am writing this just after the 60th anniversary of VE Day. Once the Second World War had finally ended in August 1945, there were millions of displaced people all over Europe. In its aftermath, British and Irish church leaders were determined to assist European refugees, many of whom who had lost everything. Their purpose was not to evangelise, but to help ease the suffering of ordinary people no matter what their faith.

As the organisation grew it was named Christian Aid. The focus was to combat poverty not just in Europe but across the world. During the 1950s and 1960s it became apparent that treating the symptoms of poverty was not enough. More needed to be done to tackle the root causes. Severe famines in Pakistan, Sudan and Ethiopia in the 1970s prompted a huge rise in public support for aid. Alongside emergency relief, there was growing investment in long term projects to help poor communities become more sustainable. Through global events like Live Aid in the 1980s and through high profile endorsement more people were giving to aid agencies. Christian Aid's annual income increased from £5.5 million in 1979 to £28 million in 1989. That year, 1989, Christian Aid week, which is always held in the second week of May, raised more than £6 million.

Door to door collections raised much of the money, but there were numerous other events too. I remember as a teenager participating in the local Christian Aid hike, a sponsored walk of 25 miles which was very well organised and well supported. Events like these raised both the profile and the income and left participants with a great sense of achievement.

In the 1990s, Christian Aid was at the forefront of the campaign to cancel third world debt.

When countries were paying huge interest on loans, sometimes almost as much as their annual GDP, how could they hope to break the cycle of poverty? As the campaign to cancel the debt gathered momentum, it became part of the Jubilee 2000 coalition. Many of Jubilee 2000s pledges were adopted by the G8 summit and billions of dollars of debt owed by low-income countries was cancelled. Mozambique had its debt repayments reduced from £127 million to £52 million allowing more to be spent on housing and hospitals. In Uganda £715 million of debt relief was used to double primary school enrolment. (Source: Larry Elliott, 'The Guardian' 27/11/2000)

Christian Aid was also part of the Fairtrade movement that has benefited farmers worldwide by upholding fair wages paid to those who produce crops like coffee, tea and cocoa. Most Fairtrade projects include a community contribution which communities can use to finance schools or medical facilities to improve their health and life chances.

Current Christin Aid campaigns centre around the climate crisis and the actions of polluters and lenders who are trapping people in poverty. Christian Aid is calling on the UK Government to make polluters pay for the climate crisis and to introduce new debt justice laws that could pull millions of people out of poverty.

Together we can play our part in God's work to restore creation and see the flourishing of all people.

#### WHY FOOTBALL IS MORE THAN JUST A GAME

As a coach of an under-11 football team, I get to see first-hand how much more kids get from football than just goals and trophies. Football is a brilliant way for children to grow — not just as players, but as people.

#### **Teamwork Makes the Dream Work**

Every pass, every goal, every win (and even every loss!) teaches kids how to work together. No one can win a game alone, and learning to trust and support

teammates is a skill that sticks for life.

**Fitness, Fun, and Friends** At this age, it's all about

having fun. Football keeps kids active and healthy, helps them burn off energy, and gives them a space to make lasting friendships.

#### **Learning Through Play**

Through training and matches, kids learn discipline, how to bounce back from disappointment, and how to show respect — not just to teammates, but to opponents and referees too.

#### Top Tip of the Month: Try Something New

Encourage your child to play in a new position at training. They might discover hidden talents and gain a better understanding of the game. ### Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village Competition

Both Edlesborough and Dagnall have entered the Buckinghamshire Best Kept Village Competition this year. Judging will take place between 1 st June and 14 th July. Thank you to all the parishioners who help to keep our villages clean and tidy.

#### **Grass & Hedge Cutting in the Villages**

The Council contractor is scheduled to cut the Pastures hedge in the last week of June/first week of July, the timing of this is such that most nesting birds will have fledged. This is the hedge that borders The Pastures estate, on the roads The Green, Brownlow Avenue and Pebblemoor.

