British Legion Remembrance Service Sunday 12th November 2023 Edlesborough War Memorial 10.45am

CLOSURE OF B440 (MAIN ROAD) FROM NORTHALL TO COCK'S CLOSE (PEBBLEMOOR) JUNCTION AND HIGH STREET EDLESBOROUGH FROM PEBBLEMOOR TO JUNCTION WITH MAIN ROAD.

This year's annual Service of Remembrance will take place at Edlesborough War Memorial at the top of the hill by Edlesborough Church on the Main Road on Sunday 12th November starting at approximately 10.45am. Please come and join us in our Act of Remembrance. The service will last for approximately 30minutes.

In the past, War Memorials were built close to the roadside so that all who passed by would be reminded of the sacrifices made by the local people whose names appear on them. Unfortunately this does not sit well with the levels of traffic which we experience on our roads today and so to enable the many people taking part in the service to stand safely around the War Memorial and to hear clearly, the B440 main road will be closed to traffic for the duration of the service from 10.30am until 11.30am with a diversion for traffic in place from the junction of the B440 main road at Cock's Close towards Pebblemoor, along Pebblemoor and Edlesborough High Street, along Eaton Bray High Street and up Northall Road to join the B440 main road in Northall. Edlesborough High Street will also be closed from the junction with Pebblemoor by the Memorial Hall to the junction with the B440 main road. There will be manned barriers in place closing the roads at junctions and diversion signs in place.

Residents living on Edlesborough High Street above the Memorial Hall and along the closed part of the main road should be aware that it will NOT BE POSSIBLE to access the main road by car at the junction by the Church during the hour of closure. If it is really necessary to use your car at this time, please drive away from the junction towards the nearest point on the diversion route and be aware that you will have to pass through the barrier closing the road and will need to slow down and stop while the barrier is moved by the official marshals to allow you through. There will be at least two official marshals manning the barriers at each of the closure points. These people are volunteers who will be giving up their time to help protect the people attending the service at the Church. Please treat them with respect and courtesy if you need to pass through a barrier.

Notices advising residents living locally about the road closure will have been placed at the closure points for three weeks prior to the closure to make sure that everyone knows about it and can plan to avoid using their car during the hour of closure.

We look forward to your company on Remembrance Sunday.

November comes at a time of year when the leaves are falling, the days are growing shorter and the weather is usually getting colder. Although, as I write this in October we are experiencing some of the warmest October temperatures on record! November is often seen as a time of remembrance. It begins with All Saints' Day on 1st November when the church has traditionally given thanks for the lives of all the many saints who have brightened the world with their good and sometimes quirky lives. The following day, All Souls on 2nd November is when we recall all those who have died and give thanks for their lives.

Bonfire night on November 5th is much less celebrated now than when I was a child. But it marks a significant historical moment in our nation's history. In 1605, Guy Fawkes and his co-conspirators were thwarted in their plot to blow up parliament and to kill King James 1. Gunpowder, which Fawkes and his companions planned to use for destruction, is used instead in fireworks to thrill those watching with spectacular displays.

Remembrance Day, 11th November, falls on a Saturday this year. On Remembrance Sunday, 12th November the focus is on those who've lost their lives in war, serving their country both in the two World Wars and in more recent conflicts. On each of these occasions, we reflect on the past. This year we will meet at the war memorial in Edlesborough to commemorate the fallen in Eaton Bray, Northall and Edlesborough. There will be a separate Act of Remembrance in Dagnall. Both services will begin at 10.45am and you are all invited to attend. The uniformed organisations will be represented and wreaths will be laid by many of the village groups.

On the afternoon of Remembrance Sunday, we will be holding a Memorial Service at St Mary's Eaton Bray at 3pm. This will be an opportunity to gather together to thank God for our departed loved ones, to light a candle and say a prayer. If you would like to attend and to include a name to be read out, please contact me on vicar@stmaryseatonbray.org. uk or via the church website. During the service we will read out the names of all those for whom we have taken funerals, memorial services or interment of ashes services over the past two years, as well as the names of loved ones who have passed away and are on our list. The service will be followed by tea and cakes.

So what is the value of remembering? Sometimes, as we look back, we are in danger of looking through rose-tinted spectacles. The danger is that we see only a selective picture and in comparison, the present seems a complex mix of good and bad. Some people find it easier to live in the past than in the present.

