MVAS Devices

The three Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (MVAS) devices are now deployed around the Parish. There are 13 approved locations for these devices. The purpose of these signs is to remind drivers of the speed limit and to encourage them



to reduce their speed through our villages. Data collected by the signs can also be used as evidence for other traffic calming measures.

WHEELIE BIN STICKERS

EPC has invested in new wheelie bin stickers which will be distributed to homes on roads where parishioners have raised concerns about speeding.

SPEEDWATCH

What is Speedwatch?

- Speedwatch is a scheme managed by Thames Valley Police (TVP), promoted by Buckinghamshire Council, supported by EPC, and delivered by volunteers.
- Locations for monitoring speed are selected from sites suggested by the community, based on where there is most local concern about speeding traffic, or the impact of speed. These locations must be approved by TVP.
- The location, date, time, speed and registration numbers of speeding vehicles are recorded. This information is shared with TVP.
- Speedwatch operates across the entire TVP area monitoring the speed of vehicles. This means that if a registration is regularly reported to TVP, the information is collated and TVP can then take the following actions:
- Warning letters are sent out by Thames Valley Police to the registered keepers stating that their vehicle has been reported as speeding.
- The first letter is a warning letter. The second is a stronger letter.
- If Speedwatch activity evidences a speed problem, this may result in enforcement by the Police.

For Speedwatch to be effective in our Parish we need more volunteers who are prepared to be trained and are available to spare some time to use the Speedwatch video capture device.

We need your technical skills and knowledge to help us update the equipment and systems in the church. At St Mary's we understand we're custodians of an historic and important building in the community. We're working hard to both maintain the medieval structure and to update its equipment and capability for the



21st century. That means embracing digital technology in all its forms.

The starting point for most of this was getting an internet connection into the building. That's not so easy when there isn't even a phone line. After exploring various options for mobile broadband, even a parabolic beam link, the village hall came to the rescue and we now have a cable connection to the hall's high speed router. This enabled the start of our tech revolution.

We now have a YouTube channel and we regularly live stream services. If you have an interest in live streaming we could use some help!

Another enabling tech is the remote control of smart devices and intelligent systems. Do you have an interest in the internet? We are planning to install a digital addressable lighting system. it will provide programable flexible lighting to suit all the different services and events in church. Could you help us spec and develop some of these smart systems?

We could use some help developing and augmenting our old analogue audio system.

We really need to add a digital input capability so that we can introduce prerecorded music files directly to the audio system.

Maybe we should start thinking about other future tech capabilities. Heating a medieval building is always going to be a challenge, what happens after the gas boiler? Should we investigate ground source or air source heat pumps? Is there a case for solar, with or without battery and inverter?





Dear Friends,

The start of December sees in the season of Advent.

This is a time of preparation, but not only for Christmas. It focuses our thoughts on the coming of Jesus in three ways.

Nigel's Thoughts

His first coming was into the world, as a helpless infant, yet God made man. This we heartily celebrate at Christmas.

Jesus comes to us also in the everyday, he is 'God with us' now and always, in all the rough and tumble, joy and pain of our living. There is no experience that he does not share with us, and he is never absent, though in times of great struggle or sadness we may feel that we experience this.

Our faith also tells us that 'Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again'. This is referring to his final Advent coming at the last day, the day of judgement.

Christmas Buns



By Paul Hollywood

Wake up on Christmas morning to the smell of freshly baked cinnamon buns with Paul Hollywood's wholesome festive recipe. Bake these Christmas buns for the family and freeze them until needed, then defrost and warm through in the oven before generously drizzling with zesty lemon icing. Serves 9

Ingredients

500g strong white flour, plus extra for dusting

7g sachet fast-action dried yeast 300ml milk

40g unsalted butter, softened at room temperature

1 egg

vegetable oil, for greasing

For the filling

25g unsalted butter, melted

75g soft brown sugar

2 tsp ground cinnamon

100g dried cranberries

100g chopped dried apricot

For the glaze

50g caster sugar

For the lemon icing

zest 1 lemon

200g icing sugar

Method

STEP 1 - Put the flour and 1 tsp salt into a large bowl. Make a well in the centre and add the yeast. Meanwhile, warm the milk and butter in a pan until the butter melts and the mixture is lukewarm. Add the milk mixture and egg to the flour mixture and stir until the contents come together as a soft dough (add extra flour if you need to).