The Council is aware of concerns about nesting birds and endeavours to do all it can to protect them. However, the Council is duty

bound to ensure that the hedge does not overhang the

#### footpath so as to:

- 1. Endanger or obstruct the passage of pedestrians.
- 2 Potentially causes danger to the footpath.

#### **Parishioners Hedges & Plants**

- EPC reminds all parishioners that it is the home/landowner's responsibility to keep their borders maintained and trimmed back to the point that it does not encroach over the footpath/pavement/highway or obstruct or risk injury to passersby.
- Home/landowner's must also ensure their hedges do not obstruct any road signs.
- Should parishioners have concerns about hedges or plants obstructing a pavement or junction within the 30mph areas of the villages, the process is as follows:
- You can approach the homeowner. People often leave and return to their homes by car and may not be aware that the growth from their property is obstructing the pavement/highway.
- If this is not feasible the issue can be reported to Edlesborough Parish Council, who under Buckinghamshire Devolved Services can write to the homeowner and request that the hedges, etc. are cut back.
- The resident then has 14 days to respond. If no response is received a second letter is then sent and the owner has a further 14 days to respond. If after a further 14 days, there has been no response or action the matter is referred to the Buckinghamshire Council Highways Devolution Officer.

**Please note** issues with roads, junctions, lights, hedges, etc **outside the 30mph** areas of the villages should be reported to Buckinghamshire Council via <a href="https://fixmystreet.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/">https://fixmystreet.buckinghamshire.gov.uk/</a>



Additionally, EPC reminds parishioners NOT to park on the grass verges as this causes damage to them and prevents the contractors from cutting the verges.


#### **Weather Conditions for April 2025**

Elevation: 450 ft. - Latitude: 51° 50′ 13″ North - Longitude: 0° 33′ 34″ West April started with high pressure which gave us a two-week settled, dry and sunny period. Daytime temperatures were in the high teens and rising into the twenties, but we still had chilly mornings on three days. On the 15th, we saw the first rain of the month.

The following five days were cooler, but dry and sunny. There was, however, rain on the 23rd and this turned out to be April's wettest day with a downfall of 18.21mm. The rest of the month returned to being dry and sunny with temperatures rising to a high of 27.2°c. The mean temperature was 11.8°c – above the average – with far more sun than normal. It rained on only four days, for a total of 26.4mm (just over an inch) which was 59% of the April average. So far this year, rainfall has been 77% of the average.

#### Do you dream?

I woke this morning to see a panicky WhatsApp from my daughter. She had dreamt that she had decided, on a whim, to go to Ghana! She continued that only when she had got there, had she realised that she was looking after her 5-year-old nephew and she'd taken him with her! She had then started stressing about getting him the various vaccinations that he would need and more importantly that she hadn't told his Mother!

A trip to Ghana was not unheard of as she has been there before, during her training, as well as several other African countries when, as a doctor she has volunteered to train medics there, on behalf of the Christian Charity Mercy Ships.

But the logic of a sudden trip with her nephew in tow was weird. Do your dreams make sense?

I began thinking of the many dreams recorded in the Bible and wondered if they would have made sense initially. The Bible has a great deal to say about dreams, mostly in the Old Testament, and it was then a way that God regularly communicated.



There are probably 2 dreams from the Bible that most people will have heard about. In the Old Testament Joseph (of the coat of many

colours) firstly had some dreams about himself, that his brothers and then also the sun and moon would be bowing down to him. Joseph's brothers already hated him because his Father, it says, loved him more than them. The brothers decided to sell him into captivity. He was taken to Egypt and put in prison where he was able to explain the meanings of dreams of the King's cupbearer and the King's baker. The cupbearer had a favourable interpretation and was restored to his job but the baker was told that he'd be hanged in 3 days. And so it happened on Pharaoh's birthday 3 days later.

Joseph later interpreted Pharaoh's dreams about the 7 years of plenty and the 7 years of famine, so they were able to prepare and Joseph's brothers came to Egypt to buy food and bowed down with thanks to Joseph.

