The Bible begins and ends with a garden. At the start of Genesis, Adam and Eve live peacefully in the garden, meeting with God and walking together in the cool of the evening. That is until it all goes horribly wrong. In the final book of the Bible, Revelation, the Tree of Life stands at the centre. 'And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.' (Revelation 22 verse 2) I don't believe that these parts of Scripture were written to be taken literally. Rather, they are poetic works which seek to explain why there is so much beauty and so much horror in our world. And they point to a future hope of healing and renewal for all of creation.

For Jesus, gardens were spaces to pray and be still. They were also places to wrestle with God, and with the meaning of his vocation. Jesus lived as we do and experienced the whole of life. He laughed and shared meals with his friends, he knew what it was like to be lonely. hurt and fearful. He joined in wedding feasts and celebrations, times of joy and times of sorrow. On the eve of the crucifixion, Jesus went with three disciples to the garden of the Mount of Olives. Jesus prayed. "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet not my will but yours be done.' In his anguish he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down on the ground." (Luke 22 verses 42 & 44) I'm told that this is medically possible when someone is in anguish.

In the Bible, gardens have a significant role as places where crucial things happen. The garden is the place of encounter with God, the place of sanctuary, the place of wrestling and the place of healing. The garden of Eden is the archetype of an earthly paradise with God in its midst. In fact, the word 'Paradise' originates in

Old Persian and means a walled garden. So do we find paradise in our gardens? Dorothy Frances Gurney wrote that we are 'closer to God in a garden than anywhere else on earth.' And it is probably true that gardening keeps us on our knees far more than prayer does! Our gardens, or outdoor spaces if we have no garden, are a reminder of the beauty and fragility of creation. This summer we have again been confronted with the effects of climate change. In the Vicarage garden, the fruit trees have been abundant, but the courgettes have been hard and hollow despite our best efforts at watering. The Kale has more holes than leaf because the cabbage white butterflies have had a field day. Learning to garden with the increasingly erratic weather patterns is something which all gardeners will need to do.

Gardens are also used in the Bible as metaphors. A particularly fruitful way of thinking is to imagine God as the gardener of our soul, as this prayer by Richard Foster shows.

Spirit of the living God, be the Gardener of my soul. For so long I have been waiting, silent and still-experiencing a winter of the soul. But now, in the strong name of Jesus Christ, I dare to ask: Clear away the dead growth of the past, Break up the hard clods of custom and routine, Stir in the rich compost of vision and challenge, Bury deep in my soul the implanted Word, Cultivate and water and tend my






Weather Conditions for August 2025

Elevation: 450 ft. - Latitude: 51° 50′ 13″ North - Longitude: 0° 33′ 34″ West August started warm with only a hint of rain over the first few days. After that, it only got hotter. Between the 10th and the 15th, daytime temperatures were consistently above 28 degrees, and the monthly high was on the 12th when we reached 34.4°c. It remained incredibly dry and, by the 19th, we had only recorded 4.6mm of rain. Storm Erin came in to bring some drama at the end of the month which saw a total of 32.8mm rainfall across four days.

The wettest day was the 29th at 13.2 mm. Nevertheless, August was another dry month. With only 37.2mm of rain, which is 49% of the average. The year's running rain total by the end of August was 310.4mm: 70% of the average.

Every day we learn

During the past seventy years and even today, I realise that I learn so much from gardens, lessons for life.

In a brand-new garden when we moved into a "New build", aided by several friends, I borrowed a rotovator, and we laid (and had to re-lay) some turf, although sabotaged by my Mother's large exuberant Labrador at every stage.

I've had memorable encounters with so called Weeds. I grew some impressive plants with deep green leaves like a foxglove, but which developed small deep blue flowers – very attractive so I let them flourish, discovering that they were Lungwort and was advised to get rid, because they would take over. So, in the Autumn I took a firm grip of a likely looking plant, and heaved...whereupon it broke off, its tough and well-established tap roots six inches below the surface, and I realised that the whole bed would need to be excavated to get the roots out, although it looked pristine on the surface.

In my own garden, the first year I was here, I had

no surprises; however, in the second year there appeared fine specimens of Weld – over a metre tall and very robust. The time came to deal with it. I tentatively laid hands on a tough looking specimen, expecting it to break off, but up it came, root and all, no trouble. Each plant the same – very satisfying. And this year? No sign, all gone.

So, what am I learning, day by day? That precious and beautiful things in our lives are worth protecting – things like loving relationships, family and friendships; that some tasks are too hard for one person, however willing; that some tasks can be achieved with help but are vulnerable to resident saboteurs like Labradors!