STEP 2 - Tip the dough onto a well-floured surface. Knead for 5 mins, adding more flour if necessary, until the dough is smooth, elastic and no longer sticky.

STEP 3 - Lightly oil a bowl with the

vegetable oil. Place the dough in the bowl and turn until covered in oil. Cover the bowl with cling film and set aside in a warm place for 1 hr or until doubled in size. Lightly grease a baking sheet and set aside.

STEP 4 - For the filling, knock the dough back to its original size and turn out onto a lightly floured surface. Roll it into a 1cmthick rectangle. Brush all over with the melted butter, then sprinkle over the sugar, cinnamon and fruit.

STEP 5 - Roll up the dough into a tight cylinder, cut into 9×4 cm slices and position on the prepared baking sheet, leaving a little space between. Cover with a tea towel and set aside to rise for 30 mins.

STEP 6 - Heat oven to 190C/170C fan/gas 5. Bake the buns for 20-25 mins or until risen and golden brown. Meanwhile, melt the glaze sugar with 4 tbsp water until syrupy.

STEP 7 - Remove from oven and glaze. Set aside to cool on a wire rack. Once cool, mix the zest and icing sugar with about 2 tbsp water to drizzle over the buns. Serve.

winter woes

The freezing of pipes will stop your boiler working. You may hear a gurgling noise from the boiler or the boiler may come up with a fault code or flashing reset light.

The first thing to do is locate the condensate pipe on the outside of the house. This is a plastic pipe (usually white sometimes black) about 1" (25mm) or 2.5" (65mm) diameter approximately. The

pipe will usually run from the boiler position to a drain or sometimes just into the ground.

To clear, use a hairdryer or pour very hot water on it to defrost it. It may take a couple of goes if it is very cold.

As a caution, if going away during the winter months, the best way to prevent pipes freezing / bursting inside the property is to leave the heating on a constant setting and turn the room thermostat to around 5 or 10 degrees. if it's on constant with the temperature set low it will only come on when necessary, if the temperature doesn't drop too much it won't come on at all.

Christmas Again!

Why is Christmas such an important time? What does Christmas mean to you? Is it just time off with the family? A time for loads of presents? Expense that you can't afford? Why do we have presents? Jesus, born in Bethlehem to a young teenager, turned out to be God's gift to mankind. He in turn was given gifts of gold (for a King), frankincense (used in worship in the Temple) and myrrh (a perfume symbolising Jesus death). Symbolic gifts from the Wise Men from the East who had followed a new star realising a King had been born.

The Holy Land was in turmoil and under the occupation of the Roman Empire at that time. The Bible tells us that Mary and Joseph, Jesus' earthly parents had to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem. The Roman Emperor said that everyone must register in their ancestor's town. The Emperor wanted to count his people so that they could pay him the appropriate taxes. It was a command that couldn't be avoided even for someone who was heavily pregnant.

The journey was about 90 miles and would have taken about 4 days, travelling for 8 hours a day! Quite an undertaking. The tradition is that Mary rode on a donkey although that isn't mentioned in the Bible. Joseph's ancestor was King David so they had to go to Bethlehem.

We learn from the book of Micah, a prophet in the Old Testament, that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem. It was a small village at that time. Bethlehem today is a busy town in the West Bank where again there is turmoil. Things are very tense there now, as in Jesus' time. The Wise Men when they brought the gifts, knew the verse in Micah and quoted it to King Herod.

Power hungry King Herod didn't want another King to challenge the authority, given him by the Roman occupiers. To keep the baby Jesus safe from Herod's jealousy, the little family became refugees in Egypt. Same as today also, there are many refugees displaced due to wars.