In the New Testament, when Jesus was a baby, his earthly Father, Joseph was told in a dream to escape to Egypt with his little family because of Herod's plan to kill all the boys under 2. He was later told in a dream when it was safe to return. The Wise Men likewise, were warned in a dream to return home another way.

### **HONEY BEE SWARM**



This swarm of bees decided to hang out on the porch at Eaton Bray Church. I'm told they tend to do this when the weather is warm in the early summer and they are looking for a new location. The British Bee Keepers association provide advice on swarms and even a list of local bee keepers who will collect the swarm if they can. A swarm of honey bees is highly prized by beekeepers and the only difficulty was the need for a



ladder to reach the swarm and place the temporary hive. Scott, a bee keeper from Eaton Bray managed to collect the swarm after quite a lot of gentle encouragement and being surrounded by a large cloud of flying bees. ### **WILD BEES**

### Wild bees

In the UK, there are around 270 species of wild bee (24 species of bumble bee and 243 species of solitary bee) that are divided into six different families (groupings based on relatedness), according to the Bees, Wasps & Ants Recording Society. These include four families of short-and two long-tongued species. Within these families, bee species are diverse in their appearance, seasonal lifecycle timings and nesting habits. Some wild bee species are experiencing declines in the UK, a recent study analysed species-level trends between 1980 and 2019; they found that a third of species have decreased in that time, the situation was especially bad for solitary bees that had decreased by 32%. This matters to everyone as pollination is of fundamental importance to the planet and most critically, the functioning and survival of ecosystems. A vast and diverse array of creatures provide pollination services, even if you concentrate only on supporting wild bees, you will almost certainly support other pollinators and the insects, birds and mammals that feed on them.

Differentiating between bee species can be challenging and requires skill and knowledge. Some groups are more easy to identify, for example, bumblebees with their characteristic stocky, furry bodies. Other insects may be confused with other taxonomic groups; for example many species of Nomad bees (Apidae) have a wasp-like appearance. More confusing still, many non-bee species look like bees.

Wild bees have a seasonal life cycle because they depend on flowering plants to feed themselves. They usually go into a state of dormancy in a safe, protected place during the winter. Some bees emerge early in the spring and can be seen foraging as early as February and March in warm parts of the country, while others emerge later to take advantage of the abundant floral resources available later in the year. Some wild bee species will continue to forage into autumn, perhaps into October but seldom later.

Wild bees have a wide variety of nesting habits. Some bees, for example mining bees or plasterer bees, tend to nest in small aggregations in light soils or sand. Mason bees often nest in tunnels in wood or in hollow stems, partitioning brood cells by making a mastic out of mud, leaves or petals. Leafcutter bees cut out sections of leaves or petals and carry them back to their nest which may be sited in wood, hollow stems or various artificial cavities including bee hotels.

Some bumble bee species nest underground or in cavities, for example, in unused rodent nests; others will nest above ground, in holes in trees and bird boxes. Carder bumble bees tend to nest in rough grassy tussocks, or the plant debris caught along stock fences. There are also 'cuckoo' species which exploit the nests of other bee species to rear their offspring.

### What to do if bees are nesting in your garden or home

As many bee species are experiencing serious declines and some species have become extinct in the UK, anyone with a nest of wild bees in their garden is urged to leave them there and support them if they can. Most wild bee species are very unlikely to become aggressive and usually only sting if trapped. If possible, isolate the small section of the garden where the nest is, especially if the nest is accessible to pets or children, and try to avoid disturbing it. Something as simple as placing a potted plant between an exit hole and a garden path can divert the bees' flight path out of the way. Please do not try to relocate nesting wild bees, they will not be there for long and they are likely to have completed their breeding activities by the autumn. While honey bee swarms or hives can be easily relocated, the same is not true for wild bee species; moving their nests may result in their death. Some wild bees, such as red mason bees, may be seen nesting in cavities in brick work.