That things get established in our lives and need wholesale rooting out!

Jesus often drew attention to the natural world around - the little anemone flowers, weeds growing amongst the wheat, the tiny mustard seed and the plant which grew from it; sheep and lambs, barley loaves and fish. I believe He still encourages us to learn from our situations and surroundings and let His Spirit open up our minds and imaginations to receive guidance for our lives. His Spirit is a great resource, and very gentle with us.

So now...I have negotiated No Mow May, No Prune June, Developing Jungle July, Abandon Hope August, SOS September and embark on Oh my Goodness October. I'm getting help... and I'm learning!

Join us for our Sunday services in the Church at 11 am. We'd love you to join us for our worship and song. You will get a warm welcome. For those unable to attend in person we also stream our services.







Burghope's Charity Land

The Burghope charity was set up in 1723 by the former vicar of Edlesborough, The Revd George Burghope. He gave 10 acres of land behind the church in Edlesborough to fund the charity, now called The Burghope Trust. The original terms of the charity stipulated that divine service be performed in the parish church on certain days in Lent, and after Burghope's death, on the anniversary of his funeral (26th May). Additionally, the sum of 6s 8d (33p) was distributed yearly amongst the poor who attend the Lent services and 20s (£1) a year to poor widows who attend the anniversary service and heard the sermon. The parish clerk did very well from it, as he received 3s 4d for tolling the bell on St John's Day.

The terms of the charity were revised and now no one has to listen to a sermon any longer!

The Charity originally covered Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall. Eaton Bray was formally included in 2013.

It is a small charity. The funds originate from the sale of a portion of land that was to the northwest of the churchyard in Edlesborough. By the mid 1980's the churchyard was reaching capacity. As a result, a portion of the land to the north west was sold to the parish council to create an adjacent cemetery. The remaining area approximately 7 acres is let to a local farmer who pays rent to the charity. The money from the sale of the land is invested in the Charities Official Investment fund (COIF).

The objectives of the charity are to use the income

- In making payment to the PCC for further the work of the Church
- 2) For relief in need of individuals or local charitable organisations

Payment is by one off grants to relieve hardship, need or distress of individuals or to organisations that provide services to such persons.

Anyone in the Parish can apply to the charity for assistance. Some of the people and groups we have helped are:

Whipsnade Zoo launches global conservation project to save rare pupfish species from extinction



Wading through the calm waters of Lake Chichancanab in Mexico, aquarists from ZSL's Whipsnade Zoo in Bedfordshire were looking for any signs of tiny Mexican pupfish – but sadly, their surveys confirmed their worst fears; six of seven unique pupfish, including the boxer pupfish (Cyprinodon simus), are likely extinct in the wild.

Following the frightening revelation in 2024 that the last remaining wild population of boxer pupfish was feared to be lost, and the only remaining population existed at Whipsnade Zoo, aquarists at the ZSL conservation zoo spearheaded a dramatic effort to save the species from extinction.

Whipsnade Zoo's team knew that they needed to verify the news with a comprehensive survey of the fish' only habitat - Lake Chichancanab in Mexico – but in preparation for the worst-case scenario to be confirmed, the team initiated an urgent action plan to bolster the insurance population in zoos, including transporting precious eggs from Whipsnade to Bristol Zoological Society.

Sadly, the survey, conducted in spring 2025, along with ZSL's conservation partners in Mexico and Bristol Zoological Society, revealed not only

a complete absence of boxer pupfish, but of five other species of pupfish endemic to the lake.

Underwater video cameras were deployed, aquarists snorkelled to investigate nooks and crevices, seine netting helped to filter swathes of the lake, and aerial drones were used to scan inaccessible areas; all of which ensured the survey was as thorough as could be. Water samples collected from the lake will be analysed for environmental DNA (eDNA) to officially confirm the disappearance of the six pupfish species.

Alex Cliffe, ZSL's Assistant Curator of Fish, said: "As soon as we realised the plight of the Boxer pupfish, we knew we had to act fast; but we had to make sure our actions were led by science and evidence. We had braced ourselves for the worst with the boxer pupfish, but what's happening in Lake Chichancanab is far more alarming than we imagined."

"Our initial aim when surveying the lake was to confirm if the boxer pupfish was extinct-in-thewild. However, once we were there, we sadly discovered only one of the seven pupfish species that inhabit the lake remains – the black lip pupfish."

It's very likely that the other species of pupfish

that were not detected during the survey could be lost forever, as none are cared for in zoos and aquariums.