Enjoy your Christmas presents, Christmas Turkey and Pudding, but remember that the difficult conditions

On 6th November we were delighted to welcome Kate and Keith to our WI Meeting for a talk about Marys Meals.

The history of Mary's Meals

Mary's Meals grew out of a charity called Scottish International Relief (SIR), which was set up after Magnus MacFarlane-Barrow and his brother Fergus took aid from their home in Argyll, Scotland, to Medjugorje, Bosnia-Herzegovina, during the conflict in 1992.

Over the next 10 years, SIR expanded. It began building homes for abandoned children in Romania, helped returning refugees in Liberia by setting up mobile clinics, and continued to deliver material aid to Croatia and Bosnia-Herzegovina as well as funding many additional projects.

SIR relied heavily on the generosity of local people in the village of Dalmally in Argyll, Scotland, who diligently donated food, blankets and other items of aid, which were then stored in the family shed. That same shed still serves as the global headquarters of Mary's Meals to this day.

Mary's Meals was founded in 2002

The Mary's Meals campaign was born in 2002 when Magnus visited Malawi during a famine and met a mother dying from AIDS. When Magnus asked her eldest son Edward what his dreams were in life, he replied simply: "I want to have enough food to eat and to go to school one day."

That moment was a key part of the inspiration which led to the founding of Mary's Meals, which began by feeding just 200 children in Malawi in 2002. Today, the charity feeds 2,429,182 hungry children every school day across 18 countries.

The charity is named in honour of Mary, the mother of Jesus, who brought up her own child in poverty.



Kate explained that it costs just £19.15 to feed a child for a whole year and any donations would be most welcome.


Totternhoe Garden Club

The last three garden visits this year! Sussex Prairie Garden - 17th August

Situated near Henfield in West Sussex, we had a long drive to visit the Prairie Gardens, but the sun shone and we were soon enjoying the delicious curry which they provided for lunch.

Surrounded by mature oak trees the eight acre garden consists of a series of interlocking arcs of large planted borders. Walking through the grasses and beautiful perennials was a delight. It is worth noting that the Gardens are only open during the summer months

Hidcote Manor - 21 September near Chipping Campden, Gloucs. This was such an interesting place to visit that I thought it worthwhile giving a little of the history of the Manor.



In July 1907 Lawrence Johnston, acting on behalf of his socialite mother Gertrude Winthrop, agreed to purchase the estate for £7,200. He moved into Hidcote in October 1907 and his mother arrived from America in June 1908. The house was extensively remodelled and work began on creating a series of intimate garden rooms around the house. Work stopped during the War:

In 1919, Gertrude bought the farm at the end of the village road, enabling the garden to be extended to its current boundaries. This period saw the extension of the Long Walk, along with the creation of the Wilderness, Mrs Winthrop's Garden, the Pillar Garden and the Rock Bank.

In the 1940s, Lawrence, by now in his 70s, began to think about the long-term future of the garden and Hidcote was transferred to the National Trust in 1948.

Despite the rain in the afternoon, we had a lovely day enjoying the delicious food in the café and

walking around the Garden. Definitely worth a visit.

Westonbirt Arboreteum - 3rd October

Another coachload of members set off for another interesting visit. Coffee was high on our priority list when we arrived. The weather was kind, although a little chilly, and we enjoyed walking through the trees, across the elevated walkway and inspecting the carvings dotted around.

The National Arboretum is an arboretum in



Gloucestershire, England, about 3 miles southwest of the town of Tetbury. Managed by Forestry England, it is perhaps the most important and widely known arboretum in the United Kingdom. Westonbirt Arboretum's story begins with the wealthy Victorian landowner, Robert Holford; an ambitious man with a passion for the natural world! Holford financed plant collecting expeditions all over the world, on a quest to find the rare, the beautiful and the extraordinary, and the arboretum still contains many of the original plants brought back from these trips. In 1956 the entire 600 acres (240 hectares) were handed over to Forestry England, who had the huge task of making it openly available to everyone who wished to see it for the very first time!