They do not cause any damage to the structure of the building as they use pre-existing holes in the brick work to lay their eggs. Occasionally they may expand existing holes so, if you have specific concerns and delicate brickwork, seal the crevices in mortar joints and bricks in autumn when bee activity has ceased. If you do this, consider replacing their lost nesting site with a new 'bee hotel'

If honey bees set up their nest in a building, they may become a serious nuisance. There are specialist companies that can relocate them without harming them. They will be able to provide advice on how to prevent future honey bee swarms from nesting in the building.

### **NIGELS THOUGHTS**

Dear Friends.

Sunday 8th June this year marks the joyous festival of Pentecost, which for those of the Jewish faith celebrates the wheat harvest and the opportunity to bring 'first fruits' of other crops to the temple. It also commemorates the giving of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible (the Torah) to Moses on Mount Sinai.

Luke, in chapter two of the Acts of the Apostles, writes that the disciples came together in one place to celebrate. They experienced the noise of a strong wind which filled the house and what appeared to be tongues of flame touching them (Acts 2 v 1-4), and they were filled with the Holy Spirit empowering them to go out and spread the good news about Jesus. This event is celebrated as the 'birthday of the church' seven weeks (hence 'Pente'cost) after Easter Sunday, and in some churches it is the day for baptisms and admitting new members into the church. At one time newly baptised people dressed in white and paraded through the streets giving rise to its alternative name, Whitsunday.

Pentecost is a most important Christian

Holy Day, after Easter, of course, but similar in significance to Christmas, as we celebrate the new birth which the coming of the Holy Spirit brings.

As we remember the arrival of God's Holy Spirit, we might be encouraged to wear Red or Orange to worship as a visible sign of setting our hearts on fire!



On 17 th April 2025, Celia French, who many of us know as a friend and neighbour, celebrated her 100 th birthday. Celia, originally from Gateshead, which you can still hear in her accent, arrived in the area as a WWII landgirl, first at Silsoe Manor and then onto Eaton Bray working on a chicken farm. She had to work more than hard and learn on her feet but with the kindness of the Bates family at the farm she was treated like a daughter and soon settled into the village.

Celia met local farmer Edwin French at a village social and went along with him to watch him play the drums with his band. Friendship turned into romance and the couple were married in Eaton Bray in 1947. Celia adapted naturally into arable, cattle and milking farm life with Edwin. Their first home had no electricity but as was the case for the war-experienced generation, they just got on with things.

Not unsurprisingly, the grafting nature of Celia, led into much more in our community, running the Keep Fit association after the war. She owned a large collection of dance music vinyl records which she was able to put into good use with her classes. Not content just to keep the village healthy, she went onto to perform at the Royal Albert Hall and in her spare time, bring much joy arranging days out at Clacton for her keep fit classes. Although she retired at 70, she carried on her Billington class until 80 and driving until 90.

Celia had tough beginnings of losing her mother at the age of 6, but went onto to have two children of her own; Sue in 1950 and Peter in 1952. Family life is evidently central to Celia now blessed with grandchildren and great-grandchildren. Renowned for cooking (cheese scones and wonderful cakes), Celia



was baking until relatively recently only stopping after a fall. It was with her wonderful family and friends who she was able to celebrate her 100th birthday recently with a party arranged by her son Peter, which included plenty of dancing and lots of fun together with a beautiful cake made by a special friend. Celia represents an era of great fortitude and resilience. I'm left still wanting to know more about "Tiddly Tuesday" bringing the pub goers back in horse and carts and many more stories besides.

We wish Celia a wonderful 100 th year and hope for many more.

### GETTING TO GRIPS WITH THE BBQ!

A bad workman blames his tools, so the saying goes. Well in the case of BBQs, he could have a point!

Your first choice is charcoal or gas. Flavour wise, if you want that traditional, smoky barbecue taste it's got to be charcoal. If you do prefer cooking on gas, but you still want to get a smoky flavour, you can buy smoking chips especially for gas BBQs.