But there is also a danger of living entirely in the present, without ever reflecting on the past. Henry Ford, pioneer of the motor car, told the Chicago Tribune, 'History is more or less bunk. It's tradition. We don't want tradition. We want to live in the present.'

The problem with never looking back is that we're apt to repeat the mistakes of the past. And looking back, reflecting on past errors as well as past successes can enable us to learn the lessons of history and improve things in the present.

As I write the full horror of the unfolding events in Israel/Palestine is being reported in the media. There can never be any excuse for such

That is the way that so many wars have begun. In communities, between nations and regions within nations, and between superpowers, who so often seem to be involved in 'stand offs' or open warfare with one another.

This is not the Christian way, nor the way of any individual of faith. The golden rule of each of the major world religions is that we should not do anything to any other individual that we should not like to have done to us.

If only we could learn how to live, mindful and respectful of one another's different contexts and perspectives. We are, after all unique human beings created by the same loving God, who treasures each one of us the round world over.

Autumn Vegetable Soup with Cheesy Toasts

Prep:10-15 mins, Cook:15-20 mins, Serves 4

Ingredients

1 leek, chopped quite small

2 carrots, chopped quite small

1 garlic clove, finely chopped

1 potato, chopped quite small

1 tbsp finely chopped fresh rosemary

½ tsp sugar

410g can chickpea, drained and rinsed

3 tbsp chopped fresh parsley

2 x cans chopped Italian tomato

425ml/3/4 pint vegetable stock

For the toasts

8 slices of baguette, cut on the diagonal

1 garlic clove, cut in half

50g edam, finely grated

Method

Step 1 - Put the vegetables into a large

saucepan with the garlic, rosemary, stock and sugar. Season well, stir, bring to a simmer and cover. Cook gently for 15 minutes or



until the vegetables are just tender.

Step 2 - Whizz the tomatoes in a food processor or blender until smooth, then tip into the vegetables with the chickpeas and parsley. Gently heat through, stirring now and then.

Step 3 - For the toasts: rub both sides of the bread with the garlic. Grill on one side until golden, turn the bread over, cover with edam and grill until it's bubbling. Serve at once with the piping hot soup.

Autumn Crunchy Crumble

Prep:20 mins, Cook:30 mins, Serves 4

Ingredients

140g plain flour

100g margarine

4 tbsp rolled oats 2-3 tbsp demerara sugar

1 tsp cinnamon

4 eating apples or pears or 6 plums (or a mixture)

handful sultanas, soaked in hot water for 10 mins

1-2 tbsp honey

natural yogurt, ice cream or crème fraîche, to serve

Method

Step 1 - Heat oven to 200°c/180°c fan/gas 6. Sift the flour into a bowl and add the margarine.

Step 2 - Using a fork or your hands, mash together the margarine and flour until it resembles breadcrumbs and there are no remaining lumps of margarine.

Step 3 - Add the oats, sugar, and cinnamon to the flour and margarine mixture.

Step 4 - Core the apple and/or pears, and stone the plums, if using. Chop all the fruit, keeping the skin on for added flavour, vitamins, and minerals, and put in an ovenproof dish in layers.

Step 5 - Drain the sultanas and add to the fruit. Drizzle with the honey.

Step 6 - Sprinkle over the crumble mixture. Bake for 20-30 mins until the crumble topping is golden and the fruit is bubbling. Serve with a large spoonful of natural yogurt, ice cream or crème fraîche.

Computer Scam Warning Fake Pop Up Alerts and Cold Calls

We have seen a spate of people reporting that their computers have been hacked after they have taken action following a disturbing popup alert appearing on their computer. The alerts can be frightening and usually state that the computer is at risk, may be infected or have a serious incident. The message may also state that the computer will be locked, disabled and/or information lost and to immediately make contact via the telephone number supplied although other options such as 'chat' or links may be given.



supplied, although other options such as 'chat' or links may be given. The message may indicate it has originated from Microsoft, Apple or virus protection software. **DO NOT make this call**.



