Do you know which Christmas food was banned by Act of Parliament? It was mince pies! This was during the Protectorate of Oliver Crowell, a Puritan, who thought food should be plain and simple as should the way people dressed and behaved. The English Civil War was a clash between forces of the crown and those of the Puritan parliament. But it was also a battle of ideology. Despite having no previous military experience, Cromwell led the New Model Army to victory in the English Civil War. In 1653 the Army drew up the Instrument of Government and Oliver Cromwell became Lord Protector.

Cromwell 'ruled' from 1653 until his death in 1658. During this time, Puritan values were enforced by law. The Puritans encouraged industriousness, frugality and a serious attitude to life. Cromwell believed that 'pointless' enjoyment was a sin, so sports and entertainment were banned, meaning that theatres and inns were closed. Plain dress was also enforced. Christmas festivities were forbidden. Cromwell and the Puritans wanted Christmas to be a purely religious celebration in which people contemplated the birth of Jesus. They viewed with consternation the excessive eating and drinking on Christmas day. Festive food was removed from the streets which meant that the smell of a roasting goose could bring trouble. All decorations were banned. Puritans felt that mince pies were far too indulgent and rich, so in 1650 Oliver Cromwell passed an Act of Parliament banning mince pies. Anyone found guilty of eating one was to be put in prison.

The first mince pies were savoury, made of shredded meat in an oval-shaped case to represent the manger in which Jesus was laid. They included three spices as a reminder of the three gifts of gold, frankincense and

myrrh which the Wise Men brought to Jesus. It was traditional to eat a mince pie on each of the twelve days of Christmas to ensure a happy new year.

The Monarchy was restored in 1660. People welcomed Charles II enthusiastically, and looked forward to the reopening of theatres and inns and being able to celebrate Christmas once again. Mince pies were no longer illegal, and they became increasingly popular. It wasn't until the 19th Century that a new sweet mince pie arrived, like the ones we have today. Instead of being eaten at the beginning of the meal, it was offered at the end

Did you know that a lot of the things we associate with Christmas- holly and Christmas trees, as well as mince pies- have their origins in representing the Christmas story? So this Christmas season, each time you eat a mince pie, remember its origins. Mince pies were intended as a reminder of the birth of God's Son, Jesus, who was laid in a manger. The spices recall the gifts of the Wise Men: gold for kingship; incense for worship; and myrrh for burial. Their gifts foretold Jesus' life, death and Kingship. He is the true meaning of Christmas, the one who is worthy of our worship.

'Therefore God raised him to the hights and bestowed on him the name above all names, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow-in heaven, on earth, and in the depths-

and every tongue confess that "Jesus Christ is Lord" to the glory of God the Father.' (Philippians chapter 2 verses 9-11)

"A thrill of hope, the weary world rejoices"

Rev. Tim Haines, Eaton Bray Methodist Church

As we come to the end of another year and step tentatively into a new one, many of us find ourselves thinking about the world around us—not just our own lives, but the news we consume, the worries we carry, and the tensions that seem to be growing rather than easing. December and January have often been reflective months, but this year it feels especially so. There is a longing, deep and shared, for peace, for hope, and for some kind of restoration in a world that often feels bruised.

This longing is something I've seen expressed beautifully by the South Bedfordshire Craftivists, whose work you'll see pictured in this edition. They have created four canvases, each carrying a message that speaks not only to the heart of this season, but to the heart of our shared humanity.

In a time when global conflicts dominate the headlines, when civilians bear the cost of decisions far beyond their control, and when many feel powerless in the face of tragedy, this simple act of creativity becomes something more than art. It becomes a prayer. A protest. A plea. A reminder that peace is not passive; it is something we ask for, work for, and sometimes fight for in the way of Jesus: not with weapons, but with compassion, truth, and courage.