Whatever your cooking fuel, the main thing you need is a lid. It will allow you to keep the temperature constant and helps to lock in flavour.

You should also consider how you want to use your BBQ. Do you just want a simple grill, or do you want the ability to grill and smoke for example? How big does your grill need to be? If you do a lot of entertaining, a larger grill area will be beneficial.

A good set of tools will also help. We recommend a pair of tongs, a spatula and a wire brush.

Rather than rushing to the nearest petrol station and grabbing whatever charcoal they have in stock, be prepared and have some ready for when the sun makes an appearance. The charcoal you use can make a huge difference.

We recommend lumpwood charcoal because it gives the best flavour, it's the kind that looks like burnt wood. You can also add wood chips to your charcoal to give additional flavours.

If your grill is clean you're much less likely to get food sticking during cooking. Get a grill brush and, after you've heated your BBQ give the grill it a good brush to remove any remains for the last cooking sessions. Then dip some kitchen roll in oil and wipe it evenly over the cooking area.



### When's the right time to start cooking?

Don't rush to put your food on! On a charcoal grill, you need to wait for any flames to die down and for the coals to be grey and glowing. Once they are, you'll have the hottest and most even heat and you're ready to get started.

If using a marinate do so s long as possible beforehand and also save some of the marinade to brush over your meat or fish whilst you are cooking. This will help to hold the flavour of the marinade in the meat and will also add moisture and trap the smoky flavour.

As juices drop from your meat or fish on to the charcoal, you are likely to get flaming. If this happens try the following to prevent the black, burnt look:

- Move food from the hot zone to a lower heat zone until the flames have gone down
- Close the lid (and if cooking on charcoal, close the top and bottom vents). This will deprive the fire of oxygen.
- Try to resist poking, stabbing or piercing your meat with a fork to check if it's done, more juices will escape which will feed the flames and make your meat drier.
- Use a spatula or tongs to move/turn your food

Clean the grill s soon as you've finished. Give the grate a clean whilst it is still hot to remove burnt on bits of food.



- J.K. Rowling Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone. Rejected by 12 publishers before being accepted by Bloomsbury. It's now one of the best-selling book series in history.
- Stephen King Carrie His debut novel was rejected 30 times. He famously threw it in the trash before his wife rescued it. It became a bestseller and a film.
- William Golding Lord of the Flies Rejected by 20 publishers, one calling it "an absurd and uninteresting fantasy." It became a modern classic.
- Kathryn Stockett The Help Rejected 60 times before being published. The novel spent over 100 weeks on The New York Times bestseller list.

### **BOOK REVIEW**

Kristin Hannah's **The Women** is a poignant historical fiction novel that brings to light the overlooked contributions of American women - particularly nurses - during the Vietnam War. Published in February 2024, the book quickly became



a bestseller and was awarded the 2024 Goodreads Choice Award for Best Historical Fiction .

The story follows Frances "Frankie" McGrath, a 20-year-old woman from a privileged family in Coronado Island, California. After her brother Finley is killed in Vietnam, Frankie defies her family's expectations and enlists as an Army nurse, seeking both purpose and a way to honour her brother's memory .

Frankie is deployed to Vietnam, where she endures the harrowing realities of war, working under grueling conditions and witnessing the devastating effects of combat. She forms deep bonds with fellow nurses and experiences profound personal losses, including the deaths of close colleagues and a romantic partner. Upon returning home, Frankie faces a society that is hostile to veterans and dismissive of women's roles in the war, leading to a challenging reintegration into civilian life.

#### Overview

The Women explores the themes of courage, friendship, and the struggle for recognition. Hannah's meticulous research and vivid storytelling shed light on the sacrifices made by women during the Vietnam War, a narrative often absent from mainstream histories. The novel has been praised for its emotional depth and compelling portrayal of a woman's journey through and after the war.

Some critics have noted that the story centers predominantly on Frankie's experiences, potentially limiting the broader representation of women's roles during the war.