These specific pop up messages are scams and are from people/organisations wanting to access your computer for nefarious or illegal reasons. If contacted, they usually request that you download and install remote access software that allows them to connect to you computer and they then copy user names, passwords, personal data etc. They leave little evidence of their activities and may also install applications onto the computer to monitor your

ongoing activity, to obtain additional information. Sometimes, they install malicious software that stop the computer functioning, e.g. corrupting the computer. Unsolicited phone calls may also be received from scammers purporting to be from reputable organisations such as Microsoft etc. requesting access to your computer. **NEVER continue with the call**.

If you think that you have given a scammer access to your computer:


- If the remote access software is still running, press the disconnect button, if shown
- Shut down your computer
- If the computer will not shut down, hold down the on/off switch until it powers off
- Independently, find a reputable expert to check your computer before using it again
- If you think that user names, passwords, bank, card, personal details may have been copied, contact your bank to change passwords and block your cards and change all your other passwords - Do not use your computer to do this until it has been checked and any malicious software has been removed

When looking for a computer support expert, look independently or get a trusted recommendation.

NEVER use one that contacts you first, e.g. cold call, popup message or email.

Note: Remote access software is used for legitimate purposes and reputable computer support companies may use this method to access customer's computers to resolve problems quickly, minimising costs and avoiding on site visits.

<u> Vine Weevils on Pot Plants</u>

Speaking from experience!

Vine weevils have a notorious reputation for being indiscriminate feeders, targeting a wide range of ornamental plants.

However, it's worth mentioning that they do have preferences for certain plant species. They are particularly attracted to plants with soft, broad leaves and those that thrive in containers or plant pots. Some of the plants that vine weevils often favour include:

Ferns: Many types of ferns are susceptible to vine weevil damage due to their

delicate fronds.

- Primroses and Heucheras: These plants are 2. among the top choices for vine weevils, and they can cause significant harm if left unchecked.
- Fuchsias: Fuchsias are a favorite target due to their 3. lush, green foliage and vibrant blooms.
- Strawberries: Both ornamental edible 4. and strawberries can fall victim to vine weevils.

- Rhododendrons and Azaleas: These evergreen shrubs are susceptible to vine 5. weevil larvae feeding on their roots.
- Lavender: Although known for their hardiness, lavender plants can still be affected, especially when potted.

If you suspect vine weevils in your plant pots, it's crucial to take action promptly to protect your greenery. Here we outline the steps you should follow to deal with this garden menace.

Early identification

The first step in addressing a vine weevil problem is to accurately identify the issue. Signs of an infestation may include notched or irregularly shaped holes in leaves, wilting plants, and the presence of small, brownishblack beetles, especially during the evening hours. By spotting these indicators early, you can prevent further damage to your plants.

Inspect your plants

Carefully inspect your affected plants, including the soil in your plant pots. Vine weevils lay their eggs in the soil, and the larvae feed on plant roots, leading to significant damage. Gently remove the affected plant from its pot, shake off excess soil, and check for the presence of larvae or adult weevils. Dispose of any infested soil carefully.

Biological control

Vine Weevil damage

The Hope and Anchor Public House: 63 Bower Lane, Eaton Bray (courtesy of the Bedfordshire Archives)



The Hope and Anchor was a longstanding licensed premises in Eaton Bray, standing in Bower Lane. The countywide licensing register of 1876 states that the property, then a beerhouse, was first licensed in 1862. The tenant was Richard Fountain, who is listed as a beer retailer in Eaton Bray from at least 1853 in directories, in other words, nine years before the Hope and Anchor was supposedly licensed. This suggests that he was the first licensee and either that he ran a beerhouse in another location before moving to the Hope and Anchor or the date given in 1876 is wrong!

The 1876 register states that the owner was Sarah Simpson of Dunstable. Sarah was the owner of the North Western Brewery in High Street North, Dunstable. Her husband ran the brewery until his death in 1869 and may have been the brewery's founder. Rowland Cutler was Sarah Simpson's manager and is listed as her tenant in the 1876 register. He bought the company the following year but in 1887 he and his partner (taken as such in 1885) Henry Henchman sold out to Leighton Buzzard brewer W. S. Green who was dead within the year and the business was taken over by Dunstable rival Benjamin Bennett who is listed as the owner in the countywide register of 1891.

The countywide register of 1903 still gives the owner as Benjamin Bennett. The beerhouse is described as: "clean and in good repair". It had two front doors and two back doors and was 96 yards from nearest licensed premises.