"Boxer and black lip pupfish are vital to preserving the biodiverse ecosystem of Lake Chichancanab. The decimation of pupfish populations in the lake was likely caused by the introduction of invasive fish species, such as the Mayan cichlid," said Alex.

"It's devastating news, but our focus is now on the actions we can take to ensure the survival of the two remaining pupfish species – the boxer and black lip - as we believe that we can reverse the damage already done and safeguard their future."

Whipsnade Zoo is spearheading a breeding programme for the Boxer pupfish and will be working with conservationists in the United States, where one population of black lip pupfish are cared for at one institution, to establish more insurance populations of the precious fish.

Alex said: "Our short-term goal is to rescue a population of black lip pupfish from their currently imperilled habitat and establish a population in human care in Mexico. Long term, we hope to bring some eggs to Whipsnade Zoo, so we can establish a European breeding programme alongside the boxer pupfish.

"The drastic decline in pupfish numbers highlights that biodiversity is being lost at an

astronomical rate, but thanks to the unique conservation expertise of zoos and aquariums, we can make a dramatic difference for those in our care."

Whipsnade Zoo's aquarists, as part of global conservation charity ZSL, have previously helped to recover a species once thought Extinct in the Wild. The Mangarahara cichlid, a fish endemic to the river of the same name in Madagascar, was thought to only exist in human care, with just two males left at London Zoo. Following a global search led by ZSL, the species was found clinging on to survival in a tiny tributary, which led to the rescue of the fish and creation of an international conservation breeding programme.

Alex concluded: "As a world leader in managing and reintroducing extinct-in-the-wild species, and the founders of the Extinct-in-the-wild Alliance, ZSL has a responsibility to drive forward the recovery of the world's most threatened species."

"This project to save the pupfish is another reminder of the vital role zoos play in conservation, to claw back species from the brink of extinction, reverse the damage caused, and ensure their protection for the future."

Every visit to Whipsnade Zoo supports ZSL's vital work to protect species and restore habitats across the globe.

Membership for a season of ten films costs £35 with a sliding scale for people who join part way through the season. Great value at £3.50 per film!























This month, enjoy the autumnal colours in the garden

October is a beautiful month of autumnal colours and first frosts. Crisp, blue-sky days are the perfect time to tidy up and cut back in the garden. If you grow fruit and veg, there's still plenty to harvest and store for the cold winter months ahead.

For advice on what to get started this month, here's a list of jobs to keep on top of this month:

Timely Tips



- If your greenhouse is fairly empty, now's a good time to clean and disinfect it. This lets in more light, and prevents pests and diseases from over-wintering.
- Protect half-hardy plants with fleece or bring them into a frost-free greenhouse.
- Sweep up any fallen leaves that harbour
- fungal spores and provide ideal hiding places for slugs and snails. Use them to make leaf mould for the garden.
- Lift and divide any overcrowded herbaceous perennials whilst the soil is still warm.

- Lift dahlia tubers, begonia tubers and gladioli corms to store over the winter months. Remove any dead foliage before storing them.
- You can take hardwood cuttings from deciduous shrubs now.
- Prune rambling and climbing roses once they've finished flowering, and tie in the
- stems before autumn winds cause damage.
- Clear up fallen rose leaves to prevent diseases such as black spot from overwintering. To avoid the spread of damaging fungi, don't compost the leaves.
- Clear overhanging plants from pathways to maintain access around the garden.

- Cut back perennial plants that have died down. Alternatively leave the dead foliage in place to shelter friendly wildlife.
- After tidying borders, mulch with bark chips, well rotted manure, leaf mould or spent mushroom compost to insulate
- plant roots for the winter and keep weed growth in check.
- This month is the ideal time to plant hedges, edible hedging, and move trees and shrubs.

In the vegetable garden



- Finish harvesting peas and beans. When they've finished cropping simply cut the plant away at ground level, leaving the roots in the soil. These crops fix nitrogen which is slowly released into the soil as the roots break down.
- If you plan to grow peas and beans next year, start preparing the site by digging trenches and filling with manure or kitchen waste.
- Harvest pumpkins and squashes before the first frosts. They quickly turn mushy if left outside!
- When you harvest your cabbages, leave the root in the ground and make a cut across the stem to encourage a flush of

- smaller leaves.
- Hang any tomato plants and pepper plants with green fruits upside down indoors to ripen.
- Protect autumn cauliflower heads, like 'White Step' F1 hybrid, from frost by wrapping the outer leaves around them and securing them with string. Alternatively use a cloche or fleece.
- Cut back yellowing asparagus foliage to within 5cm of the ground.
- Reuse old grow bags by cutting away the top and sowing late salad crops. Cropping can be extended into winter if grown under glass, cloches or inside polytunnels.