Peace, hope, and restoration can sometimes feel like big, abstract ideals that are hard to grasp in the middle of life. But they become real when we see them lived out in ordinary ways. Peace becomes the choice to listen rather than react, or to show patience when frustration would be easier. Hope appears in those small decisions to believe things can improve, even when the news feels heavy or the future uncertain. And restoration shows itself whenever someone takes a step towards healing; mending a relationship, rebuilding trust, or finding the courage to care again.

These values take shape not in grand gestures, but in everyday actions, in small places, and often in quiet moments when the world feels overwhelming.

As a minister, I often see how these themes play out in everyday life. Peace is found not only in international negotiations, but around kitchen tables, in reconciliation between neighbours, or in a quiet moment when we choose kindness over frustration. Hope is found in the resilience of communities, the hospitality of strangers, and the surprising ways people show up for one another. Restoration is found in healing after loss, renewal after exhaustion, or simple acts of repairing what has been damaged.

And so, in this season when we celebrate the coming of the Prince of Peace, it feels fitting to let these canvases speak to us. They invite us to reflect on our own role in peacebuilding: whether that is praying for those in conflict zones, supporting relief efforts, or choosing to build peace in our own relationships and communities.

As part of this journey together, you are warmly invited to join us for our Christmas Café Church on Sunday 14th December at Edlesborough Methodist Church; a relaxed and welcoming space to pause, reflect, and share in the hope of the season. You're also encouraged to take part in the village Advent Windows, a lovely way for our whole community to mark the days of Advent with light, creativity, and togetherness.

As we move into a new year, may we be people of peace in a broken world, people of hope in a weary world, and people who believe that restoration, even when slow, is possible.

May peace be with you this Christmas, and may hope carry you into the year ahead.



Repair Café Goes From Strength to Strength

On 25 February 2023, Ivinghoe & Pitstone Repair Café launched in Pitstone Pavilion. A community-run venture, it brings together volunteers with a variety of skills for local people to bring along broken items to in hope of getting them fixed. The café was all about promoting sustainability, looking after the environment, and looking to reuse or fix items instead of throwing them away.

Not only is it still going strong, but it's gone from strength to strength. The volunteer repairers - from a wide range of disciplines, including engineering, sewers, woodworkers and generalists, see over 60 items in the three hours the café is open, and the repair rate success now stands at 80%. And that's not all, said founder Alex Razak.

"We have also become a wonderful community space where people bump into friends and chat to others they have never met, while enjoying quality coffee and homemade snacks, and waiting for their item to be fixed."

The café is not for profit, but visitors are encouraged to give a donation for their repair and for the refreshments. The generosity of the volunteers and donations from grateful visitors has helped fund equipment that helps make repairs easier and quicker. It has also enabled the café to donate £3,000 to local charities chosen by the volunteers.

Those donations were handed over at a special Repair Café celebration on Saturday 26 July. The Pavilion was the usual hive of activity, with repairs in full swing and coffee and delicious cakes on offer, and plates of homemade canapes were also circulating.

At midday all eyes were on representatives of a diverse range of charities receiving cheques from Alex: Ivinghoe and Pitstone Food Bank, Ivinghoe and Pitstone Scouts, Aylesbury Food Bank, Workaid (which donates tools and other items to projects in Africa aimed at teaching people trades), CHUMS (providing a wide range of mental health and emotional wellbeing services: baby loss, mental trauma, suicide bereavement, recreational and therapeutic support, and friendship schemes) and the Hygiene Bank (where twenty volunteers in the Milton Keynes area

provide help for people in need to keep themselves, their clothes and their homes clean through

Alex

donations of items at Boots and other companies' branches and JustGiving donations).

The café has established itself as an invaluable part of community life remarkably quickly, and everyone involved is rightly proud of it and its contribution to saving items from the evergrowing landfill mountain. Everyone who attends fills out a form with their contact details, information about the item needing repair and their signature agreeing to the 'House Rules'.