The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. Like most of the county Eaton Bray was assessed in 1927 and the valuer visiting the Hope and Anchor found it still owned by the trustees of Benjamin Bennett. The tenant, Ann Rollings, paid rent of £5 per annum.

The valuer considered that the beerhouse was a "Poor looking place". The front door was up four steps and the ground floor comprised a tap room, a cellar, a living room, a scullery and a washhouse; three bedrooms lay above. Outside stood a brick and corrugated iron hen house ("was barn") and a two bay open shed. Business was reasonable – forty barrels of beer per year. The valuer noted that there was a good garden and that the property had originally been three cottages. Benjamin Bennett's business was taken over by Whitechapel brewers Mann Crossman and Paulin in 1938. Twenty years later the company merged with Watney, Combe, Reid and Company to form Watney Mann. At some stage the beerhouse received a full licence as a public house – probably in the early 1950s when most Bedfordshire beerhouses seem to have changed to public houses. The former public house has closed and is now the Indian food restaurant, Café Masala.







Spiky Bundle of Joy

A tiny baby porcupette was caught on camera tucking into carrots and tomatoes and exploring its home, following its birth in the early hours of 20 August at Whipsnade Zoo.

"Porcupines are mostly nocturnal, so they usually venture out when the sun starts to set, but thankfully we have night vision cameras which helps us to monitor the prickly mammals even when we're not on the ground," keeper Steve Merrick-White said.



"We suspected mum, Kimya, was pregnant; after being matched with male porcupine Winga in May. And, lo and behold, our keepers had a magical surprise when, 94 days later, we saw Kimya, give birth to the porcupette."

Steve added that the new family are usually resting during the day but are venturing out to forage for tasty treats of vegetables and nuts in the evening and have been spotted by visitors sleeping over at the Zoo's Lookout Lodge.

"We won't know whether the porcupette is male or female until its first vet check up in a few months' time, but the new addition is very bold and sassy. They even wandered over to the meerkat enclosure for a sleepover one night."

As expert foragers and diggers, Cape porcupines are considered 'ecosystem engineers', however increasingly they face threats of habitat destruction and hunting. As well as working to protect threatened species around the world, scientists and conservationists from ZSL, the conservation charity behind Whipsnade Zoo, work with communities to protect and preserve healthy ecosystems.

Hello World

A pair of rare red panda cubs at Whipsnade Zoo have been given their first vet check, as the internationally important twins start to leave their nest box and explore their surroundings for the first time.

Vet Hannah Rowland said the twins, born to Mum Ruby and Dad Nilo in June 2023, were male and female, which was incredibly rare.

"It's extremely unusual to get twin brother and sister red panda cubs, which makes the birth of these cubs even more significant. The pair have been named Alex and Priya."

Hannah and Vet Nurse Karla Berry listened to the three-month-

old twins' hearts and lungs, had a thorough check of the pair's eyes, before keepers helped them to vaccinate and weigh the fluffy red cubs.

"The check-up is a great opportunity to have a thorough look over Alex and Priya before they take off into the sky and start climbing the towering trees on their island at the UK's largest zoo," Karla said.


"Red pandas are endangered, with numbers in the wild continuing to decline. This is why the twins, and their health is so important. When they're older Alex and Priya will join the European Endangered Breeding Programme, to help ensure there is a healthy and genetically diverse back up population of red panda numbers if numbers continue to fall."

Dagnall Weather Station (AONB)

Weather Conditions for September 2023




For the first half of September our weather was being controlled by high pressure, bringing fine, sunny and dry conditions. As it got warmer, it became a heatwave which brought the first summer weather since June. By the 5th, we had reached 30 degrees and continued to exceed 30°C for the next seven consecutive days. The temperature peaked at 33.4°C on the 7th and then dropped back to a pleasant mid-twenties on the 11th for a few days. In the middle of the month, the pressure dropped, as did the temperatures, which brought some wet unsettled autumn weather from the west with very heavy rain at times.

The unusually high temperatures broke many records. Here in Dagnall, the rain was trying to break a record as well. We had a total monthly rainfall of 84mm, which is 147% of the average. The highest rainfall was on the 20th where we recorded 56.2mm (2.2 inches), amounting to 62% of our monthly rain in just one day, and measured a rainfall rate of 74mm (almost 3 inches) per hour.
