licensing registers, though not the countywide registers, from 1877 onwards) or Victoria Arms in 1894 and 1895. Perhaps he bought the property from Isaac Edwards about the time Edwards' brewery was sold to Benjamin Bennett and decided to lease the property to the new owner.

The countywide licensing register of 1903 gives a new owner - J. Pearce, and a new tenant Adey & White of Saint Albans. The beerhouse is described as: "clean and in good repair, sanitary arrangements not satisfactory". The nearest licensed premises was 154 yards away (The Chequers) and the property had two front doors and one at that back.

The beerhouse was one of a number in the south of the county to be closed during World War One. The license was not renewed in February 1916. The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. Eaton Bray, like most of the county, was assessed in 1927. The valuer visiting the former beerhouse, now called Victoria House, found it owned by H. Sharratt and occupied by William Nicholls.

The beerhouse had become a general shop and the tenant paid rent of 7/6 per week. The building comprised two living rooms, of which one was used as the shop, and a cellar ("neglect no window"). Three bedrooms lay above. The valuer noted: "Roof slopes at back" and queried: "Was pub?". Outside stood a brick and slate store with a loft over, the loft being used by the landlord.







New Era for Whipsnade Lions

Whipsnade Zoo has welcomed two young lionesses, Waka and Winta, who moved from Antwerp Zoo earlier this month to their new 'queendom' at the conservation zoo.

The arrival of the 23-monthold African lionesses marks a whole new era for the conservation zoo, as they'll soon be joined by young male Malik to form a new pride for the first time in decades.

Zookeeper Sarah McGregor



said: "The team are excited to have welcomed such young and energetic sisters in Waka and Winta, and are preparing to complete the new pride when 18-month-old male, Malik, joins them next month from Neuwied Zoo in Germany."

"Lions are known as the king and queens of the animal kingdom, and we're sure Waka, Winta and Malik will fast become the king and queens of Whipsnade Zoo – not only will they help educate and inspire our visitors, but we're excited to play such an important part in helping to conserve this important species globally."

Waka, Winta and Malik are part of the European Endangered Breeding Programme (EEP) for the Vulnerable African lion, which ensures there are strong and genetically diverse back up populations of the species in conservation zoos across Europe.

Three quarters of African lion populations are sadly declining in the wild, driven by large-scale habitat conversion, the loss of prey through unsustainable hunting, as well as human/wildlife conflict.

ZSL, the international conservation charity behind Whipsnade Zoo, is working across Africa to save animals on the brink of extinction - as well as those threatened species that could be next.

The team are hoping the new pride's formation will help boost numbers of the iconic species. "It's been 17 years since Whipsnade Zoo last had African lion cubs, so fingers crossed we won't have too long to wait," Sarah added.

Over the next few weeks, zookeepers will get to know Waka and Winta - and their likes and dislikes - while preparing for Malik's arrival.

"We can already see that Waka is very confident and has led the way in investigating their new home in the Dunstable Downs, while her sister Winta is little bit more cautious and has sometimes needed an extra push from her sister to explore everything Whipsnade has to offer," explained Sarah. "The girls have a very strong relationship and love playing in the long grass together - we can't wait to get to know them more as time goes by."

Visitors can see Waka and Winta as they explore their new home at Whipsnade Zoo alongside 10,000 other animals, many of which are threatened in the wild and part of important global breeding programmes. Whipsnade Zoo's Oldest Primate Turns 50



Koko the chimpanzee has celebrated reaching the milestone age of 50 at Whipsnade Zoo.

The conservation zoo's oldest mammal marked her incredible half-century on Sunday 4 June while tucking into a smorgasbord of her favourite foods - including gem lettuces and cherry tomatoes - before playing in the spring sunshine with younger chimps Phil, Grant and Elvis.

Whipsnade Zoo primate keeper Grant Timberlake said Koko still has the energy of a young chimpanzee, despite outliving the average chimp by more than a decade: "Koko might have just turned 50 but she's still in brilliant health, thanks to the dedicated care

of our zookeepers and veterinary team.

"Particularly when she sees her favourite food, it's like she's 20 years young again – climbing and swinging as fast as she can through the trees to reach it," Grant said.

Born at Dudley Zoo, Koko moved to London Zoo when she was nine, before heading to the UK's largest zoo aged 33. 17 years later, Koko has joined the 'Golden Club' at the conservation zoo, alongside Gladys the flamingo - the zoo's oldest animal - who will turn 53 in July.

Grant added that chimpanzees have incredible memories and explained that Koko had lived through some major wildlife milestones while living at ZSL's two conservation Zoos - as well as contributing to an important conservation project for her species.

"In the past 50 years, Extinct-in-the-Wild Pere David's deer from Whipsnade Zoo were successfully reintroduced back to China, the late Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip opened the Centre for Elephant Care at Whipsnade and ZSL camera-traps captured the first ever photos of chimpanzees at Douala-Edea National Park in Cameroon," he said.

"Koko herself has voluntarily contributed to several important conservation project for her species, helping to improve and protect the health of chimpanzees around the world: our veterinary team work closely with the chimpanzees at Whipsnade Zoo, training them to use finger monitors so the team can gather ECG readings, as well as allowing vets to conduct ultrasound examinations on their hearts."

This critically important data is shared with the International Primate Heart Project (IPHP), as well as the Great Ape Heart Project. GAHP is an international organisation working to investigate and understand the issue of cardiovascular disease in great apes. The project works to create a centralised database on great ape heart health, fuelling important research projects, as well as ensuring the primates receive the best possible care at conservation centres around the world.

"Like a lot of humans when they get older, Koko has developed mild arthritis in her hands, but thanks to the care she receives, it hasn't slowed her down at all," Grant added. "Our vet team treat the inflammation with soothing, low level laser treatments — a simple but effective way to help her remain pain-free and fully mobile. We hope to celebrate many more birthdays with Koko at Whipsnade Zoo."