Looking after your lawn



- Clear up fallen leaves regularly to allow light to the grass.
- A last mowing can be made this month before leaving your lawn for the winter.
- Recut any lawn edges if needed. Install lawn edging to make future maintenance easier.
- Aerate your lawn with a garden fork to avoid waterlogging and compaction over winter.
- Rake any thatch from the surface and repair dead patches. There's still time to lay fresh turf if required.

A world of Experience

Seville

Famous for its orange trees that decorate the city with blossom in the spring and provide shade in the summer, Seville is the largest city and capital of Andalusia. In early years it was ruled by the Romans and then the Moors whose influence can be seen in the spectacular architecture throughout the city. It was a vital port for Spanish trade and exploration of the Americas.

Getting to Seville: There are direct flights from Gatwick with British Airways, Easyjet and Vueling. Ryan Air fly from Luton and Stansted. Some of the flights are seasonal so it will depend on the time of year you are planning to travel.

Staying in Seville: There is a wide range of accommodation in Seville from boutique B&Bs to luxury 5-star hotels, though we would recommend finding somewhere with a roof top bar to take in the stunning views of the city and the Guadalquivir river.

Must See Highlights:

- The Real Alcázar de Sevilla is the Royal Palace of Seville, and is still
 used by the Spanish King today. A UNESCO World Heritage site, it is a
 stunning example of Moorish influence on Spanish architecture. Book
 tickets in advance as the queues can be very long. A small group tour is
 recommended if you would like to learn more about the history of the
 palace.
- Seville Cathedral, built over the remains of a Moorish mosque, it is one of the largest Gothic cathedrals in the world. It houses the tomb of Christopher Columbus.
- The Giralda is the iconic bell tower of the cathedral. It was originally the minaret of the mosque that stood on this site. If you climb to the top, there are great views of the city!
- Plaza de España, located in Maria Lusia Park and nicknamed the 'Venice of Seville' due to the fountains, canals and bridges, this spectacular plaza was created for the Ibero-American exhibition in 1929.
- Take a walking tour of Santa Cruz, the former Jewish quarter in the old town.
 It is a maze of narrow streets, alleyways, terraces and restaurants and is the main tourist area of the city.
- Possible day trips from Seville are the White Villages and Ronda, as well as Córdoba and Cádiz so ensure you add a day or three to your itinerary!
- Top Tip cross over the Isabel II Bridge to visit the neighbourhood of Triana, which is known for its painted ceramics and flamenco; there are also some great local restaurants to try and make sure to visit the Triana Market too.

A new social group for those affected by dementia and age-related memory loss has opened at Edlesborough Pavilion.

Their first meeting was held the afternoon of July 9 and was very well attended by a mixture of family carers and those living with the condition. Edlesborough Memory Café is a social space for people to chat and play some fun games together. It has been started with the help of Tibbs Dementia Foundation, who are a specialist Bedfordshire dementia charity with over 12 years of experience in delivering social activities to those affected by dementia and memory loss.

The group is very inclusive and all are welcome, those with a formal diagnosis as

well as those without. Family members are also encouraged to come along, either on their own or with their relative who is living with dementia/memory loss.

Tibbs pride themselves on offering a relaxed and stress-free environment, where clients can come and enjoy a cuppa, along with good company and some stimulating games and activities. It is a space where people can just be themselves without having to worry about stigma or judgement from others.

The charity understands that some may feel anxious about their diagnosis and being in the company of other people, and for those with a cognitive impairment this can be a very normal reaction to the thought of socialising in a group. This is why they offer social activities just for those living with memory loss and dementia; an opportunity to be with others in a similar situation who understand the challenges people with this condition face. New people are encouraged to come along for a taster session to try it. No booking is necessary.

But what is love? Is it love that leads to how we behave, or is it how we behave that leads to love?

1 John 4: 19-21 reads:

'We love because He first loved us. Whoever claims to love God vet hates a brother or sister is a liar. For whoever does not love their brother and sister whom they have seen, cannot love God, whom they have not seen. And He has given us this command: anyone who loves God must also love their brother and sister.'

Jesus is the perfect example of love and commitment. We, who are not perfect examples, need help to love fully. Think about the people you find hard to love. Maybe they are known to you or have personally hurt or upset you. Or perhaps they are people you read or hear about in the news or your local community.

How can we love fully if we do not show everyone love?