The countywide licensing register of 1876 states that the Labour in Vain beerhouse opened in 1852. The owner in 1876 was John Batchelor of Dagnall. He was still the owner at the time of the countywide licensing register of 1891.

By the time of the countywide register of 1903 the owners were Fuller, Smith & Company of Chiswick [Middlesex]. The property was: "clean and in good repair" and was 560 yards from the nearest licensed premises. The beerhouse had one back, one side and one front door. The beerhouse closed in 1914.

The Rating and Valuation Act 1925 specified that every building and piece of land in the country was to be assessed to determine its rateable value. The valuer visiting 66 Totternhoe Road found that it was owned and occupied as a small farm by A. Pryer.

The brick and slate, detached premises comprised three living rooms, a kitchen and a dairy on the ground floor with four bedrooms above. A later hand has noted that the dairy became an office and that one of the bedrooms was replaced by a bathroom and WC. A brick and slate coal shed and a brick and corrugated iron earth closet stood outside. The valuer commented: "Double front, big square type".

The farm buildings comprised a north and a south block. The north block included: a brick, weatherboarded and tiled cow house for six, an old brick, weather-boarded and corrugated iron cow house used as an open shed (a later hand has noted that this later became used as a garage), a brick, weather-boarded and tiled barn, store shed (later used as a meal house) and a cooling place. At the rear stood a weather-boarded and corrugated iron hen house and four piggeries. The south block comprised a weather-boarded and slated open trap shed. Pryer had two grass fields measuring 1.246 acres and 3.757 acres respectively and an orchard ("poor") measuring 1.103 acres.

Licensees: note that this is not a complete list and that dates in italics are not necessarily beginning or end dates, merely the first/last date which can be confirmed from sources such as directories and deeds: 1876-1904: Richard Gadsden; 1904-1906: John Facer; 1906: David Andrews; 1906-1911: Mark Overington; 1911-1914: Arthur Eastaff.

The Beerhouse licence was not renewed 3rd February 1914.



Fantastic Baby Beasts and Where to Find Them!

Two baby yaks named Tonks and Cedric have been captured on camera jumping for joy and bucking around the Dunstable Downs at Whipsnade Zoo - the magical new arrivals were given the monikers by zookeepers following their tradition of naming the yak family after characters from the beloved Harry Potter books. Zookeeper George Spooner said the first new woolly addition was female Tonks, born on Wednesday 20 September, followed by male Cedric on Saturday 7 October.

"Tonks was born to first time mum Pandora and dad Draco, while Cedric was born to female Petunia a few weeks later," he said. "The two yaks are fast becoming the best of friends - just like we imagine their namesakes would have been had they met at Hogwarts - playing in the long grasses of their paddock, as their mothers look on and try to grab some rest."

Yaks are extremely social animals living in herds of 10 to 20 individuals and use vocalisations to communicate. Yaks cannot moo like other cattle but will grunt instead. Their Latin name 'bos grunniens' translates to 'grunting ox.' Baby yaks weigh around 20kg when they're born and both youngsters were up on their feet within 20 minutes of being born, after a gentle nudge from their mothers.




While Whipsnade Zoo has a healthy herd of domestic yaks sadly their counterparts, the wild yak (Bos mutus) is facing a myriad of problems in the wild. "The domestic yak herd at our conservation zoo act as ambassadors for the wild yak, which are classed as Vulnerable by the IUCN Red List," George added.

ZSL WHIPSNADE ZOO

Weather Conditions for October 2023 Elevation: 450 ft - Latitude: 51° 50' 13" North - Longitude: 0° 33' 34" West

For the first half of October, our weather was being controlled by high pressure. It extended the late summer with higher than average temperatures which reached 25.5° c on the 9th. The second half of the month was unsettled, summer had ended and autumn had arrived, along with storms. The pressure started to drop on the 12th, bringing cooler and wetter weather. The 13th was the wettest day with 28.8mm of rain. For the rest of the month, the storms continued to come from the west, bringing more rain and winds. By the end of October, we had had 108.8 mm of rain (4.3 inches), which is 140% of the monthly average. However, this was a lot less than other parts of the country.