Further information is filled in by the Repairer. The information is then uploaded to the Repair Café Worldwide Foundation database, so that the café has a record of how many kg of items have been saved from





Elevation: 450 ft. - Latitude: 51° 50′ 13″ North - Longitude: 0° 33′ 34″ West October began warmer than average but by the 3rd, the first storm of the season, "Amy", came our way with a drop in pressure, heavy rain and high winds of 44mph. The 3rd was, in fact, the month's wettest day with 16.4mm of rain. A couple of days later, the pressure rose with the arrival of an anticyclone, which stayed with us until the 19th, to produce dull and persistent cloud. On the 19th, the pressure dropped again and brought unsettled conditions which lasted until the end of the month. The pressure is shown in black on the plot below. The highest monthly temperature was 21.1°c on the 6th; the month's lowest was on the 12th at 2.9°c. Rainfall was 62.6mm, which is 78% of the average for October. The year's rain total by the end of the month was 431.1mm: 68% of the average

Stamp of approval for Whipsnade White Lion

65 volunteers rallied to stamp down fresh chalk to complete revamp of Whipsnade Zoo's iconic chalk white lion



PRESS RELEASE: OVER SIXTY people gathered on Whipsnade Zoo's iconic 147m-long white lion to complete the final step of the famous landmark's revamp - stamping down freshly laid chalk.

Over 1100 tonnes of chalk was spread across the famous hillside figure's 6525 square metre surface area by a devoted group of 40 volunteers over the last five months. But due to the rare, native flora and fauna that surrounds the chalk beast, the conservation zoo couldn't use pesticides or machinery to compact its powdery surface, meaning they needed a whole lot of manpower to seal in the new layer.

A divide and conquer approach was used to tackle the ginormous task, with three groups of twenty volunteers each tackling the head, body and tail respectively. A wet morning meant the chalk was suitably soft, creating the perfect conditions for a stamp in the afternoon sunshine.

Sara Nicholas, volunteer advisor at Whipsnade Zoo, said: "The atmosphere on the white lion was amazing. There were some very unique

approaches to stamping, with a few groups breaking out a line dance, or 'lion dance', to make sure their section was well and truly compacted."

The mass stomp, which took one hour to carry out, has ensured the historic monument will shine brightly for 2026, when ZSL - the

conservation charity which runs Whipsnade Zoo - will celebrate its 200th anniversary.

Sara continued, "Thanks to the ginormous efforts of our amazing volunteers – or the 'white lion posse' as they've been nicknamed - Whipsnade's white lion is looking beautiful.

"Stamping down the newly laid chalk was the final step in completing this magnificent carving's makeover ahead of ZSL's bicentenary next year."

Owen Craft, Director of Zoo Operations at ZSL added: "2026 is going to be a big year for ZSL, as we mark our 200th anniversary. Whipsnade Zoo's white lion has stood proud on the Dunstable Downs for almost half of those 200 years, so it was really heartwarming to see so many people come together for its revamp ahead of our celebrations."

The core white lion volunteers will continue to maintain the iconic facade through weeding by hand every Thursday morning, whatever the weather.

Sara concluded: "With so many staff and other volunteers from across the breadth of ZSL, including zookeepers, horticulturists, and our presenter team, temporarily joining the White Lion Posse to help stamp in the chalk that has been spread over its colossal head, body and tail, it was a true team effort."

Construction of the white lion began in 1931, and it took two years to excavate. The nearby Ivinghoe Beacon – now a National Trust site - was used by the construction team as a vantage point to regularly check the accuracy of the outline. During the Second World War, the lion was covered to prevent it from being used by enemy aircraft as a navigation point, and in May 1981, as part of Whipsnade Zoo's 50th anniversary celebrations, the lion was illuminated using 750 lightbulbs.

LOCAL HOMELESS CHARITY URGES COMMUNITY TO HELP RESCUE PEOPLE FROM FEAR AND ISOLATION THIS CHRISTMAS

With freezing, dangerous nights approaching, Hertfordshire-based charity, DENS, has launched their Winter Appeal to provide vital support for local people experiencing homelessness.

