NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICING

Whilst Bedfordshire Police are working to tackle issues, we also need your help. Detailed below is some information which may be of help to you to protect your property. Whilst some of the advice may sound obvious, it could make all the difference in you follow it:

	CAR CRIME
1	Don't leave items on display – Never leave anything on display when you leave your vehicle. Even an old coat or a plastic bag can tempt a thief. It is also advisable to remove Sat Nav brackets along with any suction marks left on the window.
2	Use immobilisers – Electronic engine immobilisers prevent your vehicle from starting and are the best way to stop thieves.
3	Park safely – When parking at home, always use your garage if you have one, and lock both your vehicle and your garage. It you don't have a garage, try to park in a well-lit, open place.
4	Buy a steering wheel lock – use a steering wheel lock every time you leave your vehicle.

Doors and Locks	 Use a solid core or metal door for all entrance points 		
	Buy a door bar or chain and door viewer and use them every time someone		
	calls		
	 Use a five-level mortise deadlock 		
	 Never keep your keys in your locks 		
	 Make sure your doors and frames are strong and in good condition 		
UPVC doors are becoming extremely popular, however simply lifting the handle does not securely lock the door – always use a key.			
Sliding-Glass Patio Doors	Install an anti-lift device to prevent them from being removed outside		
	 Install locks to the top and bottom of the door 		
	 Keep the latch mechanism in good condition and properly adjusted 		
	 Use high visible alarm decals, beware of dog decals or block watch decal 		
Windows	 Secure all accessible windows with secondary blocking devices 		
	 Block accessible windows, open no more than 6 inches for ventilation 		
	Make sure someone cannot reach through an open window and unlock the		
	door		
	Make sure someone cannot reach inside the window and remove the		
	blocking device		
	 Use anti-lift devices to prevent a window from being lifted out 		
	 Use crime prevention or alarm decals on ground accessible windows 		
	 Plant shrubs underneath your front windows/gravel your driveway 		
Lighting	 Use interior light timers to establish a pattern of occupancy 		
	 Exterior lighting should allow 100 foot visibility 		
	 Use good lighting along the pathway and at your door 		
	 Use light timers or photo-cells to turn on/off lights automatically 		
	 Use infra-red motion sensor lights on the rear of single family homes 		
Good Neighbours	Get to know all of your adjacent neighbours		
	Invite them into your home and establish trust		
	Agree to watch out for each other's home		
	Do small tasks for each other to improve trust		
	Offer to park your car in their driveway when they go away		
	Return the favour and communicate often