### DOWNTHE LANE

After the long grey and leafless months of winter my garden is so green! The shrubs seem to have continued growing all winter and have an abundance of flowers particularly Portugese Laurel and, around the villages, Forsythia. I think that there will be a bumper fruit crop of apples, pears and plums as there was so much blossom during the good weather. This must have attracted hoverflies, important pollinators, especially when it wasn't warm enough for honeybees. I've never really noticed hoverflies in previous years. They look like bees when they are on the wing. When they are at rest you can see that they have only one set of wings, whereas bees have 2 sets.



Magpies aren't my favourite birds! In previous years they killed a whole family of thrushes and this year, several times, I have heard the commotion when they raid the nests of other birds. They do have one activity in their favour: they behave like a scarifier on the grass and pull out lots of moss, presumably digging up leather jackets and other creatures. The mower picks up the moss when the grass is cut. That should mean a few less daddy-long-legs in the summer



Hardy sedums are excellent low maintenance plants. I have them growing in several containers in the garden,

including this one which I use as a table centrepiece. Nurseries often sell them, sometimes in variety packs, so you can plant an inexpensive, interesting display. I think they are great plants to encourage children to garden. Sedums grow quickly and are easy to divide to make more plants. They need very little water and it's amazing how they can revive if they get dry and are then watered. Sedums are also used to create green rooves as they need very little soil or maintenance so you could use them on the roof of a bug hotel.



Clematis seem to be flowering prolifically this year. This one was growing up a trellis, which rotted, and now is happily using the fig tree instead and flowering while the fig leaves are in bud. The fig tree looks as though it will have a good crop of fruit this year which should ripen enough to eat.

Finally, a beautiful hawthorn and cow parsley, in full bloom, nature at its most splendid.

## Rare hazel dormice born at Whipsnade Zoo given clean bill of health before wild release



Wildlife vets at conservation charity ZSL have given nine rare hazel dormice the all-clear, ahead of the tiny rodent's release into the wild next month. The dormice – including three born at ZSL's Whipsnade Zoo - each received a health screening from ZSL's Disease Risk Analysis and Health Surveillance Team (DRAHS), as part of ongoing national conservation efforts to recover populations of this vulnerable mammal, which was once widespread across England and Wales.

During the 10-minute-long health checks, the fluffy-tailed dormice were placed under general anaesthetic so that the team of vets could gently check the heart and lungs of each dormouse, before carefully looking over their eyes, ears, nose, teeth and fur, to ensure the animals are ready for release. Each mouse was fitted with a microchip to help conservationists accurately identify individuals during follow-up monitoring, when they check how the dormice are doing in their new woodland home.

The health checks are part of wildlife charity People's Trust for Endangered Species' (PTES) annual dormouse reintroduction programme, which restores hazel dormice to their former range. With dormouse numbers having declined nationally by 70% since 2000 due to habitat loss, fragmentation and climate change (PTES' State of Britain's Dormice 2023 report), and populations lost from 20 counties over the past century, the programme is



crucial for the long-term recovery of this threatened species.

Dr Clare McNamee, wildlife vet at ZSL's Institute of Zoology who led the health checks, said: "We're delighted to report that all nine dormice passed their health checks and are now ready for their big move in just a few weeks' time. These dormice might be tiny, but they have a big impact on their woodland habitat. By restoring dormouse populations, we're making huge steps to protect and recover all the wildlife they live alongside."

This year marks a special moment for ZSL's involvement in the project, with the cohort including three dormice bred at ZSL's Whipsnade Zoo, under the Common Dormouse Captive Breeders Group (CDCBG), as part of the conservation charity's wider mission to recover native species.

Luke Pharoah, a zookeeper at Whipsnade Zoo responsible for monitoring the dormice said: "Whipsnade Zoo is the UK's largest zoo, so we're known for the larger animals that we care for – but behind the scenes we're also working with these charming little dormice. Watching these three dormice grow from tiny, dozy newborns into adulthood has been so rewarding, and it's exciting to know that with the all-clear from our vets they are now one step closer to raising their own young and boosting wild dormice numbers.