DENS shared the story of Amy – who faced cold winter nights alone, frightened and without a safe place to turn.

On the 28th October, Buckinghamshire TVP started their annual winter burglary campaign (Operation Grotto) [2] It will continue into the new year.

Churches Together - Eaton Bray/ Edlesborough Advent trail



WALLACE NURSERIES

Mr and Mrs W E Wallace came to Eaton Bray in 1886 and started a general nursery with four glazed over duck houses. From 1904 success with the perpetual flowering carnation made W E Wallace a leading name in the trade.

The local Sharrett family building firm constructed a new greenhouse for Wallace roughly every two years, each one 200/250 feet long by 43 feet wide. From the Chiltern Hills, they appeared as an eight and a quarter acre sea of glass. In 2019 one 300 foot greenhouse remains, extremely overgrown

that greenhouse there was a huge water tower (eventually demolished in 1996) whose engines pumped 80,000 gallons of water from three 300 feet artesian

wells to supply 450,000 continuous growing plants, tended by 100 employees. In

a good year, it is reported that 10,000 dozen blooms a day were dispatched all over the UK, making Stanbridgeford station very busy! King George V insisted in wearing a Wallace carnation every day no matter where he was in the world. During the second World War, tomatoes and lettuces were grown as well.

The Wallace 500 acre farm and fruit trees were a separate entity where gifted gardeners grafted thousands of apple stock to produce vast crops. As the significant local employer, Wallace carried a huge influence in the village. Employees were worked hard in the Wallace empire and as you might expect not all were

the greatest friends with their boss, but generally Wallace is perceived to have been a great benefactor behind many generous acts to support the village, including the church with the alter cloths and stained glass cast windows being donated by the family. They also took keen interest in village life with Mrs Wallace forming the 1st Eaton Bray Boy Scouts troop. After closing in 1974, the nursery land was given over to housing development and street names reflect the industry that preceded them.

Requirements of the job were to be "sober, and impartial, no borrowing money, no bribes, only two children. Any breach of these rules could result in transport to the Colonies" His first job was issuing tobacco licences, (including snuff) at a cost of 5s 3d

The practice of levying customs duties in England can be traced back to the reign of Edward I who imposed duties on wool and leather. By the time of Edward II the system of tonnage and poundage was established which allowed for the taxation of goods entering and leaving the country. The first excise duties were introduced in 1643 during the English Civil War, primarily as a tax on alcoholic beverages to finance parliamentary armies.

IN 1909 HM Customs and Excise was formed and in 2009 merged with the Inland Revenue to form HMRC

Geoff worked in various places around the UK and while he was in Hull part of his job was to inspect the little boats coming in from Rotterdam bringing eels in cases. One day he happened to discover a case containing watches amongst the eels!!!

A new social group for those affected by dementia and age-related memory loss has opened at Edlesborough Pavilion.

Their first meeting was held the afternoon of July 9 and was very well attended by a mixture of family carers and those living with the condition. Edlesborough Memory Café is a social space for people to chat and play some fun games together. It has been started with the help of Tibbs Dementia Foundation, who are a specialist Bedfordshire dementia charity with over 12 years of experience in delivering social activities to those affected by dementia and memory loss.

The group is very inclusive and all are welcome, those with a formal diagnosis as

well as those without. Family members are also encouraged to come along, either on their own or with their relative who is living with dementia/memory loss.

Tibbs pride themselves on offering a relaxed and stress-free environment, where clients can come and enjoy a cuppa, along with good company and some stimulating games and activities. It is a space where people can just be themselves without having to worry about stigma or judgement from others.

The charity understands that some may feel anxious about their diagnosis and being in the company of other people, and for those with a cognitive impairment this can be a very normal reaction to the thought of socialising in a group. This is why they offer social activities just for those living with memory loss and dementia; an opportunity to be with others in a similar situation who understand the challenges people with this condition face. New people are encouraged to come along for a taster session to try it. No booking is necessary.