### Seville

Famous for its orange trees that decorate the city with blossom in the spring and provide shade in the summer, Seville is the largest city and capital of Andalusia. In early years it was ruled by the Romans and then the Moors whose influence can be seen in the spectacular architecture throughout the city. It was a vital port for Spanish trade and exploration of the Americas.

**Getting to Seville**: There are direct flights from Gatwick with British Airways, Easyjet and Vueling. Ryan Air fly from Luton and Stansted. Some of the flights are seasonal so it will depend on the time of year you are planning to travel.

**Staying in Seville**: There is a wide range of accommodation in Seville from boutique B&Bs to luxury 5-star hotels, though we would recommend finding somewhere with a roof top bar to take in the stunning views of the city and the Guadalquivir river.

### Must See Highlights:

- The Real Alcázar de Sevilla is the Royal Palace of Seville, and is still
  used by the Spanish King today. A UNESCO World Heritage site, it is a
  stunning example of Moorish influence on Spanish architecture. Book
  tickets in advance as the queues can be very long. A small group tour is
  recommended if you would like to learn more about the history of the
  palace.
- Seville Cathedral, built over the remains of a Moorish mosque, it is one of the largest Gothic cathedrals in the world. It houses the tomb of Christopher Columbus.
- The Giralda is the iconic bell tower of the cathedral. It was originally the minaret of the mosque that stood on this site. If you climb to the top, there are great views of the city!
- Plaza de España, located in María Lusia Park and nicknamed the 'Venice of Seville' due to the fountains, canals and bridges, this spectacular plaza was created for the Ibero-American exhibition in 1929.
- Take a walking tour of Santa Cruz, the former Jewish quarter in the old town.
   It is a maze of narrow streets, alleyways, terraces and restaurants and is the main tourist area of the city.
- Possible day trips from Seville are the White Villages and Ronda, as well as Córdoba and Cádiz so ensure you add a day or three to your itinerary!
- Top Tip cross over the Isabel II Bridge to visit the neighbourhood of Triana, which is known for its painted ceramics and flamenco; there are also some great local restaurants to try and make sure to visit the Triana Market too.



### A Brief History of Whipsnde Zoo

The park covers 600 acres (2.4 km2), and can be located from miles to the north and from the air because of the **Whipsnade White Lion**, a large hill figure carved into the side of the Dunstable Downs (part of the Chiltern Hills) below the white rhino enclosure. The lion has recently been restored by dedicated volunteers.

Whipsnade Park Zoo opened on Sunday 23 May 1931. It was the first open zoo in Europe to be easily accessible to the visiting public. It was an immediate success and received over 38,000 visitors on the following Monday. The brown bear enclosure is a surviving feature from the earliest days of the zoo.

The collection of animals was boosted in 1932 by the purchase of a collection from a defunct travelling menagerie and some of the larger animals walked to the zoo.

from Dunstable station.

The distinctive white lion hill figure was completed in 1933 and refreshed in 2018 and 2025.

During the Second World War, the zoo acted as a refuge for animals evacuated from the Regents Park London Zoo. The celebrity giant pandas Ming, Sung and Tang were among these animals but were soon returned to London to boost morale in the capital. During 1940, 41 bombs fell on the park with little damage to the zoo structure; some of the ponds in the park are the remains of bomb craters from this period. A spur-winged goose and a 3-year-old giraffe named Boxer, which had been born at the zoo, died as a result of the bombings; the giraffe ran herself to exhaustion in fright at the explosions.

In 1996, a new elephant house and paddock was opened to replace the architecturally outstanding but cramped original elephant house designed by Lubetkin and Tecton in 1935. The old house remains at the zoo as a Grade II\* listed building and its associated enclosure contains the zoo's lemurs.

In the early 2000s the zoo added new exhibits including Lions of the

Serengeti in 2005, a walk-through lemur enclosure in 2007 (officially opened on 28 March 2007 by Dominic Byrne from The Chris Moyles Show on Radio 1, who is a regular visitor to the park), the Rhinos of Nepal exhibit in February 2007, Cheetah Rock on Easter 2008, a sloth bear exhibit in May 2008, and Wild Wild Whipsnade in May 2009. In July 2008, the Café on the Lake was reopened after remodelling, with its name changed to the Wild Bite Café.

In May 2009, William Windsor (known as Billy), a goat mascot of the British Army's Royal Welsh regiment, retired to the zoo after eight years' distinguished service performing ceremonial duties.

In April 2024, the new Monkey Forest habitat was opened. A 2km walk where you have a different perspective of the passage through Asia on one side, and two new mixed-species enclosures on the other, housing langurs, macaques, babirusa, and anoa.

#### **Exhibits**

A resident of "In with the Lemurs", an attraction at the zoo.

The Butterfly House opened in 2016, the house is home to various species of butterfly and dwarf crocodiles, it is a walkthrough exhibit so the Butterflies are flying around when people go through the exhibit. This house is also home to one of the largest moths in the world; the atlas moth.

Passage Through Asia is a large paddock with no boundaries between visitors and the animals. Visitors can only access the area by driving through it in their own cars or riding on the Jumbo Express train. The paddock houses herds of Bactrian camels, barasingha, fallow deer, sika deer, Père David's deer and yaks.

To find out more you can join one of three different 1.5 hour heritage tours at Whipsnade Zoo, each of which touch on different parts of the extensive and colourful history.



Moira's Therapeutic Pilates

Helping you be your best self

Mama used to say and at first sight this article appears to

suggest that I am just re-inventing the wheel.

We all know the importance of a good fitting bra but these days there are research figures and medical facts that suggest that a lot of us are getting it wrong, especially where sports bras are concerned.

So medically, we are not just talking about the aesthetics of wearing a good fitting bra but about prevention of breast pain, back pain (including around ribs and lower back) and with better posture comes better function of the Pelvic Floor and all that that entails.

Now being a Rehab Pilates Teacher (and a Chartered Physiotherapist) in the articles that I write, I am normally extolling the virtues of how Pilates can help you get a better core, pelvic floor, and better body awareness, so a better posture. And it does ALL of that.

However, if we consider the weight of our breasts, estimated for a 34C lady of being equivalent of strapping a squirrel to our chests (do not ask me why they chose a squirrel, sounds like it could be painful anyway!). Or for a 34 F or 36E, that is a Jack Russell (hopefully cuddlier). Or for a 42gg lady, a duck (which is heavier I am told than a Jack Russell!

Amusing images aside, that is a lot of weight to carry in our top half, especially if it is not well supported and I'm not just talking about the larger ladies amongst us.

Us ladies are constantly resisting gravity, or not as the case may be.

So, making sure that you get a fitting assessment when you buy a bra is important. We change shape and size throughout our lives, so please do not just assume you know what size you are.

For the sporty, the facts are startling. In running, for example, breasts move up/down, out to sides and back and forth. They will

bounce an estimated 10,000 times in 60 minutes of running.

Most bras tend to compress but this only accounts for 27% of the movement. So good sports bras are hybrid ones that both encapsulate and compress. Razor back styles are also good because that gives us proprioceptive feedback, helping us to stand tall too.

In summary, when running.

Bad fitting bra = bad posture, affects back, ability to breathe properly, = poor performance, adverse effect on Pelvic Floor, possible leaking and even contribution to prolapse.

Heavy facts if you pardon the pun!

A good health investment is a good bra, whether you are sporty or not. Fact, in the general population, there is a high incidence of neck and back pain amongst women. Is there a correlation? Where in one study it found that 85 to 100 % of women were not in the right bra, it leaves food for thought.

Oh of course, attending my Pilates classes may prove to be another good health investment!
